Parties are invited to recall, inter alia, decisions [23/CP.18](#), [3/CP.23](#) and [7/CP.29](#) and actively consider nominating women.

8. 4. **Matters relating to the global stocktake: report on the annual global stocktake dialogue referred to in paragraph 187 of decision 1/CMA.5**

16. *Background:* CMA 5 requested the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies to organize an annual global stocktake dialogue, starting at SB 60, to facilitate the sharing of knowledge and good practices on how the outcomes of the global stocktake are informing the preparation of Parties' next NDCs in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Paris Agreement and also requested the secretariat to prepare a report thereon for consideration at the subsequent CMA session.¹⁷

17. CMA 7 decided that the dialogue would conclude at SB 64 and that the CMA will consider the resumption of the dialogue in the context of its consideration of the outcome of the second global stocktake.¹⁸

18. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the 2026 report on the annual global stocktake dialogue and take any action it deems appropriate.

5. **United Arab Emirates just transition work programme**

19. *Background:* CMA 5 decided that the implementation of the United Arab Emirates just transition work programme shall start immediately after CMA 5 and be implemented under the guidance of the SBSTA and the SBI through a joint contact group to be convened at each of their sessions, starting at SB 60, with a view to the subsidiary bodies recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption by the CMA at each of its sessions, and agreed to review the effectiveness and efficiency of the work programme and consider its continuation at CMA 8.¹⁹ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.²⁰

20. CMA 5 requested the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies to prepare an annual summary report on the dialogues held as part of the work programme.²¹

21. CMA 7 also requested the secretariat to map relevant instruments, initiatives and processes under the Convention and the Paris Agreement and relevant entities in the United Nations system to support the implementation of the work programme and as input to the

review referred to in paragraph 3 of decision [3/CMA.5](#) and further requested the secretariat to prepare a synthesis report thereon.²²

22. CMA 7 decided to develop a just transition mechanism and requested SB 64 to recommend a draft decision on the process for its operationalization for consideration at CMA 8.²³

23. SB 64 considered this matter and agreed to continue consideration at SB 65 with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration at CMA 8.²⁴

24. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

6. Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme

25. *Background:* CMA 3 established a work programme for urgently scaling up mitigation ambition and implementation in this critical decade.²⁵

26. CMA 4 requested the secretariat to prepare, under the guidance of the co-chairs of the work programme, a report on each of the dialogues held under the work programme, and an annual report comprising a compilation of the individual dialogue reports for consideration by the CMA, the SBSTA and the SBI.²⁶ CMA 4 also requested the SBSTA and the SBI to consider progress in implementing the work programme with a view to recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption by the CMA at each of its sessions.²⁷ CMA 4 decided that the work programme will continue until CMA 8 with a view to adopting a decision on the continuation of the work programme at that session.²⁸ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.²⁹

27. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the draft decision recommended by the SBSTA and the SBI and the annual report and take any action it deems appropriate.

7. Further guidance on features of nationally determined contributions, referred to in paragraph 26 of decision 1/CP.21

28. *Background:* CMA 1 noted that features of NDCs are outlined in the relevant provisions of the Paris Agreement and decided to continue consideration of further guidance on features of NDCs at CMA 6.³⁰

29. CMA 6 considered this matter and noted that Parties had expressed views thereon at that session, including those reflected in the non-exhaustive compilation of in-session submissions available on the UNFCCC website,³¹ and agreed to continue consideration of the matter at CMA 8.³²

30. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider this matter and take any action it deems appropriate.

8. Reporting and review pursuant to Article 13 of the Paris Agreement: provision of financial and technical support to developing country Parties for reporting and capacity-building

31. *Background:* CMA 3 decided that this matter will be considered at CMA 4 and at each session thereafter, including consideration of the support provided to developing country Parties for reporting and related capacity-building under Article 13 of the Paris Agreement.³³

32. CMA 7 requested the secretariat to develop and implement a list of activities on an annual basis in 2026–2028.³⁴

33. CMA 7 also requested SBI 65 to consider the submissions and reports from the list of activities referred to in paragraph 32 above with a view to providing guidance to the secretariat, as applicable, on ways of maximizing the reach and effectiveness of the activities to be undertaken in the subsequent annual cycle.³⁵

34. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBI.

