How It Works — Step by Step

- 1 Receive your ticket**

At the entrance of the room, you will receive a ticket assigning you to a specific table for the first round. Please follow this guidance to ensure groups of similar size at each table.
- 2 Go to your assigned table**

Find your assigned table and take a seat. An expert and a moderator will be present at each table.
- 3 Listen to the situation presented**

The expert will briefly present a real-life situation in which at least one challenge relevant to the table's topic emerged. You will then have the opportunity to ask clarifying questions before the main discussion begins.
- 4 Discuss best practices**

Participants discuss best practices to address the challenge(s) presented. Draw on your own experience and national context. All perspectives are welcome.
- 5 Key points are captured**

The moderator will foster the discussion and capture the key points on a paperboard as the discussion unfolds.
- 6 Rotate to your next table**

After 25 minutes, you will be asked to move to your next table. To keep transitions short and ensure broad topic coverage, you will choose between only two options: the two tables of the station immediately following your current one (e.g. from 1A or 1B → choose between 2A or 2B, from 2A or 2B → choose between 3A or 3B, and so on).
- 7 Report-back in plenary**

On Wednesday afternoon, moderators from each table will share the key highlights from their discussions in a plenary report-back session.
