



More NDCs address gender equality







International commitments and decisions under the UNFCCC are being translated into more NDCs addressing gender equality

- 89 revised/updated NDCs in this report
- NDCs addressing gender equality have increased numerical and percentage wise

PROGRESS IN THE INCLUSION OF GENDER AND/OR WOMEN MENTIONS







Progress

Zooming in per region: interesting shifts

NDCs from all regions are now including gender equality

- LAC and SSA are the regions with the highest inclusion of gender considerations in their revised NDCs
- The regions with the highest increase compared with 2015/2016 NDCs are:
 - LAC moving from 40% to 100%
 - INDTR moving from 0 to 50%


Ensuring gender responsiveness in NDCs

Moving towards implementation: key elements for responsiveness


The quality of mentions to gender equality has increased

NDCs MEETING GENDER-RESPONSIVE CRITERIA









What we did

- Evidence gathered from NDCs, NC, NAPs, national climate laws, policies, strategies and plans <u>AND</u> CEDAW Periodic reports, Beijing National Reviews, national gender equality laws, policies strategies and plans...
- 2. Data was analyzed, coded and scored, resulting in a 5-point scale for each enabling factor.

The four enabling factors we examined were:

- Gender in climate change mainstreaming
- 2. Gender in climate change coordination processes
- 3. Gender in climate finance
- 4. Gender in reporting (MRV)



What we found



Over 60% of global GHG emissions in 2019 were from Asia and the Pacific


