2. *Background:* In accordance with rule 10 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, the secretariat, in agreement with the President of CMA 4, Sameh Shoukry (Egypt), drafted the provisional agenda for CMA 5, following consultations with the Bureau of the governing bodies and taking into account views of Parties.
3. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to adopt its agenda.

4. *Background:* If any member of the Bureau represents a State that is not a Party to the Paris Agreement, consultations will be required to identify a nominee representing a Party to the Paris Agreement to replace such a member in accordance with Article 16, paragraph 3, of the Paris Agreement.
5. Parties are invited to recall decision 3/CP.23 and to give active consideration to the nomination of women for elective posts in any body established under the Convention or the Paris Agreement.
6. *Action:* The CMA will be invited, as necessary, to elect additional members of the Bureau of COP 28, CMP 18 and CMA 5 to replace any members representing States that are not Parties to the Paris Agreement.

(a) The high-level events of the global stocktake, where the findings of the technical assessment will be presented and their implications discussed and considered by Parties;⁴

(b) The high-level ministerial dialogue on the new collective quantified goal on climate finance.⁵ The dialogue will be informed by the reports on the technical expert dialogues and the submissions referred to in paragraph 59 below;

(c) The biennial high-level ministerial dialogue on climate finance.⁶ The dialogue will be informed, inter alia, by the summary reports on the in-session workshops and the biennial communications referred to in paragraph 65 below.

(d) The high-level ministerial round table on pre-2030 ambition;⁷

(e) The annual high-level ministerial round table on just transition, as part of the work programme on just transition pathways, established at CMA 4.⁸

9. The annual NDC synthesis report, covering information from the latest NDCs of all Parties to the Paris Agreement available in the interim NDC registry as at 30 July 2023, will be made available at this session.⁹ Also, the secretariat prepared the annual synthesis report on long-term low greenhouse gas emission development strategies referred to in Article 4, paragraph 19, of the Paris Agreement for consideration at CMA 5.¹⁰

10. In organizing its work, the CMA will be able to refer the consideration of any matter to the subsidiary bodies, if Parties consider this appropriate.

11. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to agree on the organization of work for the session and the referral of the consideration of any matter to the subsidiary bodies, as appropriate.

12. Guided by the principles of openness, transparency and inclusiveness, the CMA will also be invited to organize its work in a manner that ensures that the mandates for the session are addressed while being flexible enough to respond to changing circumstances and new developments in the negotiations.

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4. First global stocktake

19. *Background:* Article 14 of the Paris Agreement provides that the CMA shall periodically take stock of the implementation of the Paris Agreement to assess collective progress towards achieving its purpose and long-term goals, referred to as the global stocktake. The global stocktake consists of three components: information collection and preparation, technical assessment and consideration of outputs.¹²

20. CMA 3 welcomed the start of the first global stocktake,¹³ which commenced at SBSTA 52–55.¹⁴ The technical assessment component of the stocktake started at SB 56¹⁵ and concluded at SB 58.¹⁶ The consideration of outputs will take place at CMA 5 and will include the high-level events referred to in paragraph 8(a) above. The global stocktake is being conducted with the assistance of the subsidiary bodies, which established a joint contact group supported by a technical dialogue through expert consideration of inputs from the sources identified for the global stocktake.¹⁷ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.¹⁸

21. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to conclude the consideration of outputs of the first global stocktake on the basis of the discussions at the high-level events referred to in paragraph 8(a) above and the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

5. Work programme on just transition pathways referred to in the relevant paragraphs of decision 1/CMA.4

22. *Background:* CMA 4 established a work programme on just transition for discussion of pathways to achieving the goals of the Paris Agreement outlined in Article 2, paragraph 1, in the context of Article 2, paragraph 2. It requested the SBI and the SBSTA to recommend a draft decision on this matter for consideration and adoption at CMA 5, with the work programme to be implemented in a manner that builds on and complements the relevant workstreams under the Convention and the Paris Agreement, including the Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme.¹⁹ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.²⁰

23. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

6. Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme referred to in decision 4/CMA.4

24. *Background:* CMA 3 established a work programme to urgently scale up mitigation ambition and implementation in this critical decade.²¹

25. CMA 4 requested the secretariat to prepare, under the guidance of the co-chairs of the work programme, a report on each of the dialogues held as part of the work programme, reflecting in a comprehensive and balanced manner the discussions held and including a summary, key findings, opportunities and barriers relevant to the topic, and to prepare an annual report comprising a compilation of the individual dialogue reports for consideration by the CMA, the SBSTA and the SBI.²²

26. CMA 4 also requested the SBSTA and the SBI to consider progress in implementing the work programme with a view to recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption by the CMA at each of its sessions.²³ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.²⁴

27. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the annual report prepared by the secretariat and the draft decision of the SBSTA and the SBI and take any action it deems appropriate.