9. Matters relating to adaptation

(a) Global goal on adaptation

35. *Background:* CMA 6 affirmed that the agenda item on matters relating to the global goal on adaptation is a standing agenda item and will continue to be included in the agendas for SB 64 and subsequent sessions of the subsidiary bodies and CMA 8.³⁶ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.³⁷

36. CMA 6 launched the Baku Adaptation Road Map with the aim of advancing progress in line with Article 7, paragraph 1, of the Paris Agreement and supporting the implementation of the elements outlined in paragraph 38 of decision [2/CMA.5](#) and requested the subsidiary bodies to develop modalities for work under the Road Map.³⁸

37. CMA 6 established the Baku high-level dialogue on adaptation, to be convened on the margins of each CMA session by the President of that session and the President of the previous session, with the aim of identifying ways of enhancing the implementation of the United Arab Emirates Framework for Global Climate Resilience, and requested the President of the CMA to report on the outcomes of the dialogue at the relevant session of the CMA.³⁹

38. CMA 7 decided to establish the Belém–Addis vision on adaptation and agreed that work under the vision will be carried out jointly by the subsidiary bodies.⁴⁰

39. CMA 7 decided that the subsidiary bodies will develop and agree in 2026–2027 the terms of reference for the review of the United Arab Emirates Framework for Global Climate Resilience.⁴¹

40. CMA 7 requested the secretariat to prepare a technical paper, for consideration at CMA 8 at the latest, on the targets outlined in paragraphs 9–10 of decision [2/CMA.5](#) and the Belém Adaptation Indicators.⁴²

41. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate, including on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

(b) Report of the Adaptation Committee

42. *Background:* CMA 1 decided that the Adaptation Committee shall serve the Paris Agreement.⁴³ The Adaptation Committee reports annually to the COP through the subsidiary bodies.⁴⁴ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.⁴⁵

43. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI. It will also be invited to elect members of the Adaptation Committee.

(c) Review of the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee

44. *Background:* COP 27 was to review the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee,⁴⁶ and COP 26 invited CMA 4 to participate in the review as it relates to the Paris Agreement.⁴⁷

45. CMA 4 and COP 27 noted that consideration of the review could not be completed at those sessions and would therefore continue at SB 58.⁴⁸ The review was considered at SB 58, 59 and 60.⁴⁹ SB 61 agreed that SB 62 would continue consideration of the matter,⁵⁰ but SB 62 could not complete consideration thereof.⁵¹ SB 63 agreed to defer consideration of this matter to SB 64,⁵² and SB 64 to defer consideration thereof to SB 65.⁵³ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.⁵⁴

46. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

10. **Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage associated with Climate Change Impacts**

47. *Background:* COP 19 and 20 requested the WIM Executive Committee to report annually to the COP through the subsidiary bodies and to make recommendations, as appropriate.⁵⁵ Article 8, paragraph 2, of the Paris Agreement states that the WIM shall be subject to the authority and guidance of the CMA and may be enhanced and strengthened as determined by the CMA.

48. The governing body or bodies shall consider the joint annual report of the WIM Executive Committee and the Santiago network for averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change, submitted through the subsidiary bodies in accordance with paragraph 19 of annex I to decision [12/CMA.4](#), endorsed by decision [11/CP.27](#), and provide guidance thereon.⁵⁶ Accordingly, matters relating to the joint annual report are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.⁵⁷

49. CMA 7 noted that considerations related to the governance of the WIM will continue at CMA 8.⁵⁸

51. *Background:* COP 21 decided that the SCF shall serve the Paris Agreement in line with its functions and responsibilities established under the COP.⁵⁹

52. CMA 7 requested the SCF to report to CMA 8 on progress in implementing its workplan for 2026.^{60, 61}

53. COP 27 adopted the terms of reference for the second review of the functions of the SCF and requested SBI 59 to complete the work on that review with a view to recommending draft decisions on the matter for consideration and adoption at CMA 5 and COP 28.⁶² SBI 59 to 63 could not conclude consideration of the matter and agreed to continue or defer consideration of this matter to a subsequent session.⁶³ SBI 64 agreed to defer consideration of the matter to SBI 65.⁶⁴ Accordingly, matters relating to the second review of the SCF are considered under the SBI.⁶⁵

54. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the SCF report and the recommendations of the SBI on the review of the functions of the SCF and take any action it deems appropriate.

