Computer facilities for participants

Second Floor Computer Centre (Ruysdael foyer)

The centre is equipped with 150 computers as well as network printers. Each PC has an Internet connection and is installed with commonly used software (MS-Office, WordPerfect, and Internet browsers). Due to the large number of people who may want to use the facilities, participants are kindly requested to be considerate and limit the time spent using the computers.

An **IT Service Centre** is located within the Computer Centre. Staff are available in the centre to assist with any PC or printer which does not work, as well as to make colour copies, transparencies, prints, etc.

Plug and play area

Two adjacent rooms are equipped with special tables at which participants with their personal laptops will find a power supply and Internet connection (RJ45). Participants are responsible for providing their own power adapters and setting up their equipment themselves. Telephones and photocopiers are also available.
