# Section I – Relationship between Article 6.4 and CDM



## **Understanding Article 6**

A framework for the voluntary participation by Parties and other stakeholders in market and NMAs that support implementation of NDCs while promoting SD.

Art 6.2

- International cooperation that involves transfers of mitigation outcomes (ITMOs) from one country to another towards achieving NDC Targets.
- Designed up to the participating Parties but requires that ITMOs are not counted twice (double counting), to ensure environmental integrity.
- Decision 2/CMA.3 provides guidance for countries to cooperate in achieving their NDCs through the transfer of mitigation outcomes.

Art 6.4


- A centralized mechanism under the purview of the UNFCCC
- Has similarities to the CDM in its design, but has new requirements and characteristics compared to the CDM

**Art 6.8** 

 Focuses on other types of cooperation that contribute to reaching mitigation & adaptation goals, but do not involve transfer of MOs among cooperating entities



### Relationship between Article 6.4 & CDM - Commonalities



#### **Common Goal**

Contribute to Climate Change Mitigation and support Sustainable Development Encourage voluntary participation/cooperation of countries.



### Relationship between Article 6.4 & CDM – Key differences

#### **Article 6.4 Mechanism**

Only (some) Annex I Countries have legally binding emission reduction targets

CDM

**All Parties** must have **NDCs** (emission reduction targets)

### Larger role for developing countries

(e.g., approve project CPs, provision of info to SB on how its participation contributes to SD)

All Parties can participate as sellers or buyers of Mitigation Outcomes)

Parties are expected to **report** to the UNFCCC ex-post on how mitigation actions contribute to the NDCs of host and partner countries

### Limited role for developing countries

(i.e. role and commitments of the HC limited to granting of Letters of Approval)

**Developing countries** participated in the international carbon market as **hosts** for CDM projects (no targets).

The approval of CDM activities implied confirming that participation was voluntary and contributed to SD in the country.





### State of play

SB005

- Considered the draft "Standard and procedure for transition of CDM activities to the Art 6.4 mechanism – activity design/attributes & processes to follow respectively
- Agreed to start the process of receiving requests for transition from PPs on 30 June 2023; and requested the secretariat to operationalize the submission interface on the UNFCCC website on that date.

**SB006** 

### Adopted:

- Standard and Procedure for the transition of CDM activities to Art.6 Mechanisms (enters into force on 1 Jan 2024)
- Procedure for Development, revision and clarification of methodologies and methodological tools
- Procedure for Development, revision and update of standardized baselines

Transition Portal

 As of 30 June 2023 - a dedicated portal available to facilitate the submission of transition requests by PPs of eligible CDM PAs and PoAs to the Article 6.4 mechanism.



# Eligibility for transition – Project Activities & PoAs

Activity Type	<ul> <li>Shall be among those indicated publicly by the host party to the Supervisory Body.</li> </ul>
Crediting Period/PoA period	<ul> <li>Active as of 1 Jan 2021</li> <li>Ends either at the end of the current CDM CP/PoA period or 31 Dec 2025 (whichever is earlier) or as specified by the host party</li> <li>Type (renewable or fixed) – not to change at or after transition</li> <li>Renewals - carry over from CDM unless the Host Party specifies no-renewal</li> </ul>
Use of CDM Methodologies	<ul> <li>May continue to use currently applied CDM meth until renewal or 31 Dec 2025 (whichever is earlier)</li> <li>May voluntarily replace the meth or if incompatible with the HP methodological approach</li> <li>For a PoA that continues applying CDM meths, no new CPAs may be included until renewal of PoA under Art. 6.4</li> <li>Additionality demonstration is deemed fulfilled if CDM meth is applied</li> <li>Global Warming Potential – apply values from the IPCC 5AR.</li> </ul>
Additional activity design requirements	<ul> <li>Long-term benefits to climate change</li> <li>Addressing non-permanence (all types of activities) – analysis of risks and panned monitoring and counter measures</li> <li>Social impacts</li> </ul>



# Procedures for transition of project activities/PoAs

Submission of transition request	<ul> <li>PPs shall submit their expression of transition by filling the "CDM activity transition request form"</li> <li>Submission of the form to the SB by 31 Dec 2023</li> </ul>
Global stakeholder consultation	<ul> <li>Parties, stakeholders, and UNFCCC admitted observer organizations may submit comments within 28 days of the publication of the request for transition on the UNFCCC website.</li> </ul>
Submission of host party approval	<ul> <li>Fill in the "CDM activity transition approval form"</li> <li>Submit to the Art.6.4 SB through a dedicated interface on the UNFCCC website, by 31 Dec 2025</li> <li>HP may submit approval only after it has fulfilled participation requirements e.g., nominated Art.6.4 DNA, submitted its NDC etc</li> <li>The secretariat shall publish the host party approval of transition on the UNFCC website and promptly inform the PPs of the receipt of such approval.</li> </ul>
Submission of additional documentation	<ul> <li>Addendum to the PDD, PoA-DD and CPA within 6 months of the publication of the host party approval (in case of continued use of currently applied CDM meths).</li> <li>Revised PDD, or PoA-DD/CPA-DDs and a validation report within 1 year (for voluntary/mandatory meth replacement cases)</li> </ul>




# Transition process cont'd......

Processing of transition request	<ul> <li>Upon payment of transition fee (waived for activities in LDCs &amp; SIDs)</li> <li>Completeness check by the secretariat (within 7 days) - prioritizing requests for transition for small-scale CDM PA and PoAs</li> <li>Substantive check (21 days)</li> <li>Preparation of summary note to SB whether to approve the requested transition (within 14 days of the date of publication of additional documentation)</li> </ul>
Requesting review of transition request	<ul> <li>Host party of the transitioning PA/PoA, SB member/alternate (within 28 days of receipt of the notification of the completion of the substantive check)</li> <li>Provide reasons for requesting review</li> </ul>
Finalizing transition request	<ul> <li>If no review is requested, the request for transition shall be deemed approved by the Supervisory Body.</li> <li>The secretariat shall register the activity under the A6.4 mechanism, to be effective on the day it is deregistered from the CDM.</li> </ul>

# Use of pre-2021 CERs

3/CMA.3 Rules, modalities and procedures for the mechanism established by Article 6, paragraph 4, of the Paris Agreement (Decision in Glasgow)

- XI. Transition of clean development mechanism activities and use of certified emission reductions towards first nationally determined contribution
  - A. Transition of clean development mechanism activities
  - B. Use of certified emission reductions towards first or first updated nationally determined contributions
- 75. Certified emission reductions (CERs) issued under the CDM may be used towards achievement of an NDC provided the following conditions are met:
  - (a) The CDM project activity or programme of activities was registered on or after 1 January 2013;
  - (b) The CERs shall be transferred to and held in the mechanism registry and identified as pre-2021 emission reductions;
  - (c) The CERs may be used towards achievement of the first NDC only;







# Use of pre-2021 CERs

#### 75. ...

- (d) The CDM host Party **shall not** be required to apply a corresponding adjustment consistently with decision 2/CMA.3 in respect of the CERs and not be subject to the **share of proceeds** pursuant to chapter VII above (Levy of share of proceeds for adaptation and administrative expenses)
- (e) CERs not meeting the conditions referred to in paragraph 75(a–d) above may only be used for achievement of an NDC in accordance with a relevant future decision of the CMA:
- (f) Temporary CERs and long-term CERs shall not be used towards NDCs.
