#### High-level ministerial roundtable under the Kyoto Protocol

11.30 - 13.00 15.30 - 18.00Saal Maritim Open to all participants

The high-level ministerial round table provides an opportunity for ministers to take stock of progress made in the implementation of the second commitment period and to discuss how to increase the ambition of emission reductions for that period. It may also be useful to discuss how lessons learned in implementing the Protocol can positively influence the level of mitigation ambition, including for the negotiations under the Ad-hoc Working Group on the Durban Platform for Enhanced Action (ADP). The CMP in Doha requested each Annex I Party taking on commitments in the second commitment period to submit information on its intention to increase the ambition of its commitment by 30 April 2014, and for this information to be considered at a high-level ministerial round table to be held during the first sessional period in 2014.

The ministerial round table will be convened in Saal Maritim and will be chaired by the COP 19/CMP 9 President, H.E. Mr. Marcin Korolec (Poland) and the COP 20/CMP 10 President-designate, H.E. Mr. Manuel Pulgar-Vidal (Peru).
