These documents have been prepared in response to paragraphs 26 and 33(c) of [decision 6/CMA.4](#), in which the Conference of the Parties serving as the Meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA) requested the secretariat, as part of the implementation of the centralized accounting and reporting platform, the Article 6 database and the international registry, to make the detailed requirements of the platform and database, as well as the technical specifications and associated cost estimates for the registry, available to Parties before the fifty-eighth session of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice to allow Parties to provide views thereon within four weeks of their publication.

Parties are invited to consider the documents and submit views, through their national focal points, by **Friday, 14 July 2023** using the [submission portal](#). This deadline takes into account the duration of the upcoming sessions of the subsidiary bodies.
