Paris Committee on Capacity-building (PCCB) Call for submissions from Parties and non-Party stakeholders:

'Tools and methodologies for assessing and addressing capacity gaps and needs related to accessing climate finance'

Background

Identifying capacity gaps and needs, both current and emerging, and recommending ways to address them has been a core part of the mandate of the PCCB, since its establishment, and was made one of three priority areas of the PCCB under its 2021–2024 workplan by the COP.

Under this priority area, COP 25 mandated the PCCB, inter alia, to continue efforts to gather and promote the development and dissemination of tools and methodologies for implementing capacity-building activities.

Topics for submissions

As part of addressing the above-mentioned mandate, the PCCB agreed to issue in 2023 a call for submissions on tools and methodologies for assessing and addressing capacity gaps and needs related to accessing climate finance. Capacity gaps and needs can be at the individual, institutional or systemic level.

Who can submit?

The call is open to all Parties, bodies, entities and processes under the Convention and the Paris Agreement, as well as to all UNFCCC non-Party stakeholders, including public and private sector entities, government and non-government organizations, philanthropic organizations, academic and research organizations and regional and international organizations and initiatives.

How will the inputs be used?

The inputs will feed into the <u>2021–2024 workplan</u> activities of the PCCB for 2024, including an analysis and synthesis of the submissions and a technical session at the 6th Capacity-building Hub at COP 29. Relevant tools, methodologies and other resources submitted will be widely disseminated by the PCCB and will be integrated into the list of resources accompanying <u>the PCCB toolkit to assess capacity gaps and needs to implement the Paris Agreement</u>.

The Knowledge Nook (kNook) is the Partnership's knowledge management system, and sits at the core of the Partnership's trend analyses and learning processes. The kNook catalogues a unique dataset of country requests to the Partnership and the support being delivered against them. Data inform knowledge products (e.g., Insight Briefs, Guidance Documents, and Best Practice Briefs) for the purposes of analyzing trends and helping fill gaps in support. Particular focus is given to sharing insights and promoting engagement around Finance, NDC Enhancement, Gender, and Youth, building on the Partnership's strategies in these areas. In particular, finance is the most frequently requested topic for support through the Partnership with 85% of developing country members requesting some type of finance-related support. Requests range from support for creating enabling environments to developing and financing projects.
