Meanwhile the relevance of cooperative approaches in the context of NDC implementation has doubled. The share of Parties who indicated that they plan or will possibly use voluntary cooperation in at least one of its scopes has increased from 46 to 85 per cent in new or updated NDCs, compared to those Parties' previous NDCs.
