### **Draft conclusions proposed by the Chairs**

#### **Recommendation of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice and the Subsidiary Body for Implementation**

The SBSTA and the SBI, at their sixty-third sessions, recommended the following draft decision for consideration and adoption by the [Conference of the Parties at its thirtieth session][Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement at its seventh session]:<sup>1</sup>

#### **Joint annual report of the Executive Committee of the Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage associated with Climate Change Impacts and the Santiago network for averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change for 2025**

*The [Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement][Conference of the Parties],<sup>2</sup>*

*Recalling the Paris Agreement and relevant decisions of the Conference of the Parties and the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement,*

1. *Welcomes* the progress of the Executive Committee of the Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage associated with Climate Change Impacts in implementing its rolling workplan for 2023–2027;<sup>3</sup>
2. *Also welcomes* the progress of the Advisory Board and the secretariat of the Santiago network for averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change in operationalizing the Santiago network;
3. *Expresses appreciation* to the organizations, constituted bodies under the Convention and the Paris Agreement and other stakeholders that have contributed to the implementation of the rolling workplan of the Executive Committee for 2023–2027, including through its thematic expert groups, and to the organizations, bodies, networks and experts that have become or expressed an interest in becoming members of the Santiago network;
4. *Takes note of* the joint annual report of the Executive Committee of the Warsaw International Mechanism and the Santiago network for 2025,<sup>4</sup> which contains:
  - (a) The report of the Executive Committee of the Warsaw International Mechanism,<sup>5</sup> which includes recommendations from the Executive Committee;
  - (b) The report of the Santiago network,<sup>6</sup> which includes recommendations from the Advisory Board of the Santiago network;