55. *Background:* COP 21 decided that the GCF shall serve the Paris Agreement. It recommended that the CMA provide guidance to the GCF on policies, programme priorities and eligibility criteria related to the Agreement for transmission by the COP. It decided that the guidance to the GCF in relevant decisions of the COP, including those agreed before the adoption of the Agreement, shall apply mutatis mutandis to the Agreement.⁶⁶

56. COP 30 invited Parties to submit views and recommendations on elements of guidance for the GCF and requested the SCF to take into consideration those submissions when preparing its draft guidance for the GCF for consideration at COP 31 and CMA 8, and the Board of the GCF to include in its annual report to the COP information on the steps it has taken to implement the guidance provided in decision [2/CP.30](#).⁶⁷

57. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to provide guidance to the GCF on policies, programme priorities and eligibility criteria related to the Paris Agreement for transmission by the COP.

60. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to provide guidance to the GEF on policies, programme priorities and eligibility criteria related to the Paris Agreement for transmission by the COP.

(d) Report of the Fund for responding to Loss and Damage and guidance to the Fund for responding to Loss and Damage

61. *Background:* The Governing Instrument of the FRLD states that its Board will receive guidance from the CMA and the COP on its policies, programme priorities and eligibility criteria, take appropriate action in response to the guidance received from the CMA and the COP and submit an annual report to the CMA and the COP for their consideration.⁷⁰

62. CMA 6 and COP 29 approved the arrangements between the CMA, the COP and the Board of the FRLD and requested the Board to report on the implementation of the arrangements in its annual report to the CMA and the COP, starting at CMA 7 and COP 30.⁷¹

63. CMA 7 and COP 30 invited Parties to submit views and recommendations on elements of guidance for the FRLD and requested the SCF to take into consideration those submissions when preparing its draft guidance for the FRLD for consideration at CMA 8 and COP 31, and the Board of the FRLD to include in its annual report to the CMA and the COP information on the steps it has taken to implement the guidance provided in decisions [8/CMA.7](#) and [4/CP.30](#) respectively.⁷²

64. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to provide guidance to the FRLD on policies, programme priorities and eligibility criteria taking into consideration the reports of the Board of the FRLD and the SCF.

(e) Matters relating to the Adaptation Fund

65. *Background:* CMA 1 decided that the AF shall serve the Paris Agreement under the guidance of, and be accountable to, the CMA with respect to all matters relating to the Paris Agreement.⁷³

66. CMA 4 requested SBI 58 to continue consideration of matters relating to the membership of the AFB, as needed, in view of the transition of the AF to exclusively serving the Paris Agreement.⁷⁴

67. CMA 6 and CMP 19 also requested SBI 62 to consider the matter of the arrangements for the AF to exclusively serve the Paris Agreement and to make recommendations thereon for consideration at CMA 7 and CMP 20 respectively.⁷⁵

68. SBI 62 agreed that SBI 63 would continue consideration of matters relating to the membership of the AFB, the arrangements for the AF to exclusively serve the Paris Agreement and the initiation of the fifth review of the AF.⁷⁶ SBI 63 could not conclude consideration thereof and agreed to forward the matters to CMA 7 and CMP 20 for consideration.⁷⁷ CMA 7 and CMP 20 requested SBI 64 to continue consideration of the matters.⁷⁸

69. SBI 64 agreed that SBI 65 will continue consideration of these matters on the basis of the work and progress achieved at SBI 64 and the draft texts available on the UNFCCC website.^{79, 80} Accordingly, matters relating to the AF are considered under the SBI.⁸¹

70. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the 2026 report of the AFB, provide guidance to the AFB and take any other action it deems appropriate, including on the basis of the recommendations of the SBI.

71. *Background:* CMA 7 decided to hold deliberations under the Veredas Dialogue on the implementation of Article 2, paragraph 1(c), of the Paris Agreement and its complementarity with Article 9 of the Paris Agreement, building on the Sharm el-Sheikh dialogue on the implementation of Article 2, paragraph 1(c), of the Paris Agreement and its complementarity with Article 9 of the Paris Agreement and taking into account the concerns and safeguards outlined in paragraph 3 of decision [11/CMA.7](#).⁸²

72. CMA 7 requested the Veredas Dialogue co-chairs, to be appointed by the Presidency of the CMA at each of its sessions, to prepare an annual report on deliberations during the respective year under the Veredas Dialogue, including the Xingu Finance Talks, which are to be convened by the Presidency of the CMA as an annual high-level round table, for consideration by the CMA.⁸³

73. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the report referred to in paragraph 72 above and take any action it deems appropriate.

