

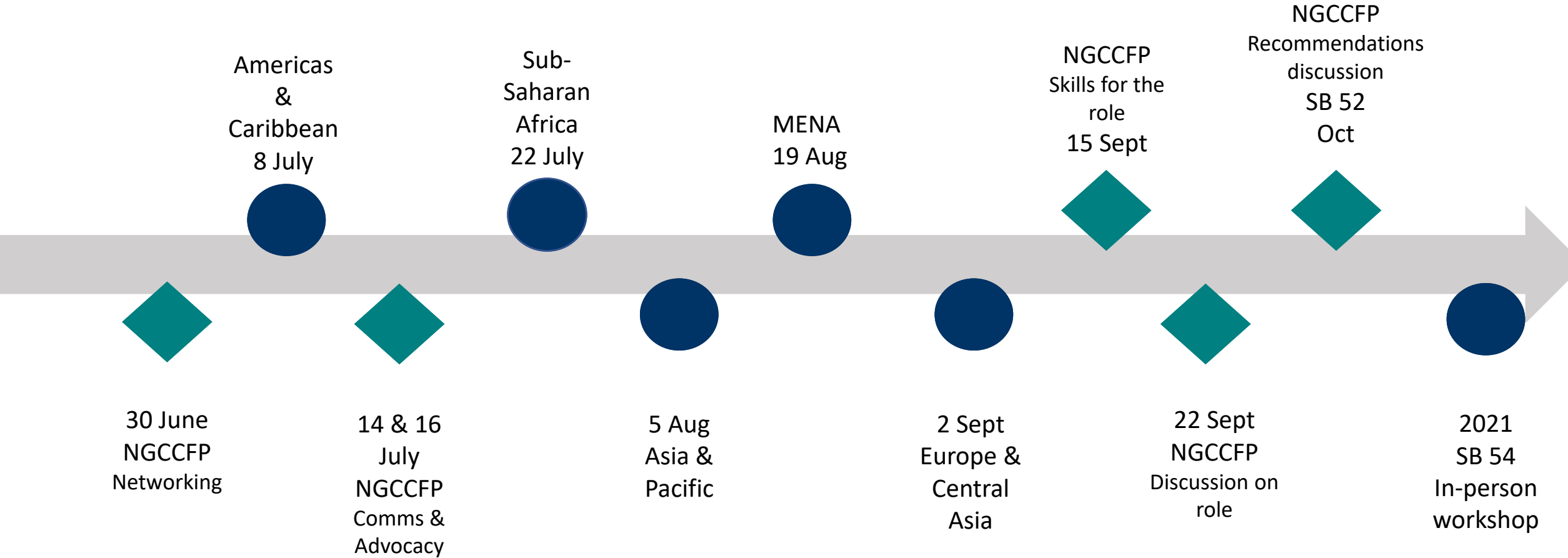
Outcome: Recommendations on the role of NGCCFPs

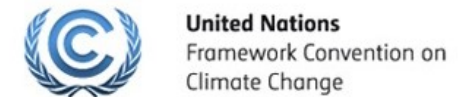