7. Reporting and review pursuant to Article 13 of the Paris Agreement: provision of financial and technical support to developing country Parties for reporting and capacity-building

28. *Background:* CMA 3 decided that this matter will be considered at CMA 4 and at each session thereafter, including consideration of the support provided to developing country

Parties for reporting and related capacity-building under Article 13 of the Paris Agreement.²⁵ CMA 4 referred consideration of this matter to the SBI²⁶ and took note of its conclusions.²⁷

29. Matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBI.²⁸

30. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBI.

8. Matters relating to adaptation

(a) Glasgow–Sharm el-Sheikh work programme on the global goal on adaptation referred to in decision 7/CMA.3

31. *Background:* CMA 3 established and launched a comprehensive two-year (2022–2023) Glasgow–Sharm el-Sheikh work programme on the global goal on adaptation, to be carried out jointly by the SBSTA and the SBI.²⁹ It invited the subsidiary bodies to report annually to the CMA on progress in implementing the work programme with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at CMA 5.³⁰ It also requested the secretariat to prepare, under the guidance of the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies, a single annual report on the workshops.³¹

32. CMA 4 decided to initiate the development of a framework for the global goal on adaptation to be undertaken through a structured approach under the Glasgow–Sharm el-Sheikh work programme in 2023 with a view to the framework being adopted at CMA 5.³² It requested the secretariat to include in the single annual report referred to in paragraph 31 above an analysis of the outcomes of the workshops and to prepare, under the guidance of the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies, a summary of each workshop to be published prior to each subsequent workshop for consideration at SB 59.³³

33. Matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.³⁴

34. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the report of the subsidiary bodies on progress in implementing the work programme and to take any action it deems appropriate. The CMA will also be invited to adopt a framework for the global goal on adaptation on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI on this matter.

(b) Report of the Adaptation Committee and review of the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee

35. *Background:* CMA 1 decided that the Adaptation Committee shall serve the Paris Agreement.³⁵ COP 17 requested the Adaptation Committee to report annually to the COP

through the subsidiary bodies.³⁶ Accordingly, matters relating to the report of the Adaptation Committee are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.³⁷

36. COP 27 was to review the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee,³⁸ and COP 26 invited CMA 4 to participate in the review as it relates to the Paris Agreement.³⁹ COP 27 and CMA 4 noted that consideration of the review could not be completed at those sessions and would therefore continue at SB 58.⁴⁰ Matters relating to the review of the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee are also considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.⁴¹

37. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI on the two matters outlined above.

9. Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage associated with Climate Change Impacts

38. *Background:* COP 19 and 20 requested the WIM Executive Committee to report annually to the COP through the subsidiary bodies and to make recommendations, as appropriate.⁴² Accordingly, matters relating to the report of the WIM Executive Committee are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.⁴³ Article 8, paragraph 2, of the Paris Agreement states that the WIM shall be subject to the authority and guidance of the CMA and may be enhanced and strengthened as determined by the CMA.

39. CMA 4 welcomed the 2022 report of the WIM Executive Committee and endorsed the recommendations contained therein.⁴⁴ It also welcomed the adoption by the WIM Executive Committee of its second five-year rolling workplan, the second plan of action of the technical expert group on comprehensive risk management and the third plan of action of the task force on displacement.⁴⁵ COP 27 endorsed the decision adopted by the CMA.⁴⁶

40. CMA 4 decided on the structure of the Santiago network for averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change and adopted its terms of reference,⁴⁷ and COP 27 endorsed this decision.⁴⁸ It further decided that a selection process for the host of the Santiago network secretariat shall be launched upon the conclusion of COP 27 and CMA 4 in order to select the host by 2023.⁴⁹ CMA 4 requested the subsidiary bodies to recommend at SB 58 a draft decision with one proposal to host the Santiago network secretariat for consideration and adoption by the governing body or bodies at their session(s) to be held in November–December 2023.⁵⁰ It also requested the secretariat, under the guidance of the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies, to develop a draft host agreement (memorandum of understanding) with the proposer recommended by the subsidiary bodies at SB 58 with a view to recommending it for consideration and approval by the governing body or bodies at their session(s) to be held in November–December 2023.⁵¹

41. COP 27 and CMA 4 noted that considerations related to governance of the WIM will continue at CMA 5.⁵²

42. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI on this matter. It will also be invited to elect members of the WIM Executive Committee and the advisory body of the Santiago network.

