

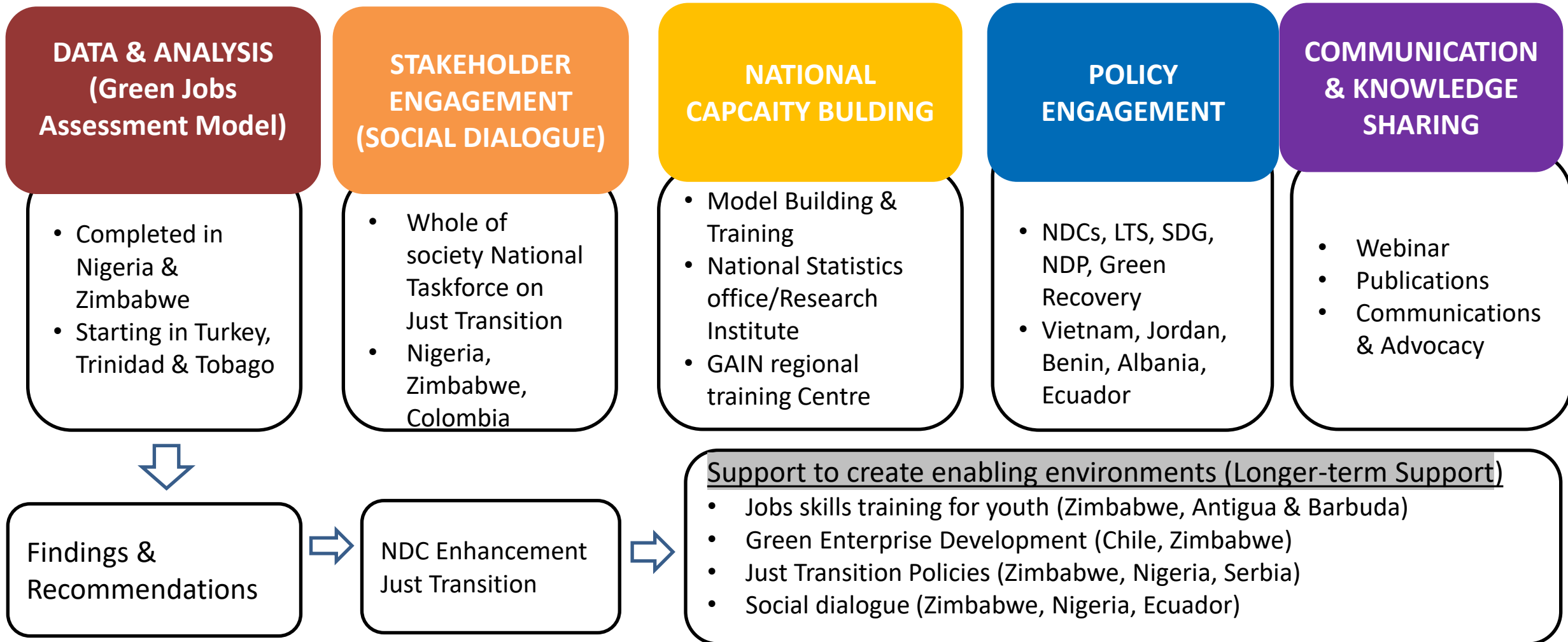

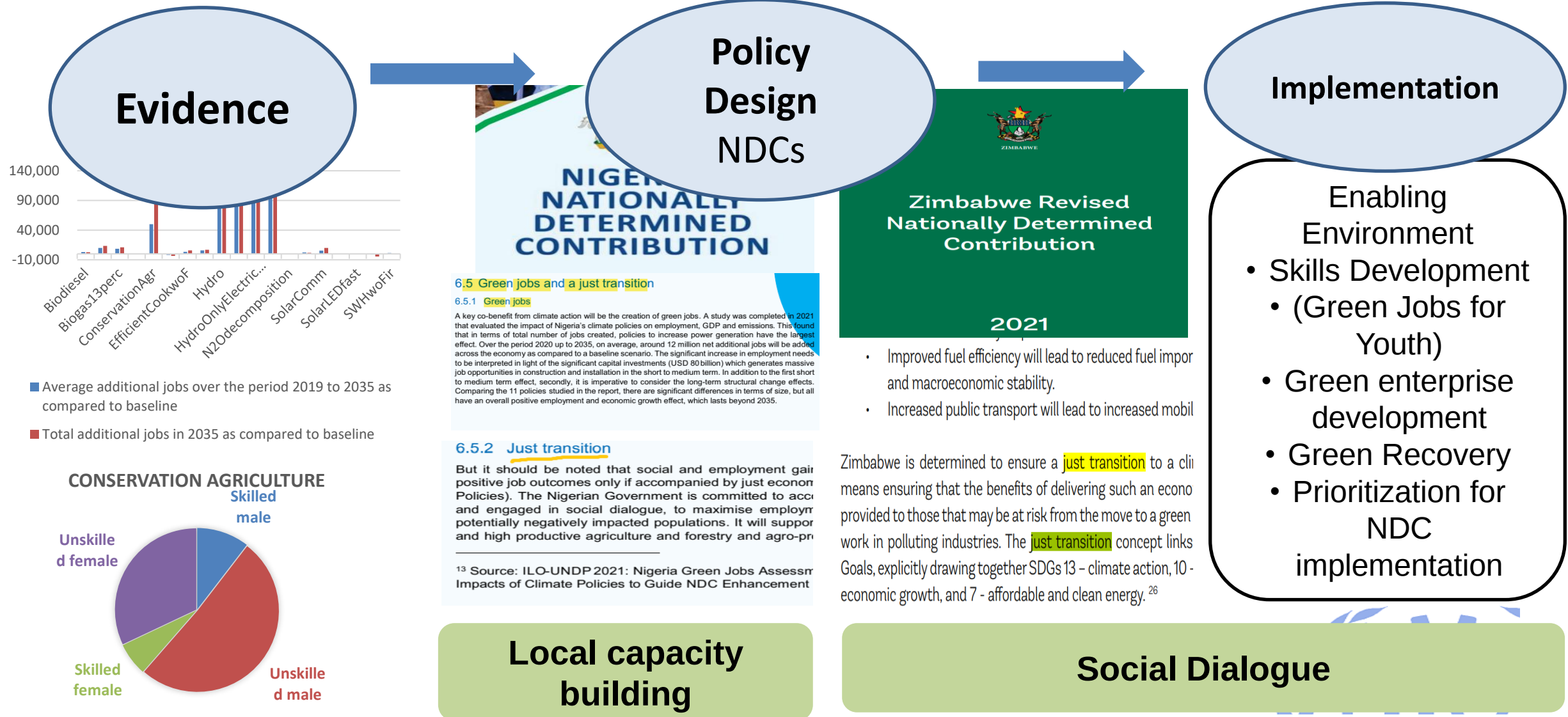

WHAT

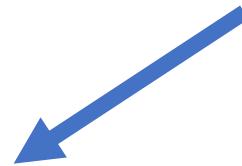
A joint initiative of UNDP & ILO, supporting countries to receive technical and capacity building support to build a nationally owned model to inform climate policy planning and **NDC revision**.

WHY?

- Support Just Transition (social policy)

