IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR OBSERVERS

- This registration is **only valid** for the first meeting of the Local Communities and Indigenous Peoples Platform Facilitative Working Group.
- Please be advised that the **nominee is responsible** for making his/her own travel, visa and accommodation arrangements.
- All foreign delegates entering the Federal Republic of Germany must have a valid passport. Participants requiring a visa are strongly encouraged to contact the appropriate consular authorities as soon as this notification is received. The issuance of a visa for Schengen States may take up to two weeks from the date of submission of the visa application. To facilitate the issuance of a visa, this notification should be attached to the visa application.
- Participants are advised that obtaining a Schengen visa is contingent on the participant securing comprehensive insurance that covers the entire stay. If you are travelling more than once, it is recommended to directly get insurance that covers the time period of all intended stays.
- Consequently, participants are therefore **strongly advised** to obtain international travel and medical insurance to cover themselves from the time they depart for the meeting until the time they return.
