### **PROGRAMME OF THE HIGH LEVEL SEGMENT**

The High Level Segment, to be attended by Heads of State and Heads of Government, ministers and other heads of delegations, will be inaugurated during the afternoon of Tuesday, 6 December. Statements by Heads of State and Heads of Government, ministers and other heads of delegations will be heard in joint meetings of the COP and CMP. National Statements will continue on Wednesday, 7 and Thursday 8 December. The High Level Segment will conclude on Friday, 9 December with statements by Inter-governmental and Non-governmental organizations and the adoption of decisions and conclusions by the COP and the CMP.

The High Level Segment will take place in Plenary “Baobab” and opening addresses will be delivered by the Executive Secretary, the President of COP, the Secretary-General of the United Nations and His Excellency Mr. Jacob Gedleyihlekisa Zuma, President of the Republic of South Africa.

#### **Access to Plenary “Baobab”**

For the opening of the High Level Segment, access is based on the ticket system outlined below. For the subsequent days of the High Level Segment, the plenary is open for all. Please note that tickets to attend the opening ceremony of the High Level Segment can still be collected from the information desk on the ground floor of the ICC. The tickets must be collected by an authorized member of the delegation.

### **Tickets for access to Plenary “Baobab”**

**Turquoise ticket:** Party, IGO or UN observer badge holders in possession of a Turquoise ticket will have access to the main floor of Plenary “Baobab”. These seats are recommended for senior members of the delegation.

**Orange ticket:** Party badge holders in possession of an orange ticket will have access to the Section LL and MM of the gallery.

**Pink ticket:** Party badge holders in possession of a pink ticket will have access to Section VV and WW of the gallery.

**Participants are asked to take their seats by 14.45 in Plenary “Baobab” to ensure that the opening can begin promptly at 15.00.**

During the High Level Segment on Wednesday, 7 and Thursday, 8 December, each Party will have the opportunity to address the plenary. Only one intervention for Party has been foreseen. Heads of State and Heads of Government will be the first to make national statements followed by Ministers, and Party representatives.

Attending Heads of State or Heads of Government will be driven to the VVIP entrance of the ICC and from there escorted by a Protocol Officer to the seats of their delegation. A lounge will also be available for the Heads of State or Heads of Government.

The list of speakers is included in this addendum and will be made available in the Daily Programme throughout the High Level Segment. **All speakers are reminded that they should be present in the plenary at least ten minutes before (or two speakers ahead of) their presentation.** Speakers will be escorted by an usher during the presentation of the previous speaker from the seat of their delegation to a reserved seating arrangement close to the podium and they will be invited to take the floor. After their statement, they will be escorted again to their respective seat behind their country plates.

### **Arrangements for bilateral meetings**

Parties who may wish to organize bilateral meetings between Heads of States or Heads of Government should proceed to do so through the standard diplomatic channels.

Other practical and logistical questions related to the High Level Segment should be directed to the External Relations team located in the Conference Affairs Office (CAS) located in the Conference Affairs Services office, ground floor, south Foyer of the ICC.

**List of speakers for the High Level Segment attended by Heads of State and Heads of Government and other heads of delegation**

The list below is the preliminary list of speakers who have registered their wish to deliver a statement at the High level Segment of the COP and the CMP. The list is provisionally divided into morning and afternoon segments to facilitate the organization of the order of speakers.

Representatives are reminded that statements made during the High Level Segment should not exceed the **three-minute limit**, as decided by the Conference of the Parties at its first plenary meeting. Given the large number of statements, it is suggested that statements be as brief and concise as possible, with full texts available for distribution (see below for the quantities required) and posting on the secretariat web site. If Parties do not wish to speak but would prefer to only have their statements circulated, the secretariat will make arrangements to distribute the copies and enter the statement in the records of the Conference.

Parties interested in taking up this offer should communicate their interest to the External Relations team, who during the High Level Segment can be found in Plenary “Baobab”. Any other changes to the speakers’ list should also be brought to the attention of the External Relations team.

Parties are requested to note that the secretariat is not in a position to accommodate individual requests for changes in a Party’s speaking slot. Parties wishing to make a change should arrange to exchange slots with another Party, and jointly notify the secretariat of the agreement that has been reached.

All Parties are kindly requested to provide the Conference Officer with **20 copies** of their statements in advance to meet the needs of the interpreters and the Conference records. Parties wishing to have their statements distributed during the plenary meeting are requested to provide **300 copies**. These copies may be delivered to the Conference Officer’s table located beside the podium in the plenary. Statements that are delivered during the High Level Segment and for which copies are provided to the secretariat, will also be available on the COP 17/CMP 7 website at <unfccc.int>.
