About NDCs Working Group



NDCs WG is one of the active working groups of YOUNGO that functions to:

- 1. Support young people to understand, monitor, and follow NDC and its related topic.
- 2. Build youth momentum for NDCs by strengthening the capacity of young people
- 3. Improve youth engagement in NDCs revision and implementation process and
- 4. Represent youth voices for NDCs and related topics in the UNFCCC processes.

Why should YOUths engage in NDCs?

Young people stand to bear the brunt of future impacts from climate crises. Youths have the passion, knowledge, energy and creativity to translate the climate action plans such as NDCs to action by mobilizing the community in the ground and holding leaders accountable at all levels.

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Nationally Determined Contributions

- Climate Actions that Parties to the Paris Agreement plan to undertake to address climate change.
- A Party's 'contribution' to address climate change is "nationally determined" according to its national circumstances and priorities.
- NDC is the heart of the Paris Agreement, the first binding agreement for climate action.
- Each Party to the <u>Paris Agreement</u> is required to establish an NDC and update it in every 5 years.

Nationally Determined Contributions

- NDCs are where countries set targets for mitigating the greenhouse gas emissions that cause climate change and for adapting to climate impacts.
- The plans define how to reach the targets, and elaborate systems to monitor and verify progress so it stays on track.
- Since climate finance is key to implementing the plans, NDCs ideally also details a financing strategy.

How is an NDC prepared?

• Since an NDC is a government obligation under the Paris Agreement one or more national ministries will generally lead its development.

 But for NDCs to work, they need to be widely understood and used by businesses, civil society, academia and ordinary citizens.

• Each has roles to play, which is why many governments invite different constituencies to take part in defining NDC priorities

Why are NDCs so important?

The actions contained in all NDCs represent the collective global effort, which will determine whether the world will achieve the long-term temperature goal of the Paris Agreement. More <u>here</u>.

How do we track the progress?

With the Paris Agreement, countries established an enhanced transparency framework (ETF). The information gathered through the ETF will feed into the Global stocktake which will assess the collective progress towards the long-term climate goals. This will lead to recommendations for countries to set more ambitious plans in the next round.

Good practices of youth engagement in NDCs

- Empowering young people to learn about NDCs, their country's NDCs and the way they can engage in its formulation and implementation. (infographics and webinars)
- 1. Young people from over 70 plus countries sharing about the good practices and challenges of implementing NDCs in their country
- 1. Recently worked with the UNDP and other youth partners to prepare the youth inclusive NDC checklist which will provide guidance for parties to meaningfully engage young people in the 2025 round of NDCs
- Exploring joint collaboration opportunities to connect young people with local UNDP country offices to carry the work in the ground in NDCs and youth engagement



What is Global Stocktake?

- The global stocktake of the Paris Agreement (GST) is a process for taking stock of the implementation of the Paris Agreement with the aim to assess the world's collective progress towards achieving the purpose of the agreement and its long-term goals (Article 14).
- The first GST will run from 2021 to 2023 and will be repeated every five years thereafter.



Thematic Areas of GST

The GST assesses global collective progress on three main thematic areas:

- 1. Mitigation
- 2. Adaptation, and

3. Means of implementation and support. The collective assessment takes inputs on equity into consideration and makes use of the best available science in a cross-cutting manner.



Components of GST

- 1. Information Collection and Preparation, CMA3 (November 2021) – SB 58 (June 2023)
- 2. Technical Assessment, SB56 (June 2022) – SB58 (June 2023)
- 3. Consideration of outputs CMA6 (November 2023)



Importance of GST

- The outcomes of the GST will inform countries on updating and enhancing their climate action plans as well as on enhancing international cooperation for climate action.
- GST outputs will consist of key political messages and recommendations, best practices, new opportunities and lessons learned for all thematic areas.

Good practices of youth engagement in GST

- 1. Understanding the importance of GST and its interlinkage with NDCs and building on this message. Supporting this with series of capacity building session throughout the year.
- 1. Thoroughly following all GST processes and discussions in SBs, COP, and in between.
- Submitted 3 submissions on GST worked together with different WG of YOUNGO and broader relevant youth groups
- 1. Cross constituency taskforce to coordinate and align with each other's demand

ETF and good practices of youth engagement

Effective Transparency: What does it mean to a youth?

Effective Transparency is the bridge that connects the aspirations of youth to the climate reality we face. By opening the doors to right information, young and CSO voices can act as watchdog and hold our government accountable. With this, we inspire hope and hope inspires action.

Importance of Effective Transparency in NDCs and GST process

- 1. Enhancing trust and accountability among parties and non-party stakeholders
- 2. Facilitating learning and improvement
- 3. Mobilizing support and resources through a clearer and easier channel
- 4. Informing the global stocktake for assess the actual progress
- 5. Strengthening participation and engagement. (Specially of YOUTH)

Conservation of forest carbon stocks

Sustainable management of forests

Enhancement of forest carbon stocks

Linking the ETF, NDCs and GST





Mechanism to facilitate implementation and promote compliance



- Dialogue with Party
- Assist the Party to engage with FTC bodies or arrangements
- Make recommendations to address challenges and solutions with FTC bodies or arrangements (with consent of Party)
- Recommend/ assist Party in developing, an action plan
- Issue "findings of fact" regarding timeliness of communications, submissions, participation in FMCP
