Supplementary provisional agenda

I. Introduction

1. On 6 November 2024 the secretariat received a request from China on behalf of Brazil, South Africa, India and China (BASIC countries) to include an item in the provisional agenda for the twenty-ninth session of the Conference of the Parties (COP).¹
2. In accordance with rule 12 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, and in agreement with the President of COP 28, this matter has been included in the supplementary provisional agenda as item 19.

II. Supplementary provisional agenda

3. The supplementary provisional agenda for COP 29, proposed after consultation with the President of COP 28, is as follows:

 - (a) Election of the President of the Conference of the Parties at its twenty-ninth session;

 - (h) Adoption of the report on credentials.
3. Reports of the subsidiary bodies:
 - (a) Report of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice;
 - (b) Report of the Subsidiary Body for Implementation.
 4. Reporting from and review of Parties included in Annex I to the Convention.
 5. Reporting from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention.
 6. Matters relating to adaptation:
 - (a) Report of the Adaptation Committee;
 - (b) Review of the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee.
 7. Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage associated with Climate Change Impacts and joint annual report of its Executive Committee and the Santiago network for averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change.²