10. Matters relating to finance

(a) Matters relating to the Standing Committee on Finance

43. *Background:* COP 21 decided that the SCF shall serve the Paris Agreement in line with its functions and responsibilities established under the COP.⁵³

44. CMA 4 requested the SCF to report on its progress in implementing its workplan for 2023.⁵⁴ It also requested the SCF to continue its work regarding ways to achieve Article 2, paragraph 1(c), of the Paris Agreement, including options for approaches and guidelines for implementation, in accordance with decision 10/CMA.3, paragraph 2, for consideration at CMA 5 and invited Parties and stakeholders in the financial sector to make further submissions thereon via the submission portal by 30 April 2023.⁵⁵

45. CMA 4 requested the SCF to prepare a report on the doubling of adaptation finance, in line with paragraph 18 of decision 1/CMA.3, for consideration at CMA 5.⁵⁶

46. COP 27 requested SBI 59 to complete its work on the second review of the functions of the SCF with a view to recommending draft decisions on the matter for consideration and adoption at COP 28 and CMA 5.⁵⁷ Accordingly, matters relating to the second review of the SCF are considered under the SBI.⁵⁸

47. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the SCF report and to take any action it deems appropriate. It will also be invited to consider the recommendations of the SBI on the review of the functions of the SCF.

It recommended that the CMA provide guidance to the GCF on policies, programme priorities and eligibility criteria related to the Agreement for transmission by the COP. It decided that the guidance to the GCF in relevant decisions of the COP, including those agreed before the adoption of the Agreement, shall apply mutatis mutandis to the Agreement.⁵⁹

49. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to provide guidance to the GCF on policies, programme priorities and eligibility criteria related to the Paris Agreement for transmission by the COP.

50. *Background:* COP 21 decided that the GEF shall serve the Paris Agreement. COP 21 recommended that the CMA provide guidance to the GEF on policies, programme priorities and eligibility criteria related to the Agreement for transmission by the COP. It decided that the guidance to the GEF in relevant decisions of the COP, including those agreed before the adoption of the Agreement, shall apply mutatis mutandis to the Agreement.⁶⁰

51. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the information provided by the GEF and to provide guidance to it on policies, programme priorities and eligibility criteria related to the Paris Agreement for transmission by the COP.

(d) Matters relating to the Adaptation Fund

52. *Background:* CMA 1 decided that the Adaptation Fund shall serve the Paris Agreement under the guidance of, and be accountable to, the CMA with respect to all matters relating to the Paris Agreement, effective 1 January 2019.⁶¹ CMP 14 took note of that decision.⁶²

53. CMA 4 requested the Adaptation Fund Board to include in its annual report to CMA 5 an update on its progress in assisting developing country Parties in meeting their adaptation commitments under the Paris Agreement.⁶³

54. CMP 17 requested the Adaptation Fund Board to include in its annual report to CMP 18 and CMA 5 information on aggregated actual results of projects and programmes funded by the Adaptation Fund, in particular across the Fund's five core indicators, accompanied by qualitative analysis of successes, challenges and lessons learned.⁶⁴

55. CMA 4 encouraged the Adaptation Fund Board to continue its consideration of its rules of procedure in the context of serving the Paris Agreement, including after the SBI has concluded its consideration of matters related to membership of the Board.⁶⁵

56. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate.

(e) New collective quantified goal on climate finance

57. *Background:* COP 21 decided that, in accordance with Article 9, paragraph 3, of the Paris Agreement, developed countries intend to continue their existing collective mobilization goal through 2025 in the context of meaningful mitigation actions and transparency on implementation, and that prior to 2025 the CMA shall set a new collective quantified goal from a floor of USD 100 billion per year, taking into account the needs and priorities of developing countries.⁶⁶

58. CMA 3 set out the arrangements for work on setting a new collective quantified goal on climate finance to be conducted in 2022–2024, including establishing an ad hoc work programme for 2022–2024,⁶⁷ conducting four technical expert dialogues per year as part of the ad hoc work programme,⁶⁸ convening high-level ministerial dialogues⁶⁹ and taking stock of progress and providing further guidance on the ad hoc work programme from CMA 4, 5 and 6, taking into consideration the annual reports of the co-chairs of the ad hoc work programme and the summary reports on the high-level ministerial dialogues.⁷⁰

59. CMA 4 invited Parties, constituted bodies under the Convention and the Paris Agreement, the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism, climate finance institutions, observers and observer organizations, and other stakeholders, particularly from the private sector, to submit inputs on each technical expert dialogue to be held, and requested the secretariat to prepare a compilation and synthesis of the submissions as input to the technical

expert dialogues to be held in 2023.⁷¹ The fifth technical expert dialogue was held from 8 to 10 March 2023 in Vienna⁷² and the sixth in conjunction with SB 58;⁷³ the seventh will be held from 30 September to 2 October 2023 in Geneva⁷⁴ and the eighth in conjunction with CMA 5.

