Energy-efficiency training with Deutsche Bahn AG

Participants are invited to come and drive a train – in the driving simulator located in the foyer of the Ministry of Environment. The goal is to save as much energy as possible through effective manoeuvres, without getting behind schedule. The trainer features a simulation programme used for coaching Deutsche Bahn trainee drivers. Following a short introduction, the user may carry out a test drive and produce an individual printout of the energy balance on the test track.
