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MESSAGE TO PARTIES AND OBSERVERS

Timely submission of views and inputs for the current calls for submissions

On behalf of the Chairs of the subsidiary bodies, I wish to remind Parties and observers to the Convention, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement, United Nations and related organizations and specialized agencies, intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations admitted as observers and other non-Party stakeholders of the importance of making submissions within their respective deadlines. Submissions are key inputs to official documents or in the preparation for mandated events, and thus late submissions can often lead to delays in the secretariats' publication of documents and event organization.

Therefore, please ensure that submissions are made within the mandated deadline, noting that those made after such deadlines may not be taken into account. Submissions can be made via the UNFCCC submission portal.

The following calls have deadlines in the coming months of this year:

Matters relating to the forum on the impact of response measures:

- Views on possible topics for the global dialogues on the impacts of the implementation of response measures in 2024¹.
- Deadline 15 July (Note: The secretariat experienced technical issues with the portal. Although the deadline has passed, Parties, observers, and non-Party stakeholders are encouraged to submit their views until 22 July)

UAE-Belém work programme on indicators:

- Information on existing indicators for measuring progress towards the targets referred to in paragraphs 9–10 of decision 2/CMA.5 in use at the local, national, regional, and global level, including, if available, information on associated methodologies and data readiness for such indicators, as well as identified gaps and areas for which the development of new indicators may be needed.
- Deadline 31 July

Distribution: To Parties and observer States through their national focal points and diplomatic missions accredited to the Federal Republic of Germany, as well as United Nations organizations, admitted observer organizations, and other non-Party stakeholders.

Article 6, paragraph 8, of the Paris Agreement:

- Views and information on the progress and outcomes of the first phase of implementing the work
 programme activities, and views on improving and recommending the schedule for implementing
 the work programme activities for the second phase.
- Deadline 31 August

Research and systematic observation:

- Views on possible themes for and ways to organize Earth Information Day 2024, to be held in conjunction with SBSTA 61 (November 2024)
- Deadline 31 August

<u>United Arab Emirates dialogue on implementing the global stocktake outcomes, referred to in</u> paragraph 97 of decision 1/CMA.5:

- Views on the modalities of the United Arab Emirates dialogue.
- Deadline 15 September

<u>Terms of reference for the 2024 review of the Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage associated with Climate Change Impacts:</u>

- As input to the 2024 review of the WIM, inter alia:
 - (a) Views on strengths, weaknesses, gaps, challenges, and opportunities related to enhancing the effectiveness and efficiency of the WIM;
 - (b) Views on the use and usefulness of the outputs of the WIM and the usefulness of activities under the WIM;
 - (c) Views on improvements of the WIM and the implementation of its functions;
 - (d) Other inputs on how the WIM can promote the implementation of approaches to averting, minimizing, and addressing loss and damage associated with climate change impacts.
- Deadline 30 September

Matters relating to the global goal on adaptation:

- Views on matters related to paragraph 38 of decision 2/CMA.5.
- Deadline: 27 September 2024 (6 weeks prior to SB 61)

Sharm el-Sheikh joint work on implementation of climate action on agriculture and food security:

- Relevant international organizations to submit information on their activities related to the joint
 work via the Sharm el-Sheikh online portal referred to in paragraph 16 of decision 3/CP.27. and
 Parties and observers to submit, for each workshop, views on the subject of that workshop, options
 for its format and suggested speakers.
- Deadline: 31 December 2024 (annually)



Sharm el-Sheikh mitigation ambition and implementation work programme:

- Suggested topics in line with the scope of the work programme to be discussed at the global dialogues 2024 and Views on opportunities, best practices, actionable solutions, challenges and barriers relevant to the topic of each dialogue.
- Deadline: 4 weeks before each dialogue

Work programme on just transition pathways referred to in relevant paragraphs of decision 1/CMA.4:

- Views on work to be undertaken under, as well as possible topics for the dialogues under the work
 programme and views on opportunities, best practices, actionable solutions, challenges and barriers
 relevant to the topics of the dialogues.
- Deadline: No later than 4 weeks before each dialogue