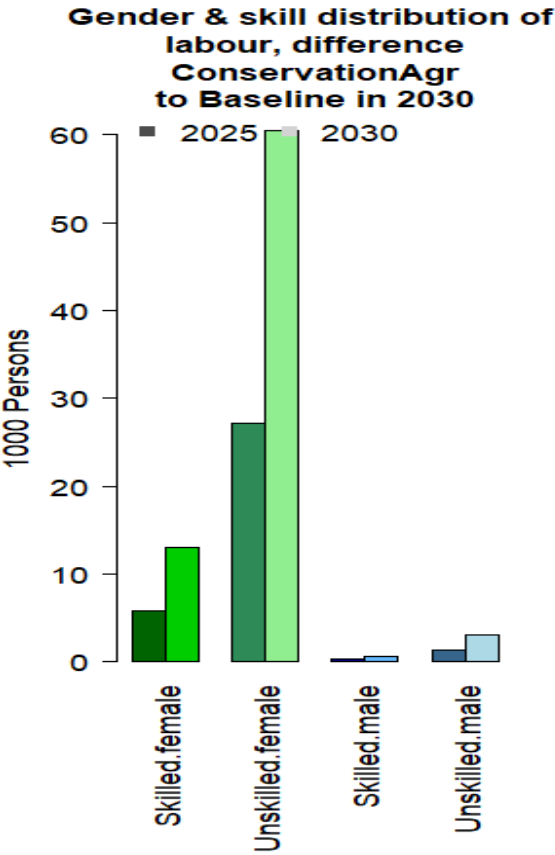
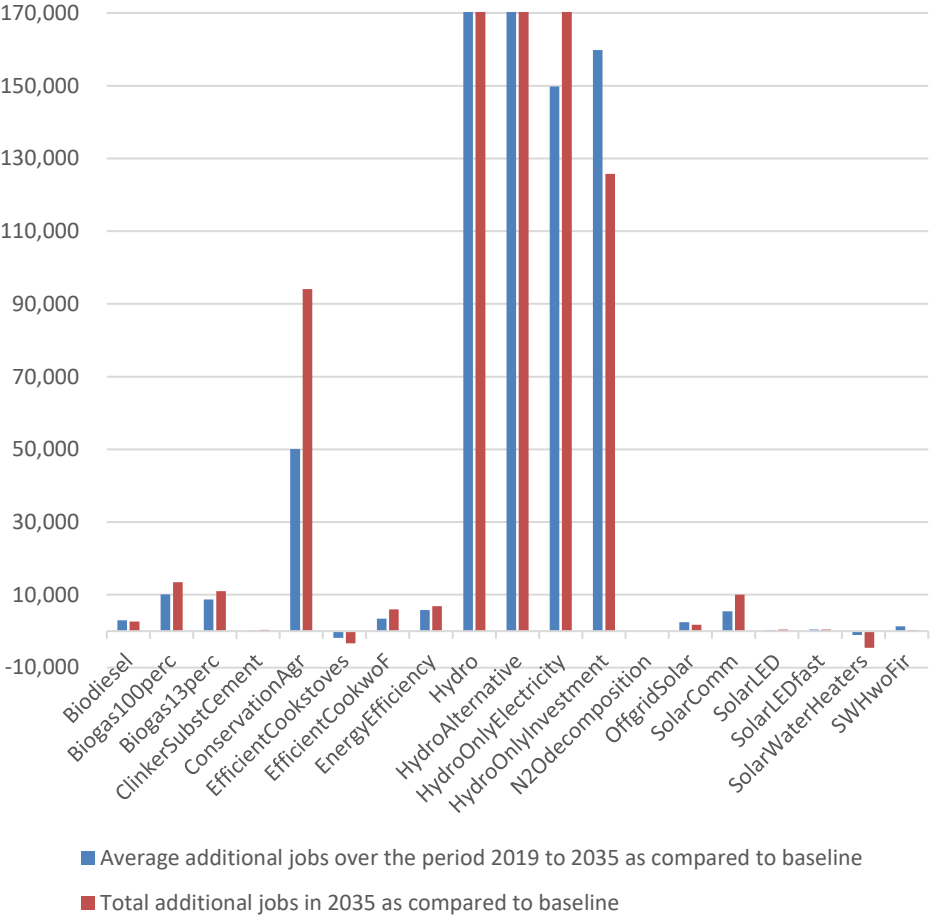

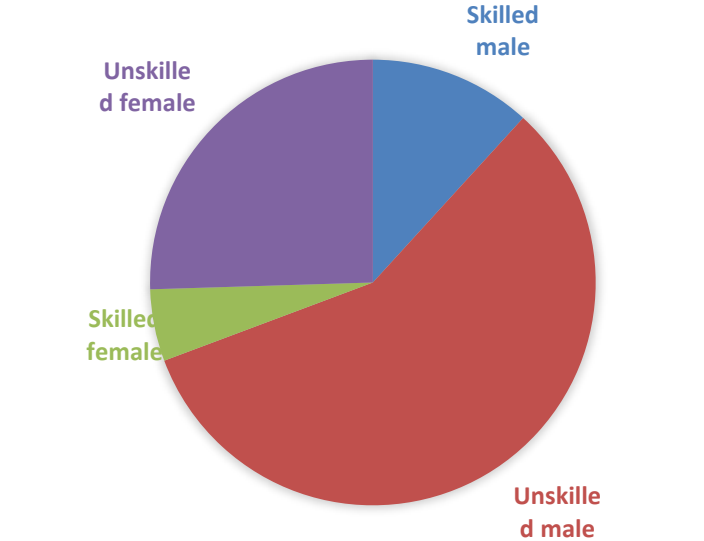
Distributional

- **WHO** will be affected, (men/women, skills/unskilled labor, rural/urban?)

