I. Introduction and background

- ❖ 2015 Paris Agreement, Art.7.1: global goal on adaptation of enhancing adaptive capacity, strengthening resilience and reducing vulnerability to climate change, with a view to contributing to sustainable development and ensuring an adequate response in the context of the goal of limiting temperature increase
- ❖ CMA Madrid 2019: Request to AC to consider approaches to reviewing the overall progress made in achieving the global goal on adaptation and to reflect the outcome of this consideration in its 2021 annual report
- ❖ 2019-2021 AC workplan: Preparation of a technical paper on useful information and methodologies for assessing progress in enhancing adaptive capacity, strengthening resilience and reducing vulnerability to climate change, initially planned for 2021



II. Overview

- Revised draft technical paper responds to AC workplan and the CMA request and includes:
 - 1. Analysis of the **scientific literature**, including of approaches for assessing collective progress on adaptation
 - 2. Overview of national approaches
 - 3. Summary of spectrum of approaches
 - Basic quantitative indicators (e.g. number of NAPs submitted, number of countries reporting on vulnerability assessments)
 - Using existing data and indicators from the SDGs, Sendai Framework, or other relevant international sources
 - Qualitative synthesis of Party inputs
 - Informal knowledge exchange

- Modifying existing data and indicators from the SDGs, Sendai Framework, or other relevant international sources
 - Creating, distributing, and analyzing voluntary questionnaires or self-assessments
- Defining, negotiating, and/or implementing a standardized suite of indicators
- Conducting and aggregating indepth evaluative proximity-totarget analyses for each country
