### **Message from the co-chairs of the ad hoc work programme on the new collective quantified goal on climate finance**

Dear colleagues,

The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement at its third session (CMA 3) established an ad hoc work programme for 2022–2024 on the new collective quantified goal on climate finance, to be facilitated by two co-chairs. We are honoured to have been appointed by the President of CMA 4 to co-chair the ad hoc work programme in 2023 and thank him and Parties for entrusting us with this role.

Following the successful undertaking of the series of technical dialogues in 2022, we, as the co-chairs of the ad hoc work programme, have been requested by the CMA to conduct the succeeding four technical expert dialogues in 2023, with one of these dialogues to be held in conjunction with the first regular session of the subsidiary bodies for the year and one to be held in conjunction with the session of the CMA, and the two remaining dialogues to be held in separate regions with a view to facilitating inclusive and balanced geographical participation.

As a first step, we intend to develop and publish a workplan taking into consideration submissions from and consultations with Parties. The workplan will include themes for the four technical expert dialogues to be held in 2023.

We are pleased to notify Parties that the **fifth technical expert dialogue** will be held at the Vienna International Centre in Vienna, Austria, from **8 to 10 March 2023**. The provisional programme and related information will be made available in due course at <https://unfccc.int/NCQG>.

Recognizing that not all Parties will be able to attend the fifth technical expert dialogue in person, arrangements are being made to facilitate active virtual participation. We request Parties to consider participating virtually and to complete the registration form at <https://forms.gle/5cb8TVvosWB9H6E27> by **Wednesday, 1 March 2023**.

Further details relevant to in-person and virtual participation in the dialogue will be communicated directly to the registered participants.

In addition, we would like to remind Parties, constituted bodies under the Convention and the Paris Agreement, the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism, climate finance institutions, observers and observer organizations, and other stakeholders, particularly from the private sector, to submit inputs via the submission portal<sup>1</sup> on the basis of guiding questions, well in advance of the technical expert dialogue, to allow for those inputs to be reflected in the organization of the dialogue.<sup>2</sup> Given the time constraints involved in organizing the fifth technical expert dialogue, we would also like to encourage those intending to submit inputs on that dialogue to do so by **Monday, 6 February 2023**.

Early submissions would allow for the wide participation of relevant stakeholders, including relevant experts.

Finally, we would like to reiterate our intention to conduct the ad hoc work programme in an open, inclusive and transparent manner, ensuring participatory representativeness. During the course of the year, we will actively consult with the constituted bodies as well as United Nations agencies, climate finance experts, academia, the private sector and civil society actors with a view to informing the ad hoc work programme. As such, we will be available for informal meetings upon the request of any Party, regional group of Parties or relevant stakeholders.
