## **Admisión de observadores: organizaciones que solicitan su admisión como observadores\***

### **Nota de la secretaría**

1. La admisión de organizaciones intergubernamentales y de organizaciones no gubernamentales (ONG) en calidad de observadores en los períodos de sesiones de la Conferencia de las Partes (CP) se rige por el artículo 7, párrafo 6, de la Convención, en el que, entre otras cosas, se dispone que:

“Todo otro organismo u órgano, sea nacional o internacional, gubernamental o no gubernamental, competente en los asuntos abarcados por la Convención y que haya informado a la secretaría de su deseo de estar representado en un período de sesiones de la Conferencia de las Partes como observador, podrá ser admitido en esa calidad, a menos que se oponga un tercio de las Partes presentes.”

2. La CP, en su primer período de sesiones, convino<sup>1</sup> en que la secretaría invitaría a los futuros períodos de sesiones de la CP y a los períodos de sesiones de sus órganos subsidiarios a todas las organizaciones intergubernamentales y ONG admitidas en ese período de sesiones y en períodos de sesiones futuros a menos que, con arreglo a la Convención y al proyecto de reglamento que se aplicase, se formulara una objeción respecto de alguna organización<sup>2</sup>. Por consiguiente, la secretaría ha notificado a todas las organizaciones que fueron admitidas en los períodos de sesiones precedentes de la CP (con excepción de las que solo lo fueron por un único período de sesiones) la fecha y el lugar de celebración de la CP 26, de conformidad con el artículo 8 del proyecto de reglamento que se aplica y sin perjuicio de las decisiones que pueda adoptar la CP. El procedimiento de admisión se aplicará solo a los nuevos solicitantes.

3. La secretaría ha elaborado, para que la CP la examine, una lista de las nuevas organizaciones intergubernamentales y ONG que han manifestado el deseo de estar representadas en los períodos de sesiones de la CP y sus órganos subsidiarios como observadoras y que cumplen los requisitos establecidos en: 1) la Convención; 2) el proyecto de reglamento que se aplica; y 3) la práctica establecida (véase el anexo).

4. Al elaborar la lista, la secretaría ha tenido debidamente en cuenta las disposiciones del artículo 7, párrafo 6, de la Convención, los artículos 7 y 8 del proyecto de reglamento que

se aplica y la práctica establecida, de la que el Órgano Subsidiario de Ejecución tomó nota<sup>3</sup>, conforme a los cuales las organizaciones intergubernamentales y las ONG deben demostrar su competencia en los asuntos abarcados por la Convención y confirmar su personalidad jurídica independiente y su condición de entidad sin fines de lucro y/o exenta de impuestos en un Estado Miembro de las Naciones Unidas, de uno de sus organismos especializados o del Organismo Internacional de Energía Atómica, o en un Estado parte en el Estatuto de la Corte Internacional de Justicia.

5. Los miembros de la Mesa recibieron la lista de nuevos solicitantes para su examen y convinieron en recomendar a la CP que se admitiera a las organizaciones en ella incluidas<sup>4</sup>. Esas organizaciones han sido informadas de su admisión provisional, quedando entendido que solo la CP está investida de autoridad para la admisión definitiva de observadores. Se invita a la CP a que, en la primera sesión de su 26º período de sesiones, conceda la condición de observadoras a las organizaciones intergubernamentales y las ONG que figuran en el anexo.

6. En relación con los artículos 6 y 7 del proyecto de reglamento que se aplica, se sigue un solo procedimiento para la admisión de organizaciones observadoras a los períodos de sesiones de la CP, de la Conferencia de las Partes en calidad de reunión de las Partes en el Protocolo de Kyoto<sup>5</sup> y de la Conferencia de las Partes en calidad de reunión de las Partes en el Acuerdo de París<sup>6</sup>, y las decisiones sobre la admisión de organizaciones observadoras son adoptadas por la CP.
