NOTIFICATION

The 8th Meeting of the Paris Committee on Capacity-building 10 - 12 June 2024

Bonn, Germany

I am pleased to notify Parties and observer States to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement, United Nations and related organizations and specialized agencies (UN organizations) and organizations admitted as observers by the Conference of the Parties, that the **8th meeting of the Paris Committee on Capacity-building (PCCB)** will take place in person from 10 to 12 June 2024, in Bonn, Germany on the margins of [the sixtieth sessions of the Subsidiary Bodies](#) (SB 60).

The 8th meeting of the PCCB will be open to observers. National focal points and designated contact points of UN and observer organizations are invited to nominate their representatives for the meeting. In accordance with decision 23/CP.18 and with a view to informing more effective climate change policy that addresses the needs of women and men equally, the UNFCCC secretariat encourages the nomination of women participants.

Nominated representatives should register for the meeting using the dedicated online registration form available at <https://forms.office.com/e/YuqMTaNCQU>. The deadline for registration as an observer is **Friday, 31 May 2024**. Please note that the secretariat may not be in a position to process registrations received after this deadline. Please also note that, for logistical reasons, in-person participation may need to be limited.

As the 8th meeting of the PCCB will be taking place on the margins of SB 60, in-person observers are advised that they will need separate registration for both the meeting and the sessions.
