20. Closure of and report on the session.

II. Proposed organization of the session: overview

1. On 9 November, the President of COP 30 will convene the first plenary meeting of COP 31 and propose the election of the President of COP 31, who will also serve as the President of CMP 21 and CMA 8. The COP 31 President Designate has assigned a representative of Australia as President of Negotiations and delegated to that representative the functions of leading the negotiations for the duration of the Conference in accordance with the Türkiye–Australia partnership modalities.³

2. The President of COP 31 and the President of Negotiations will conduct work during the Conference, including plenary meetings, in accordance with the partnership modalities referred to in paragraph 1 above.

(a) Scenario for the launch of work in all bodies

3. The President of COP 31 will then convene the first plenary meetings of CMP 21 and CMA 8 and take up the organizational and substantive items on their respective agenda, starting with items that appear on the agenda of the COP only, followed by those that appear on the agendas of the CMP and then the CMA only, followed by those that appear across two or more of those agendas, including referring the consideration of any matter to the subsidiary bodies, as appropriate. The first plenary meetings of COP 31, CMP 21 and CMA 8 will then be adjourned.

4. SBSTA 65 and SBI 65 will take place in conjunction with COP 31, CMP 21 and CMA 8.

5. A joint plenary of all five bodies will be convened on 9 November, upon conclusion of the plenaries of the subsidiary bodies, to hear concise opening statements from groups of Parties and observer organizations. Time limits will be strictly enforced.

6. Meetings at the Conference will be organized in line with the recommendations of the SBI⁴ so as to ensure the observance of clear and effective working practices agreed to by all Parties.

7. The principles of openness, transparency and inclusiveness will guide the organization of work leading up to and during the Conference. These principles will be demonstrated through the use of informal plenary meetings, the enhanced availability of electronic documentation, the timely announcement of meetings and the broadcasting of meeting information on information screens at the venue, the UNFCCC website, the virtual conference platform and other digital and social media. Information on the organization of the session will be made available on the session web page.⁵

(b) High-level segment

8. The Government of Türkiye extended an invitation to Heads of State and Government to attend the Leaders Summit, entitled “Towards a Sustainable, Resilient and Equitable Future,” from 11 to 12 November. During the Summit, which will form the first part of the high-level segment, Heads of State and Government will be able to deliver national statements. The high-level segment will be resumed during the second week of the Conference (see paras. 116–123 below).

(c) Mandated and other events

10. The following mandated high-level events will be convened at or in conjunction with this session:

- (a) Seventh biennial high-level ministerial dialogue on climate finance;⁶
- (b) High-level event on global climate action;⁷
- (c) Annual ministerial high-level round table on the impacts of the implementation of response measures;⁸
- (d) High-level event on how Parties are engaging all women and girls, and men and boys as agents of change for socially just transitions.⁹

11. Many other events, including those convened by the COP 31 Presidency, will take place at the Conference. Further information will be provided on the UNFCCC website.

III. Annotations to the provisional agenda

1. Opening of the session

12. COP 31 will be opened by the President of COP 30, André Aranha Corrêa do Lago (Brazil).

2. Organizational matters

(a) Election of the President of the Conference of the Parties at its thirty-first session

13. *Background:* In accordance with the principle of rotation among the United Nations regional groups, the President of COP 31 is to be elected from the Western European and other States. The President of COP 30 will call for the election of Murat Kurum (Türkiye) as the President of COP 31 to serve in accordance with the draft rules of procedure being applied and the partnership modalities referred to in paragraph 1 above. He will also serve as the President of CMP 21 and CMA 8.¹⁰

14. *Action:* The COP will be invited to elect Murat Kurum by acclamation to serve as the President of COP 31, CMP 21 and CMA 8.

(b) Adoption of the rules of procedure

15. *Background:* At COP 30, Parties decided to continue to apply the draft rules of procedure contained in document [FCCC/CP/1996/2](#), with the exception of rule 42, and agreed to continue consideration of this matter at COP 31.¹¹

16. *Action:* The COP may wish to decide to continue applying the draft rules of procedure and invite the President of COP 31 to undertake consultations with a view to achieving adoption of the rules of procedure.

19. *Background:* At the request of the President of COP 30, consultations on nominations to the Bureau of the governing bodies were initiated at SB 64 with the Chairs and coordinators of the regional groups and constituencies, who were informed that the deadline for the submission of nominations is 14 November 2026. Parties are invited to recall, inter alia, decisions [23/CP.18](#), [3/CP.23](#) and [7/CP.29](#) and actively consider nominating women.

20. *Action:* The COP will be invited to elect the members of the Bureau.

