### **Regional briefing by United Nations system organizations on climate change programmes in the Asia and Pacific region**

13:00–15:00 ESCAP Hall

This is an informal briefing focusing on the key outcomes and messages of United Nations climate change programmes in Asia and the Pacific. The briefing will include a panel presentation by selected UN agencies, followed by an open forum. Twenty-five UN agencies working in the Asia–Pacific region will come together under the leadership of the host organization of the conference, the UN Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP), to highlight institutional capacities, projects and outcomes that benefit Parties to the UNFCCC, and that may serve as examples of best practices for other Parties in the post-Copenhagen follow-up.

A panel discussion and reception “Roadmap to implementation: Findings of the 2009 Forest Carbon Investor Survey and views on ensuring REDD financing”. The research in this survey canvassed the views of sustainability investors, sell-side analysts and institutional money managers from major investment firms in Europe, the United States and the Asia–Pacific region. The firms represented oversee over USD 7 trillion of assets under management. The survey was designed to capture views among global investors about potential funding sources for reducing emissions from deforestation and degradation (REDD) and the prospects for a future forest carbon market. The panel discussion will include speakers from WWF Forest Carbon Initiative; Asian Development Bank and the Ministry of Finance, Republic of Indonesia.
