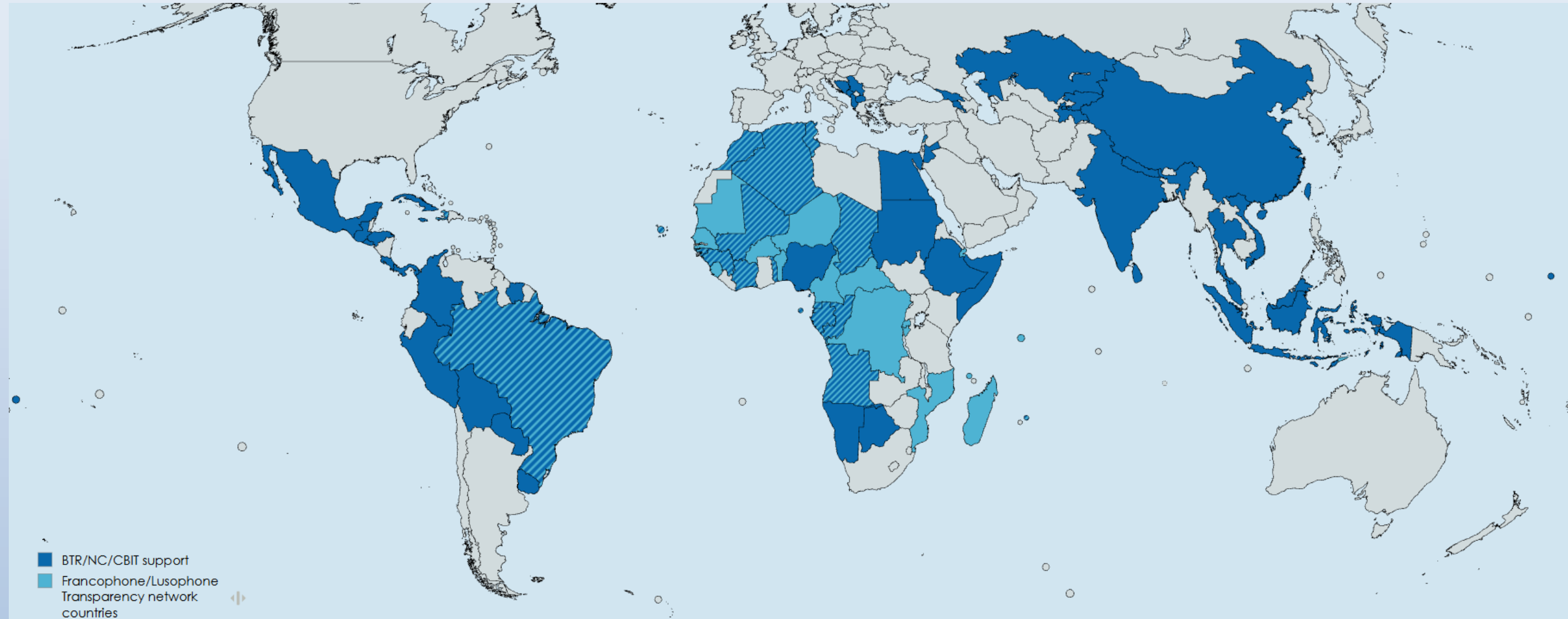

	Institutional arrangements and coordination	Institutional arrangement and coordination across ministries are essential.	Institutionalize transparency and integrate it into climate and development planning.
	Timing mismatches with reporting schedules	Countries need support throughout the transparency cycle, including early guidance on funding modalities, approval timelines and programming requirements and eligibility.	Earlier, more predictable and sustained access to financial and technical support across the entire cycle.
	Complexity of ETF reporting requirements	Peer learning, practical tools and targeted technical support build confidence and capacity.	Peer learning, South-South exchange and tailored technical support.
	Competing national priorities	High-level political leadership and national ownership drive sustained progress.	Sustain political commitment, clear mandates and dedicated resources for transparency.