21. *Background:* The COP will have before it a note containing the list of organizations seeking admission as observers, as well as admitted organizations that underwent a name change between June 2025 and May 2026, following review and consideration by the Bureau of the governing bodies.¹²

22. *Action:* The COP will be invited to consider the list, admit the organizations as observers and take note of the changed names of admitted organizations.

(f) Organization of work, including for the sessions of the subsidiary bodies

23. *Action:* The COP will be invited to agree on the organization of work for the session and the referral of the consideration of any matter to the subsidiary bodies, as appropriate.

24. A representative of Australia (Chris Bowen) has been assigned as President of Negotiations for the duration of the Conference to serve in accordance with the partnership modalities referred to in paragraph 1 above.

25. Guided by the principles of openness, transparency and inclusiveness, the COP will be invited to organize its work in a manner that ensures that the mandates for the session are addressed while being flexible enough to respond to changing circumstances and new developments in the negotiations.

(g) Dates and venues of future sessions

26. *Background:* COP 30 accepted with appreciation the offer of the Government of Ethiopia to host COP 32, from 8 to 19 November 2027.¹³

27. In keeping with the principle of rotation among the United Nations regional groups, the host of COP 33 is to come from the Asia-Pacific States and the host of COP 34 from the Eastern European States.

28. SBI 64 recommended dates for the sessional periods in 2032–2033.¹⁴

29. *Action:* The COP will be invited to consider the matter of the host country for COP 33 with a view to facilitating an early decision thereon, as well as the dates for the sessional periods in 2032–2033, and take any further action it deems appropriate.

(h) Adoption of the report on credentials

30. *Background:* According to rule 19 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, the credentials of representatives of Parties, as well as the names of alternate representatives and advisers, shall be submitted to the secretariat no later than 24 hours after the opening of the session. Any later change in the composition of delegations shall also be submitted to the secretariat. The credentials shall be issued by the Head of State or Government, by the Minister of Foreign Affairs or, in the case of a regional economic integration organization, by the competent authority of that organization. The Bureau will examine the credentials and submit its report on credentials for adoption by the COP (see rule 20 of the draft rules of procedure being applied). Representatives shall be entitled to participate provisionally in the session, pending a decision by the COP to accept their credentials (see rule 21 of the draft rules of procedure being applied). The COP will have before it for adoption the report on credentials, to be submitted by the Bureau.

31. *Action:* The COP will be invited to adopt the report on the credentials of the representatives of Parties attending this session. Representatives may participate provisionally pending this action.

3. Reports of the subsidiary bodies

(a) Report of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice

32. *Background:* The Chair of the SBSTA, Adonia Ayebare (Uganda), will report on the work conducted at SBSTA 64 and 65, including any recommendations of draft decisions and conclusions for consideration and adoption at COP 31.¹⁵ In addition, the informal summary report on the 2026 ocean and climate change dialogue, convened at SBSTA 64, will be presented.¹⁶ The summary report on the dialogue on mountains and climate change, convened at SB 64, will be presented together with the Chair of the SBI.¹⁷

33. *Action:* The COP will be invited to take note of the progress in the work of the SBSTA and consider the recommended draft decisions and conclusions for adoption.

(b) Review of the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee

43. *Background:* COP 27 was to review the progress, effectiveness and performance of the Adaptation Committee,²⁵ and COP 26 invited CMA 4 to participate in the review as it relates to the Paris Agreement.²⁶

44. COP 27 and CMA 4 noted that consideration of the review could not be completed at those sessions and would therefore continue at SB 58.²⁷ The review was considered at SB 58, 59 and 60.²⁸ SB 61 agreed that SB 62 would continue consideration of the matter,²⁹ but SB 62 could not complete consideration thereof.³⁰ SB 63 agreed to defer consideration of the matter to SB 64,³¹ and SB 64 to defer consideration thereof to SB 65.³² Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.³³

45. *Action:* The COP will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

7. Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage associated with Climate Change Impacts

46. *Background:* COP 19 and 20 requested the WIM Executive Committee to report annually to the COP through the subsidiary bodies and to make recommendations, as appropriate.³⁴ Article 8, paragraph 2, of the Paris Agreement states that the WIM shall be subject to the authority and guidance of the CMA and may be enhanced and strengthened as determined by the CMA.