74. *Background:* CMA 7 established a two-year work programme on climate finance, including on Article 9, paragraph 1, of the Paris Agreement in the context of Article 9 of the Paris Agreement as a whole.⁸⁴ CMA 7 decided that the work programme will be facilitated by co-chairs, one from a developed country and one from a developing country, appointed, in consultation with the respective constituencies, by the President of CMA 7.⁸⁵

75. On 12 June 2026, the secretariat received a request⁸⁶ from the President of COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7 to include this matter as a sub-item in the provisional agenda for CMA 8. In accordance with rule 9 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, this sub-item has been included in the provisional agenda for this session.

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12. Matters relating to technology development and transfer

(a) Joint annual report of the Technology Executive Committee and the Climate Technology Centre and Network

77. *Background:* CMA 1 adopted the technology framework under Article 10, paragraph 4, of the Paris Agreement and took note of the recommendation of the Technology Executive Committee and the Climate Technology Centre and Network to prepare and submit their joint annual report to both the CMA and the COP,⁸⁷ through the subsidiary bodies, on their activities to support the implementation of the Paris Agreement.⁸⁸ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.⁸⁹

78. SB 64 recommended a draft decision on this matter for consideration and adoption at CMA 8.⁹⁰

79. The CMA adopted decision [18/CMA.7](#) on the Belém Technology Implementation Programme and requested the Technology Executive and the Climate Technology Centre and Network to include information on actions taken to implement the Programme, as well as on progress of implementation and the outcomes thereof, in their joint annual report to the COP and the CMA.⁹¹

80. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

(b) Host of the Climate Technology Centre

81. *Background:* CMA 7 and COP 30 requested SBI 64 to recommend a draft decision on the new host of the Climate Technology Centre, on the basis of the report on the evaluation of proposals submitted,⁹² for consideration and adoption at CMA 8 and COP 31 respectively.⁹³

82. CMA 7 and COP 30 also requested SBI 64 to recommend elements of a memorandum of understanding between the CMA, the COP and the proposed host.⁹⁴

83. SBI 64 recommended the United Nations Environment Programme as the host and agreed to continue consideration of this matter at SBI 65.⁹⁵ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBI.⁹⁶

89. SBI 64 initiated the stocktake of the progress of the work of the Least Developed Countries Expert Group and its terms of reference and agreed that SBI 65 will continue consideration thereof with a view to recommending draft decisions on the matter for consideration and adoption at CMA 8 and COP 31.¹⁰³ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBI.¹⁰⁴

90. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBI.

15. Report of the forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures

91. *Background:* CMA 1, COP 24 and CMP 14 acknowledged that a single forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures covers the work of the CMA, the COP and the CMP on all matters relating to the impact of the implementation of response measures and affirmed that the forum shall report to the CMA, the COP and the CMP.¹⁰⁵

92. CMA 6, COP 29 and CMP 19 adopted the workplan of the forum and its KCI for 2026–2030.¹⁰⁶

93. CMA 7, COP 30 and CMP 20 requested the KCI to present, at the second regular sessions of the subsidiary bodies each year, its annual report and key findings therefrom to the forum for consideration with a view to the forum making recommendations for consideration by the CMA, the COP and the CMP.¹⁰⁷

94. SB 64 convened a meeting of the forum but could not conclude consideration of this matter and agreed that SB 65 will continue consideration of the matter.¹⁰⁸ CMA 7, COP 30 and CMP 20 decided that the forum will conduct the activities referred to in paragraph 11 of decisions [14/CMA.7](#), [6/CP.30](#) and [2/CMP.20](#) at SB 65.¹⁰⁹ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.¹¹⁰

95. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

96. *Background:* CMA 3 adopted the guidance on cooperative approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 2, of the Paris Agreement; requested the secretariat to prepare annually a compilation and synthesis of the results of the technical expert review under Article 6, paragraph 2, including identification of recurring themes and lessons learned, for consideration by the CMA, including in the context of its review of the guidance; and also requested the secretariat to provide an annual report to the CMA on the activities relating to recording and tracking cooperative approaches, including information on recorded internationally transferred mitigation outcomes, corresponding adjustments and emission balances.¹¹¹

97. CMA 4 further requested the secretariat to expedite the implementation of the capacity-building programme referred to in paragraph 12 of decision [2/CMA.3](#) and to report regularly on the status of its implementation to the SBSTA and the CMA.¹¹²

98. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate.

