MESSAGE TO PARTIES

Facilitative sharing of views at SBI 50 in Bonn, Germany

I wish to draw the attention of Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change to the workshop of the facilitative sharing of views (FSV) under the international consultation and analysis (ICA) process for non-Annex I Parties, which will be convened during the fiftieth session of the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) in Bonn, Germany on 19 June 2019.

The FSV process is the second step in the ICA process established through decision 2/CP.17. Modalities and guidelines for ICA, contained in paragraphs 56–62 of decision 2/CP.17 and annex IV of the same decision, serve as the basis for the implementation of the ICA process which includes two steps:

- (1) Technical analysis of biennial update reports;
- (2) Facilitative sharing of views among Parties in the form of a workshop under the SBI.

In accordance with the modalities and guidelines for ICA adopted by the Conference of the Parties (see Paragraphs 56-62 of decision [2/CP.17](#)), the SBI shall, at regular intervals, convene a workshop for the FSV, open to all Parties, for all non-Annex I Parties for which there is a biennial update report and a final summary report of the technical analysis. The next round of FSV will be conducted on 19 June 2019 during the fiftieth session of the SBI. The final list of Parties that will be the focus of this FSV session will soon be announced on the FSV website [here](#):

Parties will be allowed to submit written questions in advance of the workshop. Further details on the process and timeline for submitting such questions are provided in Annex I to this message. Annex I also describes the operational details of the FSV workshop, including information on the format and duration of the session as well as other organizational matters.

Annex I

Operational details for the workshop on the facilitative sharing of views in Bonn, Germany

I. Background of and mandate for facilitative sharing of views under international consultation and analysis

1. **International consultation and analysis** (ICA) of biennial update reports (BURs) is a process under the Subsidiary Body of Implementation (SBI) that aims to increase the transparency of mitigation actions and their effects, through the technical analysis of BURs by a team of technical experts in consultation with the Party concerned followed by a facilitative sharing of views. Modalities and guidelines for ICA are elaborated in paragraphs 56 – 62 of decision 2/CP.17 and annex IV of the same decision.
2. A technical analysis of the BURs submitted by Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention will have as the main outcome the summary report of the technical analysis.
3. The FSV workshop, with the BUR and summary report as input, will consist of a one-to three-hour session for each Party or group of Parties. The session will consist of a brief presentation by the Party or Parties concerned on their BUR, followed by questions and answers. Other interested Parties will be allowed to submit written questions in advance.
4. The **outputs** of the ICA process for each Party includes:
 - (i) A final summary report resulting from the technical analysis of BUR;
 - (ii) A record of the facilitative sharing of views summarizing the proceedings of the facilitative sharing of views session for the Party.

II. Date of the workshop for the facilitative sharing of views

5. The workshop for the facilitative sharing of views will be convened on 19 June 2019 during the fiftieth session of the SBI in Bonn, Germany.

III. Parties for FSV during SBI50

6. The Parties that have submitted a BUR and have a final summary report will be the focus for FSV at SBI 50. The final list of Parties will soon be available on the FSV website.

IV. Written questions in advance

7. As provided in paragraph 6 of annex IV to decision 2/CP 16, Parties will be allowed to submit written questions in advance of the FSV workshop using an online platform. The secretariat will be in contact with all Parties (via nominated users to the FSV Portal) to inform them of the steps for submitting such written questions in advance.



8. The timeline for submitting questions in advance is outlined in table 1 below. The working language for the question and answer process will be English and the questions should be raised within the scope of the ICA process.

19 June 2019	The FSV Workshop will be held in Bonn, Germany. Parties will make a presentation on their BURs, followed by a question and answer session	Session will be broadcasted and made publicly available on the secretariat's website.

V. Format, duration and other organizational matters

1. **Chairing arrangement.** The SBI Chair will preside over the proceedings of the workshop. In the event that the SBI Chair is not available, the Vice-Chair or the Rapporteur of the SBI may, preside over the workshop on behalf of the Chair.
2. **Time allocation:** Each Party will be allocated 30 - 40 minutes on average as follows:
 - a. Presentation: 15 minutes per Party on average to present their BUR;
 - b. Question and answer: 15 - 20 minutes per Party on average after each presentation.

In the event that the Party undergoing FSV receives none or very few questions, the total time allocated to that Party can be shortened. Upon completion of the question and answer session for one Party, the next Party will be invited to begin its presentation.

3. **Representation of Parties:** It is expected that a representative with competencies in both policy and technical issues will speak on behalf of the Party.
4. **Order of participation and placement of speakers and seating arrangements:** The order of Parties making presentations will be alphabetical.
5. **Workshop participants:** The workshop will be open to Parties and observers. However, only Parties can pose questions and seek clarification.
6. **Output of the FSV:** A record of the FSV, summarizing the presentation by the Party and proceedings, will be prepared, under the guidance of the SBI Chair, for each Party undergoing the FSV.
