
Work programme under the framework for non-market approaches referred to in Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement

Draft conclusions proposed by the Chair

- 1. The Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA), pursuant to decision 1/CP.21, paragraphs 39 and 40, continued its work on the work programme under the framework for non-market approaches to sustainable development defined in Article 6, paragraph 9, of the Paris Agreement.
- 2. The SBSTA noted the importance of Article 6, paragraph 1, to its work.
- 3. The SBSTA also noted that Parties engaged in a productive exchange of views on Article 6, paragraphs 8 and 9, of the Paris Agreement and decision 1/CP.21, paragraphs 39 and 40, throughout this session and focused on establishing a common understanding of the matters related to the work programme referred to in decision 1/CP.21, paragraphs 39 and 40, while continuing to ensure balanced progress, maintained between all three different sub-agenda items (12(a), 12(b) and 12(c)).
- 4. The SBSTA invited Parties to submit, by 17 March 2017, their views on, inter alia, the elements to be addressed, including their operationalization, in the decision on the work programme on the framework for non-market approaches to sustainable development defined in Article 6, paragraph 9, of the Paris Agreement, overarching issues, and relationships between Article 6, paragraphs 8 and 9, and other provisions of the Paris Agreement, the Convention and its related legal instruments, as relevant.

- 5. The SBSTA requested the secretariat to organize a roundtable discussion among Parties based on the submissions, in conjunction with SBSTA 46 (May 2017) while ensuring broad participation of developing and developed countries.
- 6. The SBSTA took note of the estimated budgetary implications of the activities to be undertaken by the secretariat referred to in paragraph 5 above. It requested that the actions of the secretariat called for in these conclusions be undertaken subject to the availability of financial resources.

7. The SBSTA agreed to continue its consideration of this matter at SBSTA 46.
