Scope and modalities for the periodic assessment of the Technology Mechanism in relation to supporting the implementation of the Paris Agreement

Draft conclusions proposed by the Chair

1. The Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) welcomed the oral reports of the Chair of the Technology Executive Committee and the Director of the Climate Technology Centre and Network on their planned activities that could support Parties in their efforts to implement the Paris Agreement (hereinafter referred to as the Agreement).

2. The SBI noted that the scope of the periodic assessment of the Technology Mechanism referred to in decision 1/CP.21, paragraph 69, (hereinafter referred to as the periodic assessment) will be in the context of Article 10 of the Agreement and will focus on:

(a) The effectiveness of the Technology Mechanism in supporting the implementation of the Agreement on matters relating to technology development and transfer;

(b) The adequacy of support provided to the Technology Mechanism in supporting the implementation of the Agreement on matters relating to technology development and transfer.

3. The SBI acknowledged the need to consider, in elaborating the scope and modalities for the periodic assessment, information emanating from processes currently being undertaken under the Convention, inter alia:

(a) The review of the Climate Technology Centre and Network as referred to in decision 2/CP.17, annex VII, paragraph 20;¹

(b) The development of the modalities for the global stocktake referred to in Article 14 of the Agreement;²

(c) Work on transparency of action and support as referred to in Article 13 of the Agreement;

(d) The elaboration of the technology framework established under Article 10, paragraph 4, of the Agreement.

4. The SBI invited Parties and observer organizations to submit their views³ on the scope and modalities for the periodic assessment by 25 January 2017. It requested the secretariat to prepare a compilation and synthesis report of those views for consideration at SBI 46 (May 2017).
