## I: Introduction and background

---

- **Mandate:** In 2018, the CMA requested the AC to develop, with the engagement of the IPCC WGII, using relevant existing guidance as a starting point, by June 2022, **draft supplementary guidance for voluntary use by Parties in communicating information in accordance with the elements contained in the annex of decision 9/CMA.1** for consideration by the subsidiary bodies at their fifty-seventh sessions (Nov. 2022).
- **Objective:** To help Parties to enhance the quality of information, reduce duplications and the work required to prepare that information, and help them benefit from synergies with relevant actions.
- **Approach:** Collection on the feedback provided by Party representatives, practitioners, and other experts, including scientific experts from IPCC WG II, e.g. 30 June 2021, Webinar; 22 March 2022, Expert meeting

Purpose	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Strengthen visibility, profile, balance with mitigation, action, support, learning and understanding</li></ul>
Role in the global stocktake	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Information on state of adaptation, experiences, priorities</li><li>• Contribute to review of progress and enhanced implementation</li></ul>
Guiding principles	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Country-driven, flexible, voluntary</li><li>• No additional burden or basis for comparison or review</li></ul>

---

- ✓ Existing vehicle document guidelines and potential information synergies between ADCOMs and other communications, through providing specific guidelines for each of four vehicles.

## II: Key information and changes to the draft since AC 20

- **Part II:** Supplementary guidance to facilitate the preparation of information on specific elements
- ✓ Elaborated the information on each of the nine types of information identified in 9/CMA.1.
- ✓ For each type of the information, provided a brief description, an overview of where related information appears in other UNFCCC guidelines, of resources that can facilitate the preparation of the element, and suggestions by the AC for such preparation.


### ➤ In part I:
