### SBSTA 61 agenda item 3, SBI 61 agenda item 5 (a) Matters relating to the global stocktake: Procedural and logistical elements of the overall global stocktake process

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#### Draft text by the co-facilitators

*The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement,*

*Recalling* Article 14 of the Paris Agreement,

*Recalling* decisions 19/CMA.1 and 1/CMA.5,

1. *Reaffirms* that equity and the best available science shall be considered in a Party-driven and cross-cutting manner, throughout the global stocktake;
2. *Reaffirms* that the outcome of the global stocktake shall inform Parties in updating and enhancing, in a nationally determined manner, their actions and support in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Paris Agreement, as well as in enhancing international cooperation for climate action;
3. *Reaffirms* that the global stocktake is a Party-driven process conducted in a transparent manner and with the participation of non-Party stakeholders;
4. *Reaffirms* that the participation of Parties in the global stocktake should be ensured through the provision of adequate funding for the participation and representation of developing countries Parties in all activities under the global stocktake;
5. *Recognizes* the importance of inclusivity in all aspects of the global stocktake process and *encourages* the meaningful participation of non-Party stakeholders, including Indigenous Peoples, women and youth, in the process, including through the high-level champions and the Marrakech Partnership for Global Climate Action;
6. *Recalls* the sources of input for the global stocktake, as referred to in paragraphs 36–37 of decision 19/CMA.1, and *also recalls* paragraph 60 of document FCCC/SBSTA/2021/3 in this regard;
7. *Requests* the secretariat to further improve the online availability of all inputs to the global stocktake and *encourages* relevant constituted bodies and forums and other institutional arrangements under or serving the Paris Agreement and/or the Convention, including those established after the adoption of decision 19/CMA.1, to consider opportunities for streamlining information provided in their reports to the global stocktake;
8. *Recalls* paragraph 184 of decision 1/CMA.5 and *requests* the Chair of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice to organize special events, pursuant to paragraph 29 of decision 19/CMA.1, in cooperation with the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, to enable a focused scientific and technical exchange of information on the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change’s findings during each assessment cycle and inform the relevant global stocktake, and to prepare for such events using the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice–Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change Joint Working Group;
9. *Notes* that the technical assessment and consideration of outputs components of the global stocktake may overlap to allow sufficient time for the consideration of outputs;
10. [*Decides* that the technical assessment component will include two technical dialogues, and concludes no later than two sessions before the relevant session of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement;]

11. *Encourages* the Chairs of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice and the Subsidiary Body for Implementation to undertake intersessional work to support the technical assessment component, taking into consideration the need for work on the matter to be comprehensive and inclusive;
12. *Encourages* the co-facilitators of the technical dialogue to consider producing a technical annex setting out practical options for supporting implementation and highlighting lessons learned, good practices, challenges and barriers;
13. *Encourages* the joint contact group on the global stocktake to start the consideration of outputs component at least two sessions before the relevant session of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement [and to consider how the outputs of this component will facilitate the identification of opportunities for following up on the outcome of the global stocktake];
14. *Encourages* the Chairs of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice and the Subsidiary Body for Implementation to hold intersessional consultations, which may be conducted in person, in hybrid format or virtually, and to develop elements for the consideration of outputs component;
15. [*Decides* that the high-level committee for the consideration of outputs component for the second and subsequent global stocktakes will consist of the three Presidencies presiding during the duration of the global stocktake process and the Chairs of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice and the Subsidiary Body for Implementation and] *urges* the high-level committee to conduct its activities in a timely manner;
16. *Takes note* of the estimated budgetary implications of the activities to be undertaken by the secretariat referred to in this decision;
17. *Requests* that the actions of the secretariat called for in this decision be undertaken subject to the availability of financial resources.
