## Annex I

### **Message from the co-chairs of the ad hoc work programme on the new collective quantified goal on climate finance**

Dear colleagues,

CMA 3<sup>1</sup> established an ad hoc work programme for 2022–2024 on the new collective quantified goal on climate finance, to be facilitated by two co-chairs.

As the co-chairs of the ad hoc work programme, we have been requested by the CMA to conduct four technical expert dialogues this year, with one of these dialogues to be held in conjunction with the first regular session of the subsidiary bodies for the year and one to be held in conjunction with the session of the CMA, and the two remaining dialogues to be organized in separate regions with a view to facilitating inclusive and balanced geographical participation.

The first technical expert dialogue was held in hybrid format from 24 to 25 March 2022. More than 200 participants from around the world met in person in Cape Town and virtually, representing governments, multilateral development banks, non-governmental organizations, academia and the private sector.<sup>2</sup> We have issued a reflections note prepared under our own responsibility which presents a non-exhaustive set of views to capture the substantive and rich discussions held during the first technical expert dialogue and to help us structure our discussions at the second technical expert dialogue.<sup>3</sup>

We are pleased to notify Parties that the **second technical expert dialogue** will be held during SB 56 at the World Convention Center Bonn, Platz der Vereinten Nationen 2, Bonn, in hybrid format to enable virtual participation. It will be organized in two parts, taking place on 13 and 14 June 2022, respectively, both at 3–6 p.m. Central European Summer Time in room New York.

The provisional programme is contained in annex II. The dialogue will be open to **all registered participants of SB 56**. Representatives of Parties not attending SB 56 who are interested in participating in the dialogue can do so virtually by completing the registration form at <https://forms.gle/T3xWoMWHpVm8EnSPA> by **Friday, 3 June 2022**. The dialogue will also be webcast. Further information will be available at <https://unfccc.int/NCQG>.

Participants taking part in person will be required to comply with COVID-19 health and safety regulations as mandated by the host country and the United Nations.

In addition, we would like to take this opportunity to invite Parties, constituted bodies under the Convention and the Paris Agreement, the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism, climate finance institutions, observers and observer organizations, and other stakeholders, particularly from the private sector, to submit their views on the objectives referred to in paragraph 15 and on the elements referred to in paragraph 16 of decision 9/CMA.3 via the submission portal<sup>4</sup> by August 2022.

Finally, we would like to reiterate our intention to conduct the ad hoc work programme in an open, inclusive and transparent manner, ensuring participatory representativeness. We will continue to actively consult with Parties, constituted bodies, in particular the Standing Committee on Finance, United Nations agencies, climate finance experts, academia, and private sector and civil society actors, including during SB 56, with a view to informing the work programme. As such, we are available for meetings upon the request of any Party, regional group of Parties or stakeholders.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA), at its third session, established an ad hoc work programme on the new collective quantified goal on climate finance (NCQG) from 2022 to 2024 and decided to conduct four technical expert dialogues per year, with one to be held in conjunction with the first regular sessions of the Subsidiary Bodies and one to be held in conjunction with the CMAs, and the two remaining dialogues to be organized in separate regions with a view to facilitating inclusive and balanced geographical participation. The first technical expert dialogue was held in hybrid format from 24 to 25 March 2022. More than 200 participants from around the world met in person in Cape Town and virtually, representing governments, multilateral development banks, non-governmental organizations, academia and the private sector. The co-chairs of the ad hoc work programme on the NCQG have issued a reflections note prepared under their own responsibility which presents a non-exhaustive set of views capturing the substantive and rich discussions held during the first technical expert dialogue and to help structure the discussions at the second technical expert dialogue.<sup>5</sup>
