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MESSAGE TO PARTIES AND OBSERVER STATES

Nomination for participants to mandated events and information on other events

Climate Week - 3 Yeosu, Republic of Korea, 21 - 25 April 2026

The secretariat refers to the [Message to Parties and observers](#) dated 29 January 2026 regarding the Climate Week-3, previously referred to as "Climate Week 1 2026", which will be held from 21 to 25 April 2026 in Yeosu, Republic of Korea.

This message to Parties includes information on mandated events taking place at the Climate Week-3 that are open for nomination of Party representatives, as well as the corresponding participation modalities. All mandated events will be organized in accordance with their respective mandates under the Conference of Parties serving as the meeting of Parties to the Paris Agreement and of the Subsidiary Bodies.

The Climate Week-3 will also host the Implementation Forum, with the overall objective to focus on actionable solutions, bringing together implementers and policymakers to accelerate climate action. More information on the Forum can be found on section III.

Participation in mandated events is facilitated through the [National Focal Points \(NFPs\)](#), who are requested to ensure the effective nomination of the participants for the mandated events. In this context, Parties are invited to carefully review the information contained in sections I - IV of this communication.

I. Nomination for mandated events

Nomination of representatives to mandated events, including those for which funding support is available, should be submitted through the centralised [the Indico UN nomination platform](#), which compiles the nomination forms for all events open for nomination; for ease for reference, the individual event nomination forms are also available below in their respective sections. **Indico UN is the only official channel for nominating participants for the events during the Climate Week-3.** The secretariat is not in a position to process nominations submitted by any other method. Please note that it is imperative that a correct and unique email address be provided for each nominated participant for swift processing of nominations and initiating the registration process. Once a participant has been nominated for an event, they will receive an email with registration details via Indico UN. Logistical details related to travel and participation will be shared directly with registered participants and published on the [Climate Week-3 web page](#).

Parties are encouraged to nominate individuals with expertise and experience relevant to the specific event. To ensure the effective use of funding modalities available to eligible Parties, NFPs are invited to nominate additional delegates to events with available funding for eligible Parties, which are scheduled on the same date and time. The secretariat invites Parties to carefully review the nomination procedures and applicable funding modalities for each event before submitting nominations for participation via the Indico UN portal.

Details on using the nomination platform and steps to submit your nominations are included in the guidelines for using the Indico UN nomination platform, attached to this communication. Chapter 4 of the guidelines includes an access code, which should be used to access nomination forms. The system will remain open for nomination of participants requiring funding support until **20 March 2026, CET 23:59**.

In view of the need to confirm the arrangements for the Climate Week-3 events as early as possible, the secretariat may not be in a position to process nominations of participants requiring funding support received after the deadline of **20 March 2026, CET 23:59**.

In case funds become available, priority will be given to nominated participants from Small Island Developing States (SIDS) and Least Developed Countries (LDCs).
 - The funding arrangements for **funded in-person participants** will cover attendance at the global dialogue and investment-focused event only. This includes round-trip air travel at the least costly available economy-class fare, daily subsistence allowance (DSA) at the United Nations rate from the official day of arrival through the last day of the global dialogue and investment-focused event, and terminal expenses.

 - **In-person participants** who have been nominated as “**non-funded**”, are responsible for covering all expenses related to their attendance of the fifth dialogue under the United Arab Emirates Just Transition Work Programme.

4. Biregional gathering for Asia, and Central and Eastern Europe, Russian Federation, Central Asia and Transcaucasia regions, under the Baku Workplan of the Local Communities and Indigenous Peoples Platform⁷, 21 –24 April 2026

- **Nomination modality:**
 - Interested representatives of Parties and observer states from **Asia, Central and Eastern Europe, Russian Federation, Central Asia and Transcaucasia regions** should be nominated to participate in the biregional gathering through the respective NFPs.
- **Funding arrangement:**
 - In-person Party participants will be **self-funded** and responsible for covering all expenses related to their attendance of the biregional gathering.

The FWG will facilitate the participation of knowledge holders and practitioners from Indigenous Peoples and local communities from these regions, subject to the availability of resources.

III. Implementation Forum

The **Implementation Forum** will take place on 23 and 24 April 2026 and will feature a series of events, including Implementation labs, Impact dialogues and COP presidency events, focused on actionable solutions, bringing together implementers and policymakers to accelerate climate action. The thematic focus of the events will be based on the six axes of the global climate action agenda¹² ensuring alignment to the first GST outcomes. The implementation forum is a key pillar of the Climate Weeks, under which Parties and non-Party stakeholders can exchange on practical implementation solutions. Convening these discussions at the Climate weeks, localizes the Action Agenda, highlighting region-specific initiatives while drawing on global expertise.

In-person participants who wish to attend Implementation Forum in addition to the events of Climate Week-3, for which they have been nominated and registered, are responsible for covering any additional costs of their stay in Yeosu that arise from participation in the Implementation Forum.

IV. Together4Transparency (T4T) information desk
