I hereby inform Parties and observer States to the Paris Agreement, United Nations Secretariat units and bodies, specialized and related organizations, as well as admitted observer organizations, of the following upcoming activities and recently published documents related to the first global stocktake (GST) under the Paris Agreement:

- A webinar on Thursday, 12 May 2022, from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Central European Summer Time, to clarify the methodologies and assumptions used to aggregate the inputs for the synthesis reports for the technical assessment component of the GST;

III. Synthesis reports

In accordance with paragraph 23 of decision 19/CMA.1, the secretariat has prepared, under the guidance of the co-facilitators of the technical dialogue (TD), the following synthesis reports for the technical assessment component of the GST:¹

- <u>A synthesis report on the state of greenhouse gas emissions by sources and removals by sinks</u> and mitigation efforts undertaken by Parties, including the information referred to in Article 13, paragraph 7(a), and Article 4, paragraphs 7, 15 and 19, of the Paris Agreement;
- <u>A synthesis report on the state of adaptation efforts, support, experience and priorities, including the information referred to in Article 7, paragraphs 2, 10, 11 and 14, of the Paris Agreement, and the reports referred to in Article 13, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement;</u>
- <u>A synthesis report on the overall effect of Parties' nationally determined contributions and</u> overall progress made by Parties towards the implementation of their nationally determined contributions, including the information referred to in Article 13, paragraph 7(b), of the Paris Agreement;
- <u>A synthesis report on finance flows, including the information referred to in Article 2, paragraph 1(c), and means of implementation and support and mobilization and provision of support, including the information referred to in Article 9, paragraphs 4 and 6, Article 10, paragraph 6, Article 11, paragraph 3, and Article 13, in particular paragraphs 9 and 10, of the Paris Agreement.</u>

IV. Information note

The co-facilitators of the GST technical dialogue (TD) have prepared, under their own responsibility, an informal information note that presents their approach to conducting the first meeting of the TD, outlining the activities that will be carried out and the preparations that they have undertaken consistently with the modalities of the GST outlined in decision 19/CMA.1 and on the basis of informal consultations with Parties and observers. The note is intended for use by Parties, observers and other non-Party stakeholders in preparing for the TD.
