The Durban Forum on Capacity-building is an annual, in-session event under the SBI that brings together stakeholders involved in building the capacity of developing countries to mitigate and adapt to climate change.

Following submissions from Parties, the Durban Forum focusses this year on two main topics:

- Capacity-building related work of bodies established under the Convention and its Kyoto Protocol
- Support and resource tools available for, and experiences of developing countries in, the preparation of intended nationally determined contributions (INDC)

The meeting will be opened by the UNFCCC Executive Secretary, Ms. Christiana Figueres, and the SBI Chair, H.E. Mr. Amena Yauvoli. Participants will have the possibility to engage in a debate with Chairs and members of bodies established under the Convention and its Kyoto Protocol as well as representatives of bilateral and multilateral agencies and intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations.

The second part of the meeting will take place on Monday, 8 June, 10.00-13.00, room Addis Abeba and feature real life experiences of developing countries, which already submitted or are currently preparing their INDC.
