CGE Training Materials on Mitigation Assessment



CGE Training Material on Reporting Information Related to Climate Change Impacts and Adaptation (2023)

This training material developed by the CGE, with the support of the secretariat, aims to equip developing country Parties with the latest knowledge on methodological tools and models, which will facilitate the preparation of relevant inputs for reporting information on vulnerability and adaptation in the national communications and biennial transparency reports required by the Enhanced Transparency Framework (ETF) under the Paris Agreement.

<u>Supplementary Guidance on Adaptation Communications for Voluntary Use by Parties</u>

The Adaptation Committee developed this supplementary guidance for voluntary use by Parties in communicating adaptation information in accordance with the list of possible elements of an adaptation communication. It aims to help Parties to enhance the quality and reduce duplication of adaptation information while benefitting from synergies with other planning, implementing and reporting arrangements for adaptation.

<u>Enhanced Transparency Framework - Technical Materials</u>

National Adaptation Plans progress report (2022)

The report provides information on the progress of Parties in the process to formulate and implement national adaptation plans (NAPs), including on support provided and received, as compiled by the Least Developed Countries Expert Group.

<u>Target audience:</u> UNFCCC national focal points; Regional and international organizations supporting least developed countries; active players at national levels in developing and implementing climate change policies and plans (including local communities, civil society, private sector and academia).



Technical support

CGE Hands-on Training Workshops

The CGE, with the assistance of the UNFCCC secretariat, organizes regional hands-on training workshops each year to build the capacity of experts from developing countries who are actively involved in transparency-related processes.

<u>Target audience:</u> Experts nominated by national focal points who are actively involved in the transparency-related processes. Most of the participants are funded by the CGE.

<u>Duration:</u> 3-4 days. <u>Available in:</u> English

Type of training: in person



CGE Informal Forums



The CGE, with the assistance of the UNFCCC secretariat, organizes an informal forum each year to bring together key stakeholders to seek feedback on CGE's work and brainstorm key factors to enable the successful implementation of MRV and the ETF.

Technical support

The Capacity-Building Initiative for Transparency

The Capacity-building Initiative for Transparency (CBIT) supports developing countries to build institutional and technical capacity to meet enhanced transparency requirements as defined in Article 13 of the Paris Agreement. The CBIT plays a key role to assist countries with tools and training as they prepare their Biennial Transparency Reports (BTRs), due by December 2024.

The CBIT aims at:

- 1. Strengthening national institutions for transparency-related activities in line with national priorities;
- 2. Providing relevant tools, training and assistance for meeting the provisions stipulated in Article 13 of the Paris Agreement;
- 3. Assisting in the improvement of transparency over time.

<u>Target audience:</u> Developing country parties with support from GEF Implementing Agencies



<u>Capacity-building Initiative for Transparency – Global Support Programme (CBIT-GSP)</u>



Technical assistance and support to developing countries on the Enhanced Transparency Framework. Support is provided via 10 transparency networks and includes direct support to countries, trainings, regional workshops, peer reviews of transparency reports to enhance the quality of submissions (national communications, biennial update reports, biennial transparency reports, inventories) to UNFCCC etc.

The project is funded by GEF, implemented by UNEP and executed by the UNEP Copenhagen Climate Centre.



E-courses and trainings

E-learning course on the ETF

The E-learning course on the Enhanced Transparency Framework (ETF) is a hybrid course with 9 modules dispensed online over 9 weeks. Each week has a virtual classroom. Participants undergo exams after each of the modules and those who pass participate in an in-person workshop. This e-learning course has been conducted for participants from Asia-Pacific, Anglophone Africa and the Francophone Network. The course will be offered in Spanish next this year. This e-learning course is jointly developed by ICAT, CBIT-GSP, UNSSC and UNFCCC.

<u>Target audience:</u> Applications are opened to all and a selection process is conducted.

<u>Type of learning:</u> Free, hybrid <u>Duration:</u> 9 weeks

CGE E-Learning Courses on the Preparation of National Communication

These free courses will provide participants with the necessary tools to conduct and prepare a national greenhouse gases (GHG) inventory, vulnerability and adaptation assessment, and mitigation assessment. Participants will receive a certificate of upon completion of the course.



<u>Target audience:</u> Open to all. Target groups are national experts and practitioners from developing country Parties who are involved in the transparency-related processes.

Type of learning: Free online, self-paced

<u>Duration</u>: Five courses <u>Available in:</u> English

CGE Transparency Needs Assessment

CGE assesses the existing and emerging needs and gaps of developing countries in implementing the existing Measurement, Reporting, and Verification (MRV) arrangements and preparing for the ETF, and prepares, annually, a technical paper containing the results.

<u>Target audience:</u> Transparency support providers, national experts and practitioners from developing country Parties who are involved in the transparency-related processes

Climate Transparency Platform



The Climate Transparency Platform covers everything related to the Enhanced Transparency Framework (ETF) of the Paris Agreement and the continued reporting under the UNFCCC. It provides a global overview of transparency initiatives and developing countries' transparency efforts. This allows users to stay up-to-date on the latest developments, events and knowledge products, and to get detailed information on developing countries, support providers and transparency projects.

The Platform also aims to create a climate transparency community through a Global Forum and ten Communities of Practice for peer-to-peer exchange and learning among countries. The Platform also serves as space for coordination among transparency support providers and for countries to directly request support for specific needs in all areas of the ETF.

<u>Target audience</u>: All transparency practitioners including countries, international organizations, support providers, CBIT projects, enabling activities projects, academia, researchers etc.