47. The governing body or bodies shall consider the joint annual report of the WIM Executive Committee and the Santiago network for averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change, submitted through the subsidiary bodies in accordance with paragraph 19 of annex I to decision [12/CMA.4](#), endorsed by decision [11/CP.27](#), and provide guidance thereon.³⁵ Accordingly, matters relating to the joint annual report are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.³⁶

48. COP 24 to 30 were invited to consider the matter of COP authority over and guidance to the WIM.³⁷ COP 30 noted that considerations related to the governance of the WIM will continue at COP 31.³⁸

8. Matters relating to finance

(a) Long-term climate finance

50. *Background:* COP 26 decided that continued discussions on long-term climate finance will conclude in 2027.³⁹

51. COP 27 requested the SCF to prepare a biennial report, including a summary of key findings, on progress towards achieving the goal of mobilizing jointly USD 100 billion per year to address the needs of developing countries in the context of meaningful mitigation actions and transparency on implementation, taking into account other relevant reports, for consideration at COP 31.⁴⁰

52. The Presidency of COP 29 prepared a summary of the deliberations at the sixth biennial high-level ministerial dialogue on climate finance, on the progress towards achieving the goal of mobilizing jointly USD 100 billion per year, convened at COP 29.⁴¹ COP 30 agreed to defer consideration of this matter to COP 31.⁴²

53. *Action:* The COP will be invited to continue its discussions on long-term climate finance and take any action it deems appropriate.

(b) Matters relating to the Standing Committee on Finance

54. *Background:* COP 17 decided that the SCF shall report at each ordinary session of the COP and make recommendations for consideration by the COP on all aspects of its work.⁴³

55. COP 17 requested the SCF to prepare a biennial assessment and overview of climate finance flows, to include information on the geographical and thematic balance of such flows, drawing on available sources of information.⁴⁴

56. COP 30 also requested the SCF to report to COP 31 on progress in implementing its workplan for 2026.⁴⁵

57. COP 27 adopted the terms of reference for the second review of the functions of the SCF and requested SBI 59 to complete the work on that review with a view to recommending draft decisions on the matter for consideration and adoption at COP 28 and CMA 5.⁴⁶ SBI 59, 61 and 63 could not conclude consideration of the matter and agreed to continue or defer consideration of this matter to a subsequent session.⁴⁷ SBI 64 agreed to defer consideration of the matter to SBI 65.⁴⁸ Accordingly, matters relating to the second review of the SCF are considered under the SBI.⁴⁹

58. *Action:* The COP will be invited to consider the SCF report and the recommendations of the SBI on the review of the functions of the SCF and take any action it deems appropriate.

(c) Report of the Green Climate Fund to the Conference of the Parties and guidance to the Green Climate Fund

59. *Background:* The Board of the GCF submits an annual report to the COP, as provided for in the arrangements between the COP and the GCF,⁵⁰ including information on the implementation of the guidance provided at the previous session of the COP and in any other relevant decisions of the COP.

60. COP 17 decided that the SCF will provide draft guidance for the GCF for consideration by the COP on the basis of the annual report of the GCF to the COP and views submitted by Parties.⁵¹

61. COP 30 invited Parties to submit views and recommendations on elements of guidance for the GCF and requested the SCF to take into consideration those submissions when preparing its draft guidance for the GCF for consideration at COP 31 and CMA 8, and the Board of the GCF to include in its annual report to the COP information on the steps it has taken to implement the guidance provided in decision [2/CP.30](#).⁵²

62. *Action:* The COP will be invited to provide guidance to the GCF on policies, programme priorities and eligibility criteria taking into consideration the reports of the GCF and the SCF.

(d) Report of the Global Environment Facility to the Conference of the Parties and guidance to the Global Environment Facility

63. *Background:* The memorandum of understanding between the COP and the Council of the GEF provides that the GEF shall report annually to the COP on the implementation of guidance received.⁵³

64. COP 17 decided that the SCF will provide draft guidance for the GEF for consideration by the COP on the basis of the annual report of the GEF to the COP and views submitted by Parties.⁵⁴

65. COP 30 invited Parties to submit views and recommendations on elements of guidance for the GEF and requested the SCF to take into consideration those submissions in preparing its draft guidance for the GEF for consideration at COP 31 and CMA 8, and the GEF to include in its annual report to the COP information on the steps it has taken to implement the guidance provided in decision [3/CP.30](#).⁵⁵

66. *Action:* The COP will be invited to provide guidance to the GEF on policies, programme priorities and eligibility criteria taking into consideration the reports of the GEF and the SCF.

