II. Proposed organization of the session: overview

(a) Scenario for the launch of work in all bodies

1. On 10 November, the President of COP 29 will convene the first plenary meeting of COP 30 and propose the election of the President of COP 30, who will also serve as the President of CMP 20 and CMA 7. The COP will then take up the organizational and substantive items on its agenda, including referring the consideration of any matter to the subsidiary bodies, as appropriate. The first plenary meeting of the COP will then be adjourned. The first plenary meetings of CMP 20 and CMA 7 will follow, with each body taking up the organizational and substantive issues on its agenda, including referring the consideration of any matter to the subsidiary bodies, as appropriate. The first plenary meetings of CMP 20 and CMA 7 will then be adjourned.
2. SBSTA 63 and SBI 63 will take place in conjunction with COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7.
3. A joint plenary of all five bodies will be convened on 10 November, upon conclusion of the plenaries of the subsidiary bodies, to hear concise statements from groups of Parties and observer organizations.
4. Meetings at the conference will be organized in line with the recommendations of the SBI³ so as to ensure the observance of clear and effective working practices agreed to by all Parties.
5. The principles of openness, transparency and inclusiveness will guide the organization of work leading up to and during the conference. These principles will be demonstrated through the use of informal plenary meetings, the enhanced availability of electronic documentation, the timely announcement of meetings and the broadcasting of meeting information on information screens at the venue, the UNFCCC website, the virtual conference platform and other digital and social media. Information on the organization of the session will be made available on the session web page.⁴

(b) High-level segment

6. The high-level segment will take place in the second week of the conference, from 17 to 19 November, at the ministerial level (see paras. 119–124 below).

(c) Mandated and other events

7. A high-level event on global climate action, at which the high-level champions will report on their work, was mandated by the COP for this session.⁵
8. Many other events, including those convened by the COP 30 Presidency, will take place at the conference. Further information will be provided on the UNFCCC website.

III. Annotations to the provisional agenda

1. Opening of the session

9. COP 30 will be opened by the President of COP 29, Mukhtar Babayev (Azerbaijan).

2. Organizational matters

(a) Election of the President of the Conference of the Parties at its thirtieth session

10. *Background:* In accordance with the principle of rotation among the United Nations regional groups, the President of COP 30 is to be elected from the Latin American and Caribbean States. The President of COP 29 will call for the election of André Aranha Corrêa do Lago (Brazil) as the President of COP 30. He will also serve as the President of CMP 20 and CMA 7.

11. *Action:* The COP will be invited to elect André Aranha Corrêa do Lago by acclamation to serve as the President of COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7.

(b) Adoption of the rules of procedure

12. *Background:* At COP 29, Parties decided to continue to apply the draft rules of procedure contained in document [FCCC/CP/1996/2](#), with the exception of rule 42, and agreed to continue consideration of this matter at COP 30.⁶

13. *Action:* The COP may wish to decide to continue applying the draft rules of procedure and invite the President of COP 30 to undertake consultations with a view to achieving adoption of the rules of procedure.

16. *Background:* At the request of the President of COP 29, consultations on nominations to the Bureau of the governing bodies were initiated at SB 62 with the Chairs and coordinators of the regional groups and constituencies, who were informed that the deadline for the submission of nominations is 15 November 2025. Parties are invited to recall decision [3/CP.23](#) and actively consider nominating women.

18. *Background:* The COP will have before it a note containing the list of organizations seeking admission as observers, as well as admitted organizations that underwent a name change between July 2024 and May 2025, following review and consideration by the Bureau of the governing bodies.⁷

Guided by the principles of openness, transparency and inclusiveness, the COP will also be invited to organize its work in a manner that ensures that the mandates for the session are addressed while being flexible enough to respond to changing circumstances and new developments in the negotiations.

(g) Dates and venues of future sessions

22. *Background:* In keeping with the principle of rotation among the United Nations regional groups, the host of COP 31 is to come from the Western European and other States and the host of COP 32 from the African States.

23. SBI 62 recommended dates for the sessional periods in 2030–2031.⁸

24. *Action:* The COP will be invited to decide on the host country for COP 31 and the dates for the sessional periods in 2030–2031 and to take any further action it deems appropriate.