60. CMA 4 invited the President of CMA 5 to organize the 2023 high-level ministerial dialogue on the new collective quantified goal on climate finance, taking into consideration the information provided by the co-chairs of the ad hoc work programme in line with paragraph 11(f) of decision 5/CMA.4, with a view to facilitating interactive discussions, substantively advancing shared understanding of the goal and providing guidance for work in 2024.⁷⁵ The President of CMA 5 will prepare a summary of the deliberations at the dialogue for consideration by the CMA at this session.

61. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the annual report of the co-chairs of the ad hoc work programme and the summary of the deliberations at the high-level ministerial dialogue on the new collective quantified goal on climate finance and to take any action it deems appropriate.

(f) Compilation and synthesis of, and summary report on the in-session workshop on, biennial communications of information related to Article 9, paragraph 5, of the Paris Agreement

62. *Background:* CMA 3 requested developed country Parties to submit their second biennial communications in 2022, in accordance with decision 12/CMA.1, paragraph 4, before 31 December 2022.⁷⁶ It also requested the secretariat to prepare a compilation and synthesis of the biennial communications in accordance with decision 12/CMA.1, paragraph 7,⁷⁷ and to organize, in 2023, an in-session workshop on information to be provided by Parties in accordance with Article 9, paragraph 5, of the Paris Agreement and prepare a summary report thereon for consideration at CMA 5.⁷⁸

63. The workshop took place during SB 58, on 6 June 2023,⁷⁹ and the secretariat prepared a summary report on the workshop for consideration at CMA 5.

64. CMA 3 welcomed the deliberations at the first high-level ministerial dialogue on climate finance in accordance with decision 12/CMA.1, paragraph 10, and looked forward to the summary thereof to be prepared by the COP Presidency.⁸⁰ The summary report has been prepared for consideration at CMA 5.

65. In accordance with decision 12/CMA.1, paragraph 10, CMA 5 will convene a high-level ministerial dialogue on climate finance, to be informed, inter alia, by the summary reports on the in-session workshops and the biennial communications.

66. The CMA, at its first session, decided to consider updating the types of information contained in the annex to decision 12/CMA.1 at its session in 2023 on the basis of Parties' experience and lessons learned in the preparation of their biennial communications of indicative quantitative and qualitative information.⁸¹

67. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the documents prepared for this session and to take any action it deems appropriate. It will also be invited to consider updating the types of information contained in the annex to decision 12/CMA.1.

- (g) Operationalization of the funding arrangements for responding to loss and damage referred to in paragraph 2, including the fund referred to in paragraph 3, of decisions 2/CP.27 and 2/CMA.4

68. *Background:* CMA 4 and COP 27 decided to establish new funding arrangements for assisting developing countries that are particularly vulnerable to the adverse effects of climate change, in responding to loss and damage, including with a focus on addressing loss and damage by providing and assisting in mobilizing new and additional resources, and that these new arrangements complement and include sources, funds, processes and initiatives under and outside the Convention and the Paris Agreement. In this context, they also established a fund for responding to loss and damage whose mandate includes a focus on addressing loss and damage.⁸²

69. To operationalize the new funding arrangements for responding to loss and damage and the associated fund, CMA 4 and COP 27 established the Transitional Committee that is to make recommendations on this matter for consideration and adoption at CMA 5 and COP 28.⁸³

70. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the report by the Transitional Committee and to take any action it deems appropriate.

- (h) Sharm el-Sheikh dialogue on the scope of Article 2, paragraph 1(c), of the Paris Agreement and its complementarity with Article 9 of the Paris Agreement

71. *Background:* CMA 4 decided to launch the Sharm el-Sheikh dialogue between Parties, relevant organizations and stakeholders to exchange views on and enhance understanding of the scope of Article 2, paragraph 1(c), of the Paris Agreement and its complementarity with Article 9 of the Paris Agreement and requested the secretariat, under the guidance of the COP 27 Presidency, to organize two workshops in 2023 in this regard and to prepare a report to the CMA on the deliberations at these workshops.⁸⁴

72. The first workshop took place from 19 to 20 July in Bangkok and the second workshop will take place from 3 to 4 October in Geneva.

73. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on this matter.

76. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

77. *Background:* The PCCB prepares annual technical progress reports on its work for submission to the COP through the SBI.⁸⁸ CMA 2 decided that the PCCB shall serve the Paris Agreement in accordance with its mandate and terms of reference.⁸⁹ CMA 2 confirmed that the PCCB shall report to both the COP and the CMA through its annual technical progress report.⁹⁰ Matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBI.⁹¹

13. Report of the forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures

79. *Background:* COP 24, CMP 14 and CMA 1 acknowledged that a single forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures covers the work of the COP, the CMP and the CMA on all matters relating to the impact of the implementation of response measures and affirmed that the forum shall report to the COP, the CMP and the CMA.⁹²

80. CMA 1 decided that the forum shall provide recommendations for consideration by the subsidiary bodies with a view to them recommending actions for consideration and adoption by the COP, the CMP and the CMA.⁹³

81. Matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.⁹⁴

82. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

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14. Matters relating to Article 6 of the Paris Agreement

(a) Guidance on cooperative approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 2, of the Paris Agreement and in decision 2/CMA.3

83. *Background:* CMA 3 adopted guidance on cooperative approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 2, of the Paris Agreement and requested the SBSTA to undertake further work on the basis of that guidance and develop recommendations for consideration and adoption at CMA 4.⁹⁵ CMA 4 adopted further guidance.⁹⁶

84. CMA 4 encouraged Parties to test the draft version of the agreed electronic format referred to in decision 2/CMA.3, annex, chapter IV.B (Annual information) and requested the secretariat to organize a hybrid workshop on the draft version of the agreed electronic format prior to SBSTA 58.⁹⁷ It also requested the secretariat to provide an annual report to the CMA on the activities relating to chapter VI (Recording and tracking) of the annex to decision 2/CMA.3, including information on recorded internationally transferred mitigation outcomes, corresponding adjustments and emission balances.⁹⁸

85. CMA 4 requested the SBSTA to continue its work on the draft version of the agreed electronic format referred to in paragraph 84 above with a view to finalizing a recommendation on the agreed electronic format for consideration and adoption at CMA 5.⁹⁹ Accordingly, consideration of this matter will continue under the SBSTA.¹⁰⁰

(b) Rules, modalities and procedures for the mechanism established by Article 6, paragraph 4, of the Paris Agreement and referred to in decision 3/CMA.3

87. *Background:* The annex to decision 3/CMA.3 contains the rules, modalities and procedures for the mechanism established by Article 6, paragraph 4, of the Paris Agreement.

88. CMA 3 designated the Supervisory Body for the mechanism established by Article 6, paragraph 4, of the Paris Agreement to supervise the mechanism¹⁰¹ and CMA 4 adopted its rules of procedure.¹⁰² In accordance with the rules, modalities and procedures for the mechanism, the Supervisory Body is to report annually to the CMA.¹⁰³

89. CMA 4 requested the Supervisory Body to consider the views of Parties and observers in elaborating and further developing recommendations on activities involving removals on the basis of the rules, modalities and procedures, and taking into account the mandate provided to the Supervisory Body contained in paragraph 24(a)(ix) of the rules, modalities and procedures, for consideration and adoption at CMA 5.¹⁰⁴ It also requested the Supervisory Body to elaborate and further develop recommendations, on the basis of the rules, modalities and procedures, for consideration and adoption at CMA 5, on the application of the requirements referred to in chapter V.B (Methodologies) of the rules, modalities and procedures.¹⁰⁵

90. CMP 17 invited the CMA to request the Supervisory Body to cooperate with the Executive Board of the clean development mechanism on implementing the process for transferring eligible certified emission reductions to the mechanism registry.¹⁰⁶

91. CMA 4 requested the SBSTA to continue its consideration of, and to develop, on the basis of the rules, modalities and procedures for the mechanism and elaboration thereon, recommendations for consideration and adoption at CMA 5 on issues referred to in paragraph 9(a–c) of decision 7/CMA.4. Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBSTA.¹⁰⁷

92. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the annual report and the recommendations of the Supervisory Body with a view to adopting the recommendations and to provide guidance to the Supervisory Body, as appropriate. The CMA will also be invited to take any other action it deems appropriate, including on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA. It will further be invited to elect members and alternate members of the Supervisory Body.

94. CMA 4 adopted the 2023–2024 schedule for implementing the activities of the work programme referred to in paragraph 93 above.¹¹⁰ CMA 3 decided to review the report of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches and provide guidance on the framework and the work programme, as appropriate.¹¹¹

95. Matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBSTA.¹¹²

96. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the report of the Glasgow Committee on Non-market Approaches and provide guidance on the framework and the work programme, as appropriate, as well as to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA.
