## THE ROLE OF THE TECHNICAL EXPERT IS TO:

1

Review and analyse climate data and information submitted by a Party

2

Determine whether reporting meets the requirements

3

Provide advice to the Party to improve their reporting

4

Draft a report based on the findings



## HOW TO BECOME A TECHNICAL EXPERT ?

1

Have experience in one or more of the following areas:

- GHG inventories;
- Climate policies and measures;
- Climate finance, technology transfer and/or capacity building;
- Land use, land use change and forestry/ REDD+; and/or
- Other related climate information reported by Parties to the UNFCCC

2

Register as an expert in the **Roster of Experts** and complete the self-nomination form. This will alert your National Focal Point or relevant intergovernmental organisation to approve your self-nomination.



3

Complete the relevant training programme(s), including passing any necessary exam(s)

4

Actively participate in the review process and be a part of the climate change solution
