

Background: In accordance with rule 10 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, the secretariat, in agreement with the President of CMP 19, Mukhtar Babayev (Azerbaijan), drafted the provisional agenda for CMP 20 after consultations with the Bureau of the governing bodies and taking into account the views of Parties.
- 3. Action: The CMP will be invited to adopt its agenda.

- 4. *Background*: If any member of the Bureau represents a State that is not a Party to the Kyoto Protocol, consultations will be required to identify a nominee representing a Party to the Kyoto Protocol to replace such a member in accordance with Article 13, paragraph 3, of the Kyoto Protocol. Parties are invited to recall decision <u>3/CP.23</u> and actively consider nominating women.
- 5. Action: The CMP will be invited, as necessary, to elect additional members of the Bureau.

- 11. *Action*: The CMP will be invited to take note of the progress in the work of the SBSTA and consider the recommended draft decisions and conclusions for adoption.

- 14. *Background*: SBI 61 considered the note by the secretariat on the status of submission and review of national communications and biennial reports⁶ and took note of the information therein.⁷
- 15. At the time of preparation of this document, the secretariat has not received any eighth national communications from Parties included in Annex I additional to those covered in the above-mentioned status report.

16. *Action*: The CMP will be invited to note the information referred to in paragraph 15 above.

5. Matters relating to the clean development mechanism

- 17. *Background*: The CDM Executive Board submits an annual report on its activities to the CMP.⁸
- 18. CMP 18 requested the secretariat to prepare technical papers on the necessary operations of the CDM registry and the necessary level of resources for the functioning and operation of the processes and institutions under the CDM for consideration at SBSTA 60.9 SBSTA 60 requested the secretariat to prepare a technical paper on the further breakdown of the necessary level of resources for the activities, processes and institutions that need to continue under the CDM for consideration at SBSTA 61.¹⁰
- 19. SBSTA 61 could not conclude consideration of this matter.¹¹ SBSTA 62 considered the matter and agreed to forward it to CMP 20 for consideration on the basis of the draft decision text¹² prepared by the co-facilitators for the relevant agenda item at SBSTA 62.¹³
- 20. SBSTA 62 requested the secretariat to provide an update at SBSTA 63 on the status of funds available in the trust fund for the clean development mechanism and an assessment of the costs and available resources associated with the different end dates included in the draft decision text referred to in paragraph 19 above.¹⁴
- 21. CMP 19 took note of the progress of the CDM Executive Board in addressing the issue of non-responsive designated national authorities of Parties to the Kyoto Protocol and requested the Board to continue following up with non-responsive designated national authorities as per the approach established by the Board, as necessary.¹⁵
- 22. Action: The CMP will be invited to consider the annual report of the CDM Executive Board for 2025, continue consideration of the functioning and operation of the processes and institutions under the CDM and provide guidance relating to the CDM, as appropriate. The CMP will also be invited to elect members and alternate members of the CDM Executive Board.

6. Matters relating to the Adaptation Fund

- 23. *Background*: The AFB submits an annual report on its activities to the CMP. ¹⁶ CMP 19 encouraged the AFB to complete, as a matter of priority, its work related to implementing the mandates in decisions <u>1/CMP.14</u> and <u>13/CMA.1</u> and to report thereon to CMP 20 and CMA 7 in its annual report. ¹⁷
- 24. CMP 19 requested SBI 62 to consider the matter of the arrangements for the Adaptation Fund to exclusively serve the Paris Agreement and to make recommendations on this matter for consideration at CMP 20.18
- 25. CMP 16 also requested the SBI to continue consideration of matters relating to the membership of the AFB and forward a recommendation for consideration at CMP 17.¹⁹ CMA 4 reiterated that Parties to the Paris Agreement are eligible for membership of the AFB and requested SBI 58 to continue consideration of related matters, as needed, in view of the Adaptation Fund's transition to exclusively serving the Paris Agreement.²⁰ SBI 58, 59 and 61 deferred consideration²¹ and SBI 60 could not conclude consideration thereof.²²
- 26. SBI 62 continued consideration of matters relating to the membership of the AFB, and additionally considered the matter of the arrangements for the Adaptation Fund to exclusively serve the Paris Agreement, as well as the initiation of the fifth review of the Adaptation Fund,²³ and agreed that SBI 63 will continue consideration of these matters on the basis of the work conducted at SBI 62.^{24, 25} Accordingly, these matters are considered under the SBI.²⁶
- 27. *Action*: The CMP will be invited to consider the annual report of the AFB for 2025, provide guidance to the AFB and take any action it deems appropriate. It will also be invited to elect members and alternate members of the AFB. The CMP will further be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBI.

