
Financing mechanisms to support climate adaptation



- Global climate finance flows increased by 12% in 2019–2020 compared to 2017–2018, reaching an annual average of USD 803 billion
- Adaptation finance increased by 65% to USD 49 billion in 2019–2020, ... however, the gap between financial support needed and provided is increasing disproportionately


Public climate finance flows from developed to developing countries in 2019–2020, by theme, source and financial instrument

Share of financial instruments in aggregate adaptation finance flows, 2019–2020



- ✓ High share of loans in some estimates due to high share of MDBs
- ✓ Grants are significant share of bilateral finance and multilateral climate funds (GCF, GEF, other)
- Asia and Africa regions receive largest shares of adaptation finance; Africa, LDCs and SIDS receive larger share of adaptation finance than of climate finance
- ✓ 24-30% adaptation finance share in 2019-2020 data vs 52-61% mitigation



- Sector orientation of needs;
- Sector and status consistent entry options (standardized options)




