II. Background

1. By its decision 1/CP.13 (the Bali Action Plan), the Conference of the Parties (COP) launched a comprehensive process to enable the full, effective and sustained implementation of the Convention through long-term cooperative action, now, up to and beyond 2012, in order to reach an agreed outcome and adopt a decision at its fifteenth session. It decided that the process shall be conducted under a subsidiary body under the Convention, the Ad Hoc Working Group on Long-term Cooperative Action under the Convention (AWG-LCA), that shall complete its work in 2009.

2. The sixth session of the AWG-LCA will be held from Monday, 1 June to Friday, 12 June 2009, in conjunction with the thirtieth sessions of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice and the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) and the eighth session of the Ad Hoc Working Group on Further Commitments for Annex I Parties under the Kyoto Protocol.

III. Annotations to the provisional agenda

1. Opening of the session

3. The sixth session of the AWG-LCA will be opened by the Chair on Monday, 1 June 2009 at the Maritim Hotel in Bonn, Germany.

(b) Organization of the work of the session

5. *Background:* The AWG-LCA, at its first session, agreed that its sessions shall be organized in such a manner for there to be sufficient time available for the negotiations of the AWG-LCA in order to enable the COP to reach an agreed outcome and adopt a decision at its fifteenth session.¹

6. The Chair of the AWG-LCA has prepared a note (FCCC/AWGLCA/2009/7) on the scenario for the sixth session. Delegates are invited to consult this scenario note for further information and proposals on the organization of work.

7. The AWG-LCA will meet in an opening plenary on Monday, 1 June 2009. The Chair will invite statements on behalf of major groups of Parties. Delegations are requested to keep their oral statements as brief as possible and to give a hard copy to the conference officers in advance to facilitate the work of the interpreters. Those wishing to make a written statement available to all delegates should bring copies for distribution.

8. Parties are invited to refer to the overview of the session posted on the UNFCCC website and to consult the Daily Programme, published during the session, for a detailed and up-to-date schedule of the work of the AWG-LCA.

9. The SBI, at its twenty-fourth session,² recommended that meetings should normally end by 6 p.m. but may, in exceptional circumstances, continue no later than 9 p.m. This session of the AWG-LCA will be organized accordingly.

3. Enabling the full, effective and sustained implementation of the Convention through long-term cooperative action now, up to and beyond 2012, by addressing, inter alia:

- (a) A shared vision for long-term cooperative action
- (b) Enhanced national/international action on mitigation of climate change
- (c) Enhanced action on adaptation
- (d) Enhanced action on technology development and transfer to support action on mitigation and adaptation
- (e) Enhanced action on the provision of financial resources and investment to support action on mitigation and adaptation and technology cooperation

11. *Background:* The AWG-LCA, at its first session, invited its Chair to prepare summaries of the views expressed during the sessions.³ The Chair's summary of the views expressed at the fifth session is contained in document FCCC/AWGLCA/2009/9.

12. The AWG-LCA, at its third session, called upon all Parties to put forward further proposals regarding the content and form of the agreed outcome as early as possible, so that Parties might review and assess the scope and the progress of the negotiations at the sixth session of the AWG-LCA.⁴

13. At its fourth session, the AWG-LCA invited the Chair to prepare, under his own responsibility, a negotiating text for consideration at its sixth session, taking account of the proceedings of the AWG-LCA at its fifth session, building upon the ideas and proposals of Parties and document FCCC/AWGLCA/2008/16/Rev.1 (hereinafter referred to as the assembly document) and taking account of further submissions received from Parties by 24 April 2009. It shall encompass all aspects of the Bali Action Plan in a balanced manner, not attribute ideas and proposals to their sources, be drafted in language that does not prejudge the form of the agreed outcome, and be made available by the secretariat in a timely manner, preferably two weeks in advance of the session.⁵ The Chair's negotiating text is contained in document FCCC/AWGLCA/2009/8 and takes account of submissions received up to 5 May 2009.

14. In a note to the fifth session of the AWG-LCA, the Chair indicated that the AWG-LCA will need to consider, at an appropriate stage in its work, the legal form of the agreed outcome.⁶ Recent submissions from Parties present a number of options with respect to the form of the agreed outcome.

15. *Action:* The AWG-LCA will be invited to accelerate its negotiations on the substantive content of the agreed outcome and to consider the question of its legal form on the basis of the ideas and proposals submitted by Parties, the assembly document and the negotiating text prepared by the Chair.