(h) Adoption of the report on credentials

25. *Background:* According to rule 19 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, the credentials of representatives of Parties, as well as the names of alternate representatives and advisers, shall be submitted to the secretariat not later than 24 hours after the opening of the session. Any later change in the composition of delegations shall also be submitted to the secretariat. The credentials shall be issued by the Head of State or Government, by the Minister of Foreign Affairs or, in the case of a regional economic integration organization, by the competent authority of that organization. The Bureau will examine the credentials and submit its report on credentials for adoption by the COP (see rule 20 of the draft rules of procedure being applied). Representatives shall be entitled to participate provisionally in the session, pending a decision by the COP to accept their credentials (see rule 21 of the draft rules of procedure being applied). The COP will have before it for adoption the report on credentials, to be submitted by the Bureau.

26. *Action:* The COP will be invited to adopt the report on the credentials of the representatives of Parties attending this session. Representatives may participate provisionally pending this action.

6. Matters relating to adaptation

(a) Report of the Adaptation Committee

35. *Background:* The Adaptation Committee reports annually to the COP through the subsidiary bodies.¹² Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.¹³

36. *Action:* The COP will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI. It will also be invited to elect members of the Adaptation Committee.

(b) Review of the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee

37. *Background:* COP 27 was to review the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee,¹⁴ and COP 26 invited CMA 4 to participate in the review as it relates to the Paris Agreement.¹⁵

38. COP 27 and CMA 4 noted that consideration of the review could not be completed at those sessions and would therefore continue at SB 58.¹⁶ The review was considered at SB 58, 59 and 60.¹⁷ SB 61 agreed that SB 62 would continue consideration of the matter,¹⁸ but SB 62 could not complete consideration thereof.¹⁹ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.²⁰

39. *Action:* The COP will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

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(c) National adaptation plans

40. *Background:* COP 26 requested SBI 60 to initiate the assessment of progress in the process to formulate and implement national adaptation plans referred to in paragraph 19 of decision [8/CP.24](#) and decided on the actions and steps necessary for the SBI to initiate the assessment.²¹

41. SBI 60 initiated the assessment referred to in paragraph 40 above and decided that SBI 61 would continue consideration thereof.²² SBI 61 forwarded the matter to COP 29 for consideration.²³ COP 29 requested SBI 62 to continue consideration of the matter with a view to recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption at COP 30.²⁴ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBI.²⁵

7. Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage associated with Climate Change Impacts

43. *Background:* COP 19 and 20 requested the WIM Executive Committee to report annually to the COP through the subsidiary bodies and to make recommendations, as appropriate.²⁶ Article 8, paragraph 2, of the Paris Agreement states that the WIM shall be subject to the authority and guidance of the CMA and may be enhanced and strengthened as determined by the CMA.

44. The governing body or bodies shall consider the joint annual report of the Santiago network for averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change and the WIM Executive Committee, submitted through the subsidiary bodies in accordance with paragraph 19 of annex I to decision [12/CMA.4](#), endorsed by decision [11/CP.27](#), and other future decisions of the governing body or bodies, and provide guidance thereon.²⁷ Accordingly, matters relating to the joint annual report of the Santiago network and the WIM Executive Committee are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.²⁸

45. SB 62 recommended a draft decision on the 2024 joint annual report of the Santiago network and the WIM Executive Committee for consideration and adoption by the appropriate body or bodies at the session(s) in November 2025.²⁹

46. COP 24 to 28 were invited to consider the matter of COP authority over and guidance to the WIM, including its Executive Committee.³⁰ COP 29 noted that considerations related to WIM governance will continue at COP 30.³¹

47. CMA 2 recommended that a review of the WIM be held in 2024 and every five years thereafter, with the subsidiary bodies to develop the terms of reference for each review at their sessions immediately before they undertake the review and to undertake future reviews and forward the outputs of the reviews to the governing body or bodies.³² SB 60 finalized the terms of reference for the 2024 review of the WIM.³³ SB 61 could not conclude consideration of the 2024 review.³⁴ CMA 6 requested SB 62 to continue consideration thereof.³⁵ SB 62 agreed that SB 63 will continue consideration of the matter with a view to recommending a draft decision or decisions thereon for consideration and adoption by the appropriate body or bodies at the session(s) in November 2025.³⁶ Accordingly, matters relating to the review of the WIM are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.³⁷

48. *Action:* The COP will be invited to consider the matter of its authority over and guidance to the WIM, including its Executive Committee, and to take any action it deems appropriate, including on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

8. Matters relating to finance

(a) Long-term climate finance

49. *Background:* COP 26 decided that continued discussions on long-term climate finance will conclude in 2027.³⁸

50. The sixth biennial high-level ministerial dialogue on climate finance, on the progress and fulfilment of the goal of mobilizing jointly USD 100 billion per year, was convened at COP 29. The Presidency of COP 29 prepared a summary of the deliberations at the dialogue.³⁹

51. *Action:* The COP will be invited to continue its discussions on long-term climate finance. It will also be invited to consider the summary of the deliberations at the dialogue and take any action it deems appropriate.