(b) Report of the Supervisory Body and guidance for the mechanism established by Article 6, paragraph 4, of the Paris Agreement

99. *Background:* CMA 3 designated the Supervisory Body for the mechanism established by Article 6, paragraph 4, of the Paris Agreement to supervise the mechanism¹¹³ and CMA 4 adopted its rules of procedure.¹¹⁴ In accordance with the rules, modalities and procedures for the mechanism,¹¹⁵ the Supervisory Body is to report annually to the CMA.¹¹⁶

100. CMA 4 requested the secretariat to expedite the implementation of the capacity-building programme referred to in paragraph 14 of decision [3/CMA.3](#) and to report regularly on the status of its implementation to the CMA.¹¹⁷

101. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the annual report including the recommendations of the Supervisory Body therein with a view to adopting the recommendations and provide guidance to the Supervisory Body, as appropriate. (c) Work programme under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement

102. *Background:* CMA 3 adopted the work programme under the framework for non-market approaches¹¹⁸ and established the GCNMA to implement the framework and the work programme, to be convened by the SBSTA Chair in conjunction with sessions of the SBSTA and operate in accordance with the procedures applicable to contact groups.¹¹⁹ The progress and outcomes of the work programme will be reported at each session of the CMA, as appropriate, on the basis of information resulting from implementation of the work programme activities.¹²⁰

103. CMA 3 requested SBSTA 64 and 65 to review the work programme with a view to enhancing the effectiveness thereof, taking into account relevant inputs, including the outcomes of the global stocktake, and to make recommendations thereon for consideration and adoption at no later than CMA 8.¹²¹

104. CMA 7 also requested SBSTA 64 to consider ways to implement additional functionalities in the NMA Platform¹²² that would enable Parties to record projects identified under the Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme through their national focal points for Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement, and enable interconnection between the NMA Platform and other platforms, including national

platforms for Parties that request it, with a view to the SBSTA recommending a draft decision on this matter for consideration and adoption at CMA 8.¹²³

105. CMA 7 invited Parties to share their experience, best practices, lessons learned and case studies pertaining to NMAs with a view to improving implementation thereof, including by making use of the NMA Platform's online discussion forum¹²⁴ and the in-session workshops and spin-off groups held in conjunction with the meetings of the GCNMA.¹²⁵

106. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the progress and outcomes report of the GCNMA and the recommendations of the SBSTA on the review of the work programme undertaken at SBSTA 64 and 65 and take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA.

107. *Background:* The Paris Agreement Implementation and Compliance Committee reports annually to the CMA.¹²⁶ CMA 7 took note of the 2025 report, including the measures taken by the secretariat to address the concerns raised by the Committee in its 2024 report¹²⁷ with regard to the NDC registry, and concluded consideration of the 2024 report.¹²⁸

108. *Action:* The CMA will be invited to consider the 2026 report of the Committee and take any action it deems appropriate.

109. *Background:* CMA 7 requested SBI 64 to consider the sufficiency and stability of funding for the operation and maintenance of the infrastructure under Article 6, paragraph 2, of the Paris Agreement, technical expert review under Article 6, paragraph 2, and capacity-building activities in respect of Article 6, paragraph 2, with a view to recommending a draft decision on the matter for consideration and adoption at CMA 8.¹²⁹

110. CMA 7 also requested the secretariat to update the technical paper on options for funding the activities related to the infrastructure and technical expert review under Article 6, paragraph 2,¹³⁰ to serve as input to the consideration referred to in paragraph 109 above.¹³¹

111. To facilitate deliberations on the matters referred to in paragraph 109 above, SBI 64 requested its Chair to prepare an informal document,¹³² including textual proposals, informed
