Mandated events taking place during Climate Week 1

Panama City, Panama
19 to 23 May 2025

The secretariat is pleased to inform Parties and observer States to the Convention, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement, that the following mandated events outlined below will take place during the first Climate Week 2025: Dialogues for Ambition and Implementation, to be held in Panama City, Panama from 19 to 23 May 2025:

1. Fifth Global Dialogue and Investment-focused Event under the Sharm el-Sheikh Mitigation Ambition and Implementation Work Programme – 19 to 20 May 2025.
2. Biregional Gathering of the Local Communities and Indigenous Peoples Platform for North America, Central and South America, and the Caribbean– 19 to 23 May 2025.
3. Global DNA Forum on Article 6 implementation – 20 to 22 May 2025.
4. Third Dialogue under the United Arab Emirates just transition work programme – 22 to 23 May 2025.
5. Consultation to present the revised NAP technical guidelines to the Parties – 23 May 2025.

All events will be organized in accordance with their respective mandates under the Conference of Parties serving as the meeting of Parties to the Paris Agreement and Subsidiary Bodies. Nomination and registration procedures for each mandated event will be shared in due course.

In addition to above mentioned mandated events, the secretariat, working together with other UN agencies and partners, will organize capacity building events on NDCs (NDC Clinics) on 22 and 23 May 2025. 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The approach of clustering mandated events in a single week and location is expected to yield significant improvements in cost-effectiveness, while reducing operational complexity and travel needs by reducing the need for multiple, dispersed meetings, and thus streamlining participation. Additionally, this approach offers opportunities for a rich exchange among participants, contributing to advancing the intergovernmental process, and promoting cross-fertilization among various mandated work streams.