(b) Matters relating to the Standing Committee on Finance

52. *Background:* COP 17 decided that the SCF shall report at each ordinary session of the COP and make recommendations for consideration by the COP on all aspects of its work.⁴⁰

53. COP 29 requested the SCF to report to COP 30 on progress in implementing its workplan for 2025.⁴¹

54. COP 27 adopted the terms of reference for the second review of the functions of the SCF and requested SBI 59 to complete the work on that review with a view to recommending draft decisions on the matter for consideration and adoption at COP 28 and CMA 5.⁴² SBI 59 and 61 agreed on SBI 61 and 63 respectively continuing consideration of the matter.⁴³ Accordingly, matters relating to the second review of the SCF are considered under the SBI.⁴⁴

(e) Report of the Fund for responding to Loss and Damage and guidance to the Fund for responding to Loss and Damage

64. *Background:* COP 28 and CMA 5 decided to designate the FRLD as an entity entrusted with the operation of the Financial Mechanism of the Convention, also serving the Paris Agreement, which will be accountable to and function under the guidance of the COP and the CMA.⁵¹

65. The Governing Instrument of the FRLD states that its Board will receive guidance from the COP and the CMA on its policies, programme priorities and eligibility criteria, take appropriate action in response to the guidance received from the COP and the CMA and submit annual reports to the COP and the CMA for their consideration.⁵²

66. COP 29 and CMA 6 invited Parties to submit views and recommendations on elements of guidance for the FRLD and requested the SCF to take into consideration those submissions when preparing its draft guidance for the FRLD for consideration at COP 30 and CMA 7, and the Board of the FRLD to include in its annual report to the COP and the CMA information on the steps it has taken to implement the guidance provided.⁵³

67. COP 29 and CMA 6 approved the arrangements between the COP, the CMA and the Board of the FRLD, and requested the Board to report on the implementation of the arrangements in its annual reports to the COP and the CMA, starting at COP 30 and CMA 7.⁵⁴

68. *Action:* The COP will be invited to consider the annual report of the Board of the FRLD and take any action it deems appropriate.

73. *Background:* COP 4 decided that the Financial Mechanism will be reviewed every four years in accordance with Article 11, paragraph 4, of the Convention.⁵⁸ COP 17 decided that the SCF shall assist the COP in exercising its functions with respect to the Financial Mechanism by, inter alia, providing expert input, including through independent reviews and assessments, to the preparation and conduct of the periodic reviews of the Financial Mechanism by the COP.⁵⁹

74. COP 21 decided to assess the implementation of the Capacity-building Initiative for Transparency in the context of the seventh review of the Financial Mechanism.⁶⁰

75. COP 23 decided that the seventh review of the Financial Mechanism would be initiated at COP 26.⁶¹ COP 26 to 29 could not conclude consideration of the guidelines for the seventh review of the Financial Mechanism.⁶² In accordance with rules 10(c) and 16 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, this sub-item has been included in the provisional agenda for this session.

76. *Action:* The COP will be invited to agree on the guidelines for the seventh review of the Financial Mechanism taking into account the guidelines contained in the annex to decision [12/CP.22](#).

9. Matters relating to technology development and transfer

(a) Joint annual report of the Technology Executive Committee and the Climate Technology Centre and Network

77. *Background:* COP 20 decided that the TEC and the CTCN shall continue to prepare a joint annual report to the COP, through the subsidiary bodies, on their respective activities and the performance of their respective functions.⁶³ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.⁶⁴

78. *Action:* The COP will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI. It will also be invited to elect members of the TEC and the Advisory Board of the CTCN.

(b) Linkages between the Technology Mechanism and the Financial Mechanism

79. *Background:* COP 28 invited Parties, the UNFCCC constituted bodies, the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism and other relevant stakeholders to submit views on maintaining and enhancing collaboration and cooperation between the Technology Mechanism and the Financial Mechanism, including on linkages between the Mechanisms, taking into account guiding questions; requested the secretariat to prepare a synthesis report on those submissions; and also requested the TEC and the CTCN, in consultation with the SBI Chair, to organize an in-session workshop to be held at SBI 60 to take stock of the linkages between the Technology Mechanism and the Financial Mechanism taking into account the views expressed in the submissions.⁶⁵

80. COP 28 requested SBI 60 to initiate discussion on the submissions, synthesis report and workshop referred to in paragraph 79 above with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 29; and also requested the TEC, in consultation with the CTCN, to prepare a summary report on the workshop for consideration at SBI 61.⁶⁶ SBI 61 and 62 respectively agreed to continue consideration of this matter at the subsequent session.⁶⁷ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBI.⁶⁸

81. *Action:* The COP will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBI.

