Flexible workplan of the AC for 2025-2027

9-13 September 2024, Bonn

I. Introduction and background

- ➤ Mandate: 2/CP.17, requested the AC to develop a three-year plan for its work, in accordance with its agreed functions
- Current workplan covering 2022-2024
- Principle of flexibility
- Initiated consultations on 2025-2027 workplan at AC 25
- > Agreed on time line
- > Party guidance through negotiations, observers inputs through through AC meetings and per email

II. Timeline

- > April 2024: Co-Chairs, interested AC members and the secretariat screen priority areas discussed, and elaborate a first set of possible activities to address these areas;
- May 2024: 1st conference call with interested AC members to discuss:
 - > The structure of the workplan (see chapter 4 below);
 - > An overview of adaptation-related activities from other adaptation-related constituted bodies;
 - Modalities and timing of consultations with other constituted bodies;
 - > The possibility of seeking inputs from observers;
- > End of June 2024: 2nd conference call with interested AC members to discuss a first order draft;
- > Mid-August 2024: 3rd conference call with interested AC members to discuss a second order draft;
- > July September 2024: Consultations on collaboration opportunities with Constituted Bodies
- > AC 26 (9-13 September 2024): Approval of the workplan for inclusion in the 2024 annual report of the AC

II. Current draft

- Taking into account AC objective and functions as per decision 1/CP.16, and mandated cross-cutting considerations
- ➤ Organized in three workstreams:
 - ➤1: Providing technical support and guidance for the implementation of national adaptation processes
 - >2: Considering Party information on adaptation
 - > 3: Communication, collaboration and coherence
