It might be unclear to Parties what the modalities are under which they may access such support (i.e. whether they need to explicitly request it) and whether this support is only available in the context of support for BTR and/or NCs or also in the context of support for other planning or reporting instruments (NAPs, NDCs) or as standalone support.	9/CMA.1, GEF report to COP in 2022