(c) Review of the functions of the Climate Technology Centre

82. *Background:* COP 29 decided that COP 30 is to conduct a review of the functions of the Climate Technology Centre and decide whether to extend the term of the Climate Technology Centre, and requested SBI 62 to initiate the review with a view to recommending a draft decision on this matter for consideration and adoption at COP 30.⁶⁹

83. SBI 62 agreed that SBI 63 will continue consideration of this matter on the basis of the draft text prepared at SBI 62 by the co-facilitators for the relevant agenda sub-item available on the UNFCCC website⁷⁰ and consider criteria relating to selecting a host for the Climate Technology Centre with a view to recommending draft decisions thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 30 and CMA 7.⁷¹ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBI.⁷²

84. *Action:* The COP will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBI.

COP 29 requested SBI 62 to initiate the fifth comprehensive review of the implementation of the framework for capacity-building in developing countries under the Convention in accordance with the terms of reference contained in the annex to decision [11/CP.29](#).⁷⁴ SBI 62 agreed that SBI 63 will continue consideration of this matter with a view to recommending a draft decision thereon for consideration and adoption at COP 30.⁷⁵ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBI.⁷⁶

87. COP 29 decided to extend the PCCB for five years and requested the PCCB, at its 9th meeting, to develop a workplan for the period of its extension, on the basis of the priority areas and activities set out in the annex to decision [12/CP.29](#), for consideration at COP 30.⁷⁷ COP 29 also requested the secretariat, under the guidance of the PCCB, to organize the 7th Capacity-building Hub, to be held at the United Nations Climate Change Conference in November 2025.⁷⁸

12. Report of the forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures

92. *Background:* COP 24, CMP 14 and CMA 1 acknowledged that a single forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures covers the work of the COP, the CMP and the CMA on all matters relating to the impact of the implementation of response measures and affirmed that the forum shall report to the COP, the CMP and the CMA.⁸²

93. CMA 1 decided that the forum shall provide recommendations for consideration by the subsidiary bodies with a view to them recommending actions for consideration and adoption by the COP, the CMP and the CMA.⁸³

94. COP 29, CMP 19 and CMA 6 adopted the workplan of the forum and its Katowice Committee of Experts on the Impacts of the Implementation of Response Measures for 2026–2030.⁸⁴

95. SB 62 convened a meeting of the forum and agreed that SB 63 will continue work in the forum with a view to recommending a draft decision for consideration and adoption at COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7.⁸⁵ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.⁸⁶

96. *Action:* The COP will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

In accordance with rule 12 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, this item has been included in the provisional agenda for this session.

118. *Action:* The COP will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate.

20. High-level segment

119. At the high-level segment, which will take place from 17 to 19 November, national statements and statements on behalf of groups of Parties will be heard in the joint plenary meetings of the governing bodies, followed by statements from representatives of intergovernmental and observer organizations.

(a) Statements by Parties

120. In keeping with recent practice, there will be one list of speakers for the high-level segment. Each Party, including Parties to the Convention, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement, will speak only once. Parties may wish to take note that, as per SBI guidance urging Parties and presiding officers to conclude conferences in a timely manner, statements must not exceed three minutes.

121. Statements on behalf of groups, where other members of the group do not speak, are strongly encouraged and will be accorded additional time. Time limits will be strictly enforced. Following United Nations practice, a mechanism will be in place to signal to speakers when the time limit has been exceeded. Longer versions of the statements can be posted on the UNFCCC website.

122. Information on registration for the list of speakers for the high-level segment has been communicated to Parties. Additional information will be made available to Parties and on the UNFCCC website.

123. To have the full text of their official statement posted on the UNFCCC website, Parties should email a copy, in advance to the delivery of their statement, to cophls@unfccc.int.

(b) Statements by observer organizations

124. Representatives of intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations will be invited to deliver statements during the high-level segment after group and Party statements. The time limit of two minutes per statement will be strictly enforced. The full text of official statements will be posted on the UNFCCC website.

21. Other matters

125. Any other matters for the attention of the COP will be taken up under this agenda item.

22. Conclusion of the session

126. *Background:* A draft report on the session will be prepared for consideration and adoption by the COP at the end of the session.
