Global Stocktake technical dialogue

- Submissions to the first GST should consider the mandate and themes as included in Article 14 of the Paris Agreement and <u>Decision 19/CMA.1</u>, in particular the topics under paragraph 36 of this decision.
- Submissions should also aim to respond to the guiding questions by the Subsidiary Body Chairs, which can be found here:
 - a) Guiding questions for the information collection and preparation component
 - b) Guiding questions for the technical assessment component.
- As a suggested outline, submissions could include an **executive summary** and **key messages**, in order to facilitate their consideration in the technical assessment component.
- Observer organizations and other non-Party stakeholders, are also encouraged to make collective submissions when possible, so that they can serve as effective conversation vehicles for the dialogues.




Deadlines for global stocktake technical dialogue submissions

- Written inputs should be submitted <u>at least three months</u> <u>before</u> their consideration in the technical assessment.
- TD1 (SB56): end of February 2022
- TD2 (CMA4): early August 2022
- TD3 (SB58) 6 March 2023



How to submit an input

• For Parties, organizations with observer status and non-Party stakeholders without observer status, submissions are made through the UNFCCC submission portal, under a specific GST category:

Guide to submitting

- Once in the new submission site, fill in the required fields:
- a) Add the title of your submission
- b) attach the document(s) (preferably in text-searchable PDF format) and the language of the document
- c) In case you make a submission for a group of organizations (e.g. one of the Constituencies), the group can be specified under "On behalf of"
- d) Select the thematic area(s) relevant to your submission. More than one thematic area can be selected.
- e) Click on "submit".



Guide to submitting

Parties

The enhanced global stocktake submission portal provides a platform for Parties to upload submissions. Before the first upload, an account has to be created by the respective National Focal Point, who can submit a <u>request here</u>.

For any issues related to the submission portal, the secretariat can be contacted at <u>submission-info@unfccc.int</u>.

Organizations with observer status

• The portal provides a platform for observer organizations to upload submissions. Before the first upload, an account has to be created by the respective Designated Contact Point, who can submit a request here.

Non-Party stakeholders without observer status

- Non-Party stakeholders without observer status are welcome to make submissions, and are invited to send their submissions to the UNFCCC secretariat by email to submission-info@unfccc.int.

Setting up accounts on the enhanced submission and information portal

- Users that have already submitted to the global stocktake on the current submission portal will be granted access in the new portal using the same email address, which will grant them access to the entity they have access now (Party or admitted non-party organizations). - Users who do not already have access, will need to submit a request using the current procedure to have access to the current submission portal (Parties, observer organizations and other non-Party stakeholders). For further details, please refer to this link.



The global stocktake information portal

- GST submissions will be displayed in the submission portal, as well as the information portal, so everyone can have access to all submissions, ensuring a transparent process.
- The information portal, will display all relevant information for the GST, as identified in decision 19/CMA.1 paras 36-37.
- This includes all the submissions received as well as Party reports, synthesis documents by the secretariat and so on.
