## **INFORMATION NOTE TO UNITED NATIONS AND RELATED ORGANIZATIONS AND SPECIALIZED AGENCIES**

### **Opening of the Online Registration System United Nations Climate Change Conference, SB 62 16 – 26 June 2025 Bonn, Germany**

The secretariat refers to the forthcoming sixty-second sessions of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice and the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SB 62) to be held from **16 – 26 June 2025** at the [World Conference Center Bonn](https://www.wccb-bonn.org/) (WCCB), Platz der Vereinten Nationen 2, 53113 Bonn, Germany and wishes to inform United Nations and related organizations and specialized agencies (UN organizations) that the online registration system (available at <https://onlinereg.unfccc.int/>), which allows UN organizations to nominate representatives to attend sessions, is now open for registration for SB 62, and will remain open for nomination and confirmation of delegations until **15 June 2025, 23:59 Central European Summer Time (CEST)**.

The manual on how to access and use the system is available [here](#). ORS is the only official channel for nominating participants for SB 62. The secretariat is not in a position to process nominations submitted by any other method.

Please note that **it is imperative that a correct and unique email address be provided for each delegate** for swift processing of registration confirmations. Once the delegate is confirmed in the ORS, an email with a link to download the acknowledgment letter will be sent to the email address of the confirmed delegate.
