At AC 27, the Adaptation Committee:

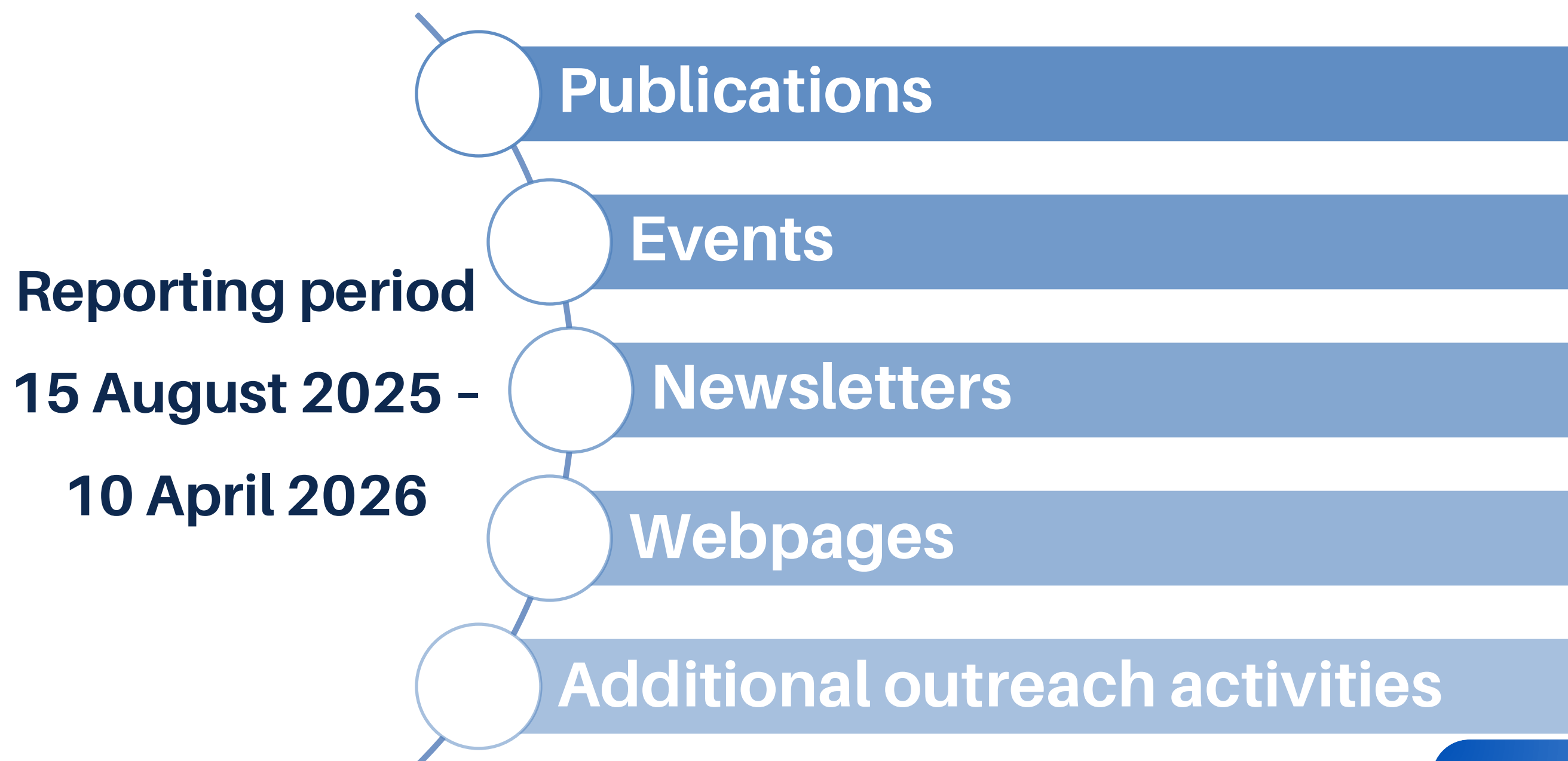

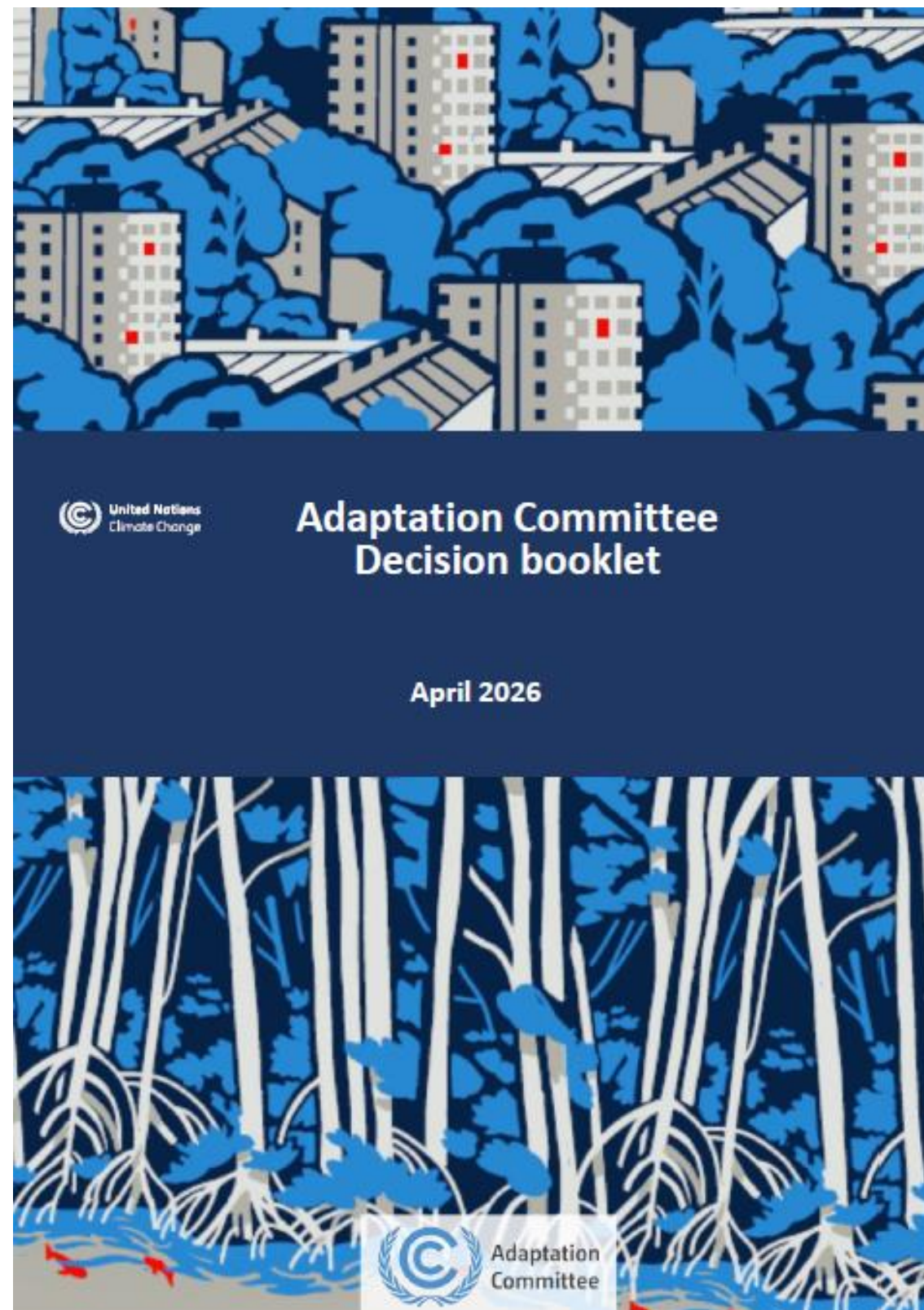



Adaptation Finance Quick Facts

As of October 2025, the [Green Climate Fund](#) had [allocated USD 7.34 billion](#) to adaptation, representing approximately 59 per cent of the total funding in grant equivalent. This funding, which primarily benefits the least developed countries, small island developing States, and African States, is collectively expected to strengthen climate resilience for 1.6 billion people worldwide.

As of February 2026, the [Adaptation Fund](#) had [allocated USD 1.5 billion](#) to 217 climate adaptation projects. These projects have benefited approximately 65.6 million people in more than 110 countries and have helped preserve or restore nearly 1 million hectares of natural habitats. More than half of its portfolio, as [reported in November 2025](#), has been directed to the least developed countries (33 per cent) and small island developing States (18 per cent).

As of January 2026, the Global Environment Facility, through the [Least Developed Countries Fund \(LDCF\)](#), [had provided approximately USD 2.39 billion](#) in adaptation funding to 446 projects across 51 least developed countries since its inception. At the same time, through the [Special Climate Change Fund](#), it has [provided USD 405.8 million](#) in adaptation funding to 106 projects across 117 developing countries.

As reported in the [December 2025 GEF-8 Corporate Scorecard](#), to date under GEF-8, a combined USD 718.1 million had been approved for climate change adaptation through the two funds, benefiting 27.5 million people and enabling 7 million hectares of land to be managed for climate resilience.