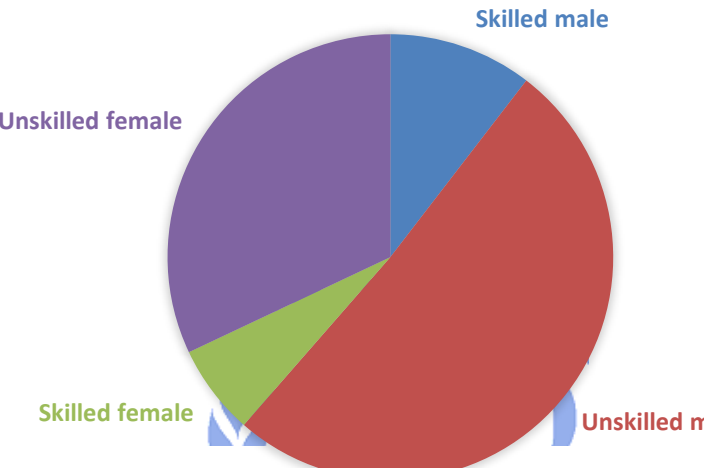

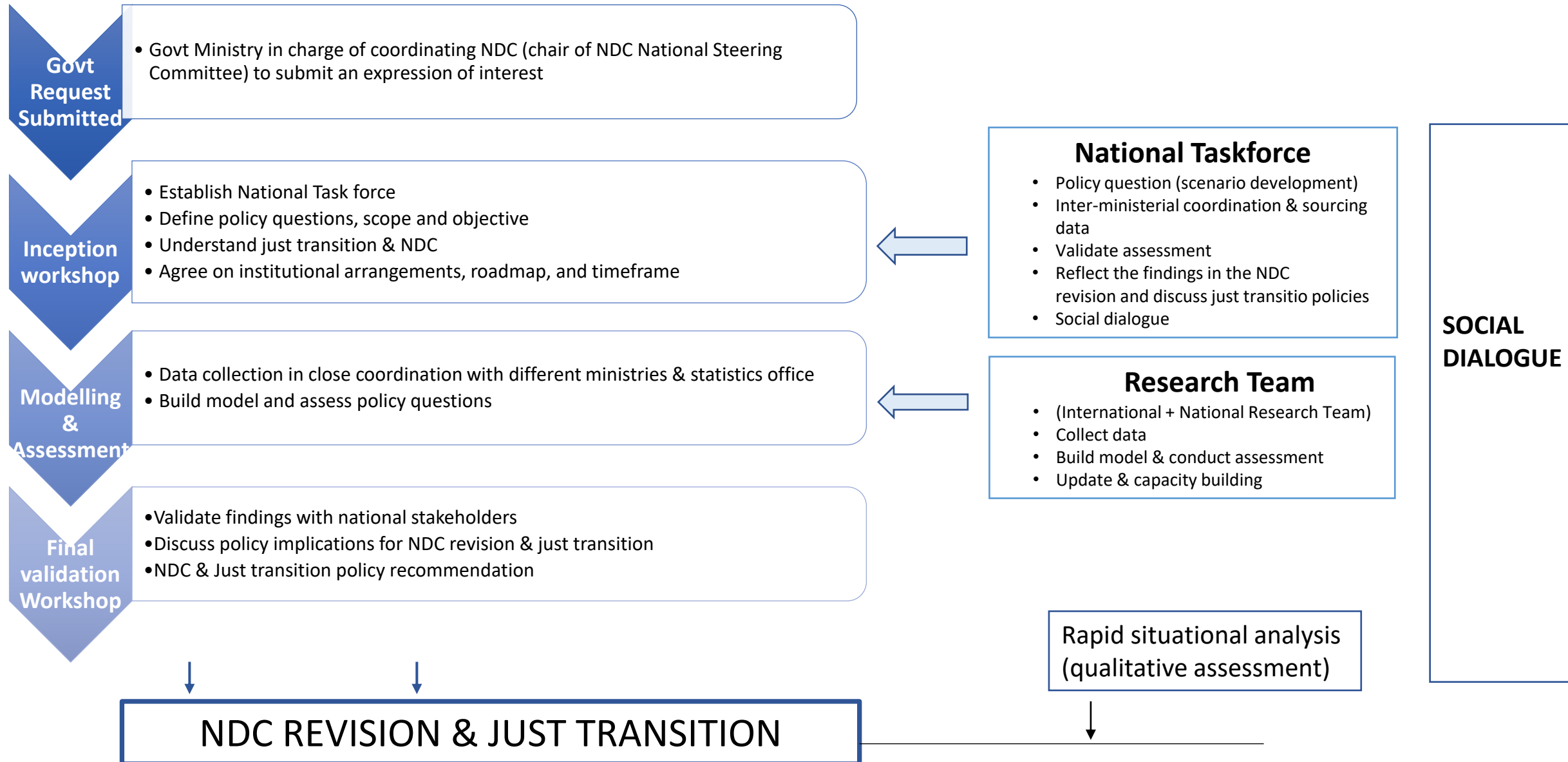
