UN Climate Change (UNFCCC secretariat) is the United Nations entity tasked with supporting the global response to the threat of climate change. UNFCCC stands for United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.

The Convention has near universal membership (197 Parties) and is the parent treaty of the 2015 Paris Agreement and 1997 Kyoto Protocol.



Communication and Engagement

Communicating relevant and timely information to Party and non-Party stakeholders.
Raising awareness with the public regarding the secretariat's process and action on climate change.

Intergovernmental Support and Collective Progress

Supporting the work of the governing and subsidiary bodies of the secretariat. Also, enabling and facilitating cross-cutting processes to further advance climate action.

Regional Collaboration Centres

RCCs are collaboration centres between UN Climate
Change and regional host partners, local and regional agencies and multilateral development banks, focused on supporting national climate action on the ground.

Adaptation

Assisting Parties in their efforts to adapt to climate change, including national adaptation plans and addressing vulnerability.

Means of Implementation

Assisting Parties with enhanced access, mobilization and scaling up support for climate finance architecture, technology development, transfer and capacitybuilding.

Mitigation

Assisting Parties in developing, communicating and effectively implementing NDCs using mechanisms, framewok engagements and economic instruments.

Transparency

Assisting Parties in monitoring and tracking progress, including the implementation of nationally determined contributions (NDCs).

Intergovernmental Process

Negotiations

Facilitating the intergovernmental climate change negotiations by organizing multiple negotiating sessions each year, the largest and most significant being the Conference of the Parties (COP).

Capacity-building and Reporting

Assisting Parties on building technical expertise and capacity. Supporting Parties in developing NDCs, designing strategies and improving climate change reporting.

Mobilization

Convening and mobilizing thousands of stakeholders and coalitions. Providing a forum for Party and non-Party stakeholders to develop policies and programmes to implement the Paris Agreement.

Race To Zero is a global campaign to rally leadership and support from businesses, cities, regions, investors for a healthy, resilient, zero carbon recovery.

Resilience Frontiers incorporates strong interdisciplinary and multistakeholder partnerships utilizing emerging technologies and innovation to address long-term global resilience beyond 2030.

The **Enhanced Transparency Framework (ETF)** strengthens the progress of current measurement, reporting and verification (MRV) in reducing emissions under the Paris Agreement.

Needs-based Finance (NBF) Project facilitates access and mobilization of climate finance for the implementation of priority mitigation and adaptation projects to address the needs identified by developing countries.