68. COP 29 and CMA 6 approved the arrangements between the COP, the CMA and the Board of the FRLD and requested the Board to report on the implementation of the arrangements in its annual report to the COP and the CMA, starting at COP 30 and CMA 7.⁵⁷

69. COP 30 and CMA 7 invited Parties to submit views and recommendations on elements of guidance for the FRLD and requested the SCF to take into consideration those submissions when preparing its draft guidance for the FRLD for consideration at COP 31 and CMA 8, and the Board of the FRLD to include in its annual report to the COP and the CMA

information on the steps it has taken to implement the guidance provided in decisions [4/CP.30](#) and [8/CMA.7](#) respectively.⁵⁸

(f) Seventh review of the Financial Mechanism

71. *Background:* COP 4 decided that the Financial Mechanism will be reviewed every four years in accordance with Article 11, paragraph 4, of the Convention.⁵⁹ COP 17 decided that the SCF shall assist the COP in exercising its functions with regard to the Financial Mechanism by, inter alia, providing expert input, including through independent reviews and assessments, for the preparation and conduct of the periodic reviews of the Financial Mechanism by the COP.⁶⁰

72. COP 21 decided to assess the implementation of the Capacity-building Initiative for Transparency in the context of the seventh review of the Financial Mechanism.⁶¹

73. COP 23 decided that the seventh review of the Financial Mechanism would be initiated at COP 26.⁶² COP 26 to 30 could not conclude consideration of the guidelines for the review.⁶³ In accordance with rules 10(c) and 16 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, this sub-item has been included in the provisional agenda for this session.

74. *Action:* The COP will be invited to agree on the guidelines for the seventh review of the Financial Mechanism taking into account the guidelines contained in the annex to decision [12/CP.22](#).

80. SBI 64 recommended the United Nations Environment Programme as the host and agreed to continue consideration of this matter at SBI 65.⁷⁰ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda sub-item are considered under the SBI.⁷¹

91. *Background:* COP 26 decided to extend the mandate of the LEG under its current terms of reference; that the next review of the mandate of the LEG will take place at COP 36; to take stock of the work of the LEG in order to review its progress and terms of reference at COP 31, the midway point before the review, as a way to reflect on the evolving needs of the least developed countries; and to outline the steps for that stocktake at COP 29.⁸²

92. COP 30 requested SBI 64 to initiate the stocktake of the progress of the work of the LEG and its terms of reference with a focus on the evolving needs of the least developed countries, taking into account the information in the synthesis report referred to in

12. Report of the forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures

95. *Background:* COP 24, CMP 14 and CMA 1 acknowledged that a single forum on the impact of the implementation of response measures covers the work of the COP, the CMP and the CMA on all matters relating to the impact of the implementation of response measures and affirmed that the forum shall report to the COP, the CMP and the CMA.⁸⁶

96. COP 29, CMP 19 and CMA 6 adopted the workplan of the forum and its KCI for 2026–2030.⁸⁷

97. COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7 requested the KCI to present, at the second regular sessions of the subsidiary bodies each year, its annual report and key findings therefrom to the forum for consideration with a view to the forum making recommendations for consideration by the COP, the CMP and the CMA.⁸⁸

98. SB 64 convened a meeting of the forum but could not conclude consideration of this matter and agreed that SB 65 will continue consideration of the matter.⁸⁹ COP 30, CMP 20 and CMA 7 decided that the forum will conduct the activities referred to in paragraph 11 of decisions [6/CP.30](#), [2/CMP.20](#) and [14/CMA.7](#) at SB 65.⁹⁰ Accordingly, matters relating to this agenda item are considered under the SBSTA and the SBI.⁹¹

99. *Action:* The COP will be invited to take any action it deems appropriate on the basis of the recommendations of the SBSTA and the SBI.

117. The second part of the high-level segment will take place on 17 and 18 November to hear statements from groups or Parties whose Head of State or Government did not speak in the first part.

118. In keeping with recent practice, there will be one list of speakers for the high-level segment. Each Party, including Parties to the Convention, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement, will speak only once. Parties may wish to take note that, as per SBI guidance urging Parties and presiding officers to conclude conferences in a timely manner, statements must not exceed three minutes.

119. Statements on behalf of groups, where other members of the group do not speak, are strongly encouraged and will be accorded additional time. Time limits will be strictly enforced. Following United Nations practice, a mechanism will be in place to signal to speakers when the time limit has been exceeded. Longer versions of the statements can be posted on the UNFCCC website.

120. Information on registration for the list of speakers for the high-level segment has been communicated to Parties. Additional information will be made available to Parties and on the UNFCCC website.

121. To have the full text of their official statement posted on the UNFCCC website, Parties should email a copy, in advance to the delivery of their statement, to cophls@unfccc.int.

(b) Statements by observer organizations

122. Representatives of intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations will be invited to make statements during the resumed high-level segment after group and Party statements. The time limit of two minutes per statement will be strictly enforced. The full text of official statements will be posted on the UNFCCC website.

123. The high-level segment is expected to conclude on 19 November.

19. Other matters

124. Any other matters for the attention of the COP will be taken up under this agenda item.

20. Closure of and report on the session

125. The COP will be invited to consider and adopt, at the end of the session, the draft report prepared on the session and authorize the Rapporteur to complete the report after the session under the guidance of the President and with the assistance of the secretariat. The President will declare the session closed.