CONVENTIONAL AGRICULTURE



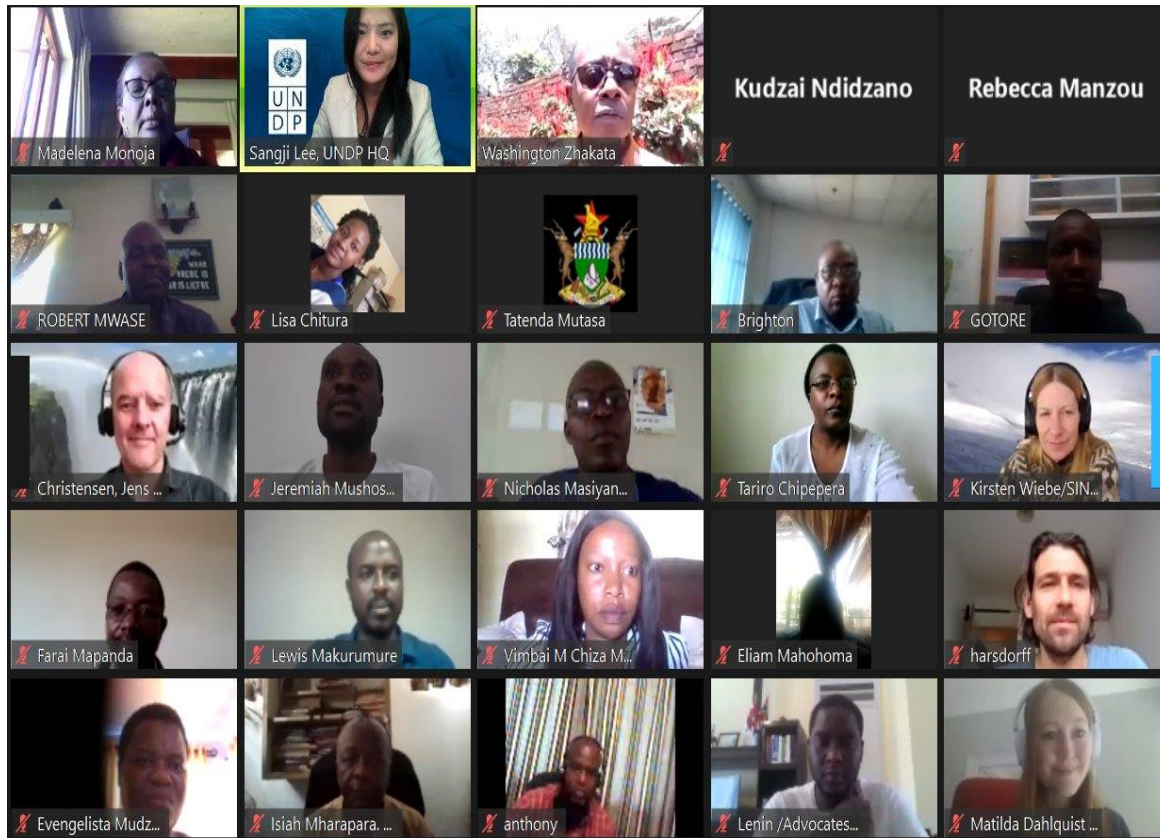
CONSERVATION AGRICULTURE