7. Matters relating to capacity-building

- 28. *Background*: CMP 16 requested SBI 62 to develop terms of reference for the fifth comprehensive review of the implementation of the framework for capacity-building in developing countries under the Kyoto Protocol for consideration and adoption at CMP 20.²⁷
- 29. SBI 62 agreed that SBI 63 will continue consideration of this matter with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at CMP 20.²⁸ Matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBI.²⁹

30. *Action*: The CMP will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBI.

8. Report of the forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures

- 31. *Background*: CMP 14, COP 24 and CMA 1 acknowledged that a single forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures covers the work of the CMP, the COP and the CMA on all matters relating to the impact of the implementation of response measures and affirmed that the forum shall report to the CMP, the COP and the CMA.³⁰
- 32. CMA 1 decided that the forum shall provide recommendations for consideration by the subsidiary bodies with a view to them recommending actions for consideration and adoption by the CMP, the COP and the CMA.³¹
- 33. CMP 19, COP 29 and CMA 6 adopted the workplan of the forum and its Katowice Committee of Experts on the Impacts of the Implementation of Response Measures for 2026–2030.³²
- 34. SB 62 convened a meeting of the forum and agreed that SB 63 will continue work in the forum with a view to recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption at CMP 20, COP 30 and CMA 7.³³ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.³⁴
- 35. *Action*: The CMP will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

9. Report of the Compliance Committee

- 36. *Background*: The Compliance Committee reports annually on its activities to the CMP.³⁵
- 37. *Action*: The CMP will be invited to consider the annual report of the Compliance Committee for 2025 and take any action it deems appropriate. The CMP will also be invited to elect members and alternate members of the Compliance Committee to serve in the enforcement and facilitative branches of the Committee respectively.³⁶

10. Report on the high-level ministerial round table on increased ambition of Kyoto Protocol commitments

- 38. *Background*: CMP 8 adopted the Doha Amendment to the Kyoto Protocol, establishing a second commitment period of the Kyoto Protocol.³⁷ A high-level ministerial round table was held on 5 June 2014, at which information was considered on the intention of Parties included in Annex I with commitments in the second commitment period to increase the ambition of their mitigation commitments. A report on the round table was prepared for consideration at CMP 10.³⁸
- 39. CMP 10 to 19 could not conclude consideration of this matter.³⁹ In accordance with rules 10(c) and 16 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, this item has been included in the provisional agenda for this session.
- 40. *Action*: The CMP will be invited to continue consideration of this matter and take any action it deems appropriate.

11. Administrative, financial and institutional matters

- 41. Background: Matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBI.⁴⁰
- 42. *Action:* The CMP will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBI.

12. Implementation of Article 9, paragraph 1, of the Paris Agreement

- 43. *Background*: On 3 June 2025 the secretariat received a request⁴¹ from the Plurinational State of Bolivia on behalf of the Like-minded Developing Countries to include this matter in the provisional agenda for CMP 20. In accordance with rule 12 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, this item has been included in the provisional agenda for this session.
- 44. Action: The CMP will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate.

13. Promoting international cooperation and addressing the concerns with climate change related trade-restrictive unilateral measures

- 45. *Background*: On 3 June 2025 the secretariat received a request⁴² from the Plurinational State of Bolivia on behalf of the Like-minded Developing Countries to include this matter in the provisional agenda for CMP 20. In accordance with rule 12 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, this item has been included in the provisional agenda for this session.
- 46. Action: The CMP will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate.
