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MESSAGE TO PARTIES AND OBSERVER STATES

2023 High-level Ministerial Dialogue on the New Collective Quantified Goal on Climate Finance 3 December 2023

and

Second High-level Ministerial Dialogue on Climate Finance regarding information to be provided by Parties in accordance with Article 9, paragraph 5, of the Paris Agreement 8 December 2023

Dubai, United Arab Emirates

On behalf of the incoming COP 28, CMP 18 and CMA 5 Presidency, I am pleased to inform Parties and observer States to the Convention, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement that the high-level ministerial dialogues on climate finance topics under the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA), to be held during COP 28 are scheduled as follows:

- Sunday, 3 December 2023 from 10:00a.m. to 1:00p.m. (GMT +4) 2023 High-level ministerial dialogue on the new collective quantified goal on climate finance;
- Friday, 8 December 2023 from 3:00p.m to 6:00p.m. (GMT +4) Second biennial high-level ministerial dialogue on climate finance regarding information to be provided by Parties in accordance with Article 9, paragraph 5, of the Paris Agreement.

2023 high-level ministerial dialogue on the new collective quantified goal on climate finance

CMA 3 decided to convene high-level ministerial dialogues on the new collective quantified goal on climate finance starting in 2022 and ending in 2024, ensuring effective political engagement and open, meaningful, and robust discussion. The 2023 high-level ministerial dialogue will be informed by the reports on the technical expert dialogues and submissions by Parties and non-Party stakeholders in the context of ad hoc work programme on the new collective quantified goal on climate finance.

Distribution: To Parties and observer States to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change through their national focal points and diplomatic missions accredited to the Federal Republic of Germany.



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This dialogue aims to substantively advance shared understanding of the goal and provide guidance on the further direction of the ad hoc work programme the following year. The COP 28 President will prepare a summary of the deliberations at the 2023 high-level ministerial dialogue, including recommendations, for consideration by CMA 5.

<u>Second biennial high-level ministerial dialogue on climate finance regarding information to be</u> provided by Parties in accordance with Article 9, paragraph 5, of the Paris Agreement

CMA 1 decided to convene high-level ministerial dialogues on climate finance beginning in 2021, in the context of identification of the information to be provided by Parties in accordance with Article 9, paragraph 5, of the Paris Agreement, to be informed, inter alia, by the biennial communications of indicative quantitative and qualitative information related to Article 9, paragraphs 1 and 3, of the Paris Agreement, as applicable, including, as available, projected levels of public financial resources to be provided to developing country Parties and the summary reports on the biennial in-session workshops beginning the year after the submission of the first biennial communications. The COP 28 President will prepare a summary of the deliberations at the second high-level ministerial dialogue for consideration by CMA 7.

Both events will have a webcast. While the ministerial dialogues are open to all Parties and observer States, owing to the limited capacity of the meeting rooms, access to Parties and observer States will be limited to one minister or deputy minister or head of delegation, plus one accompanying member of the delegation. Parties and observer States are requested to **submit the names of nominated participants** to climatefinance@unfccc.int no later than **Monday**, 27 **November 2023**.

The aim of the COP 28 Presidency during these events is to facilitate interactive discussions whereby all participants can take the floor more than once and react to other interventions. In this regard, participants will be requested to make succinct and focused interventions. Parties and observer States will be able to share their full statements in writing for publication on the web pages of the dialogues.

The provisional programmes and additional information on the dialogues will be announced in due course on the <u>NCQG</u> and <u>Article 9</u>, <u>paragraph 5</u>, <u>of the Paris Agreement</u> webpages, respectively.
