NOTIFICATION TO PARTIES AND OBSERVER STATES

The 7th meeting of the Katowice Committee of Experts on the Impacts of the Implementation of Response Measures

Pursuant to decisions 7/CP.24, 3/CMP.14 and 7/CMA.1, I am pleased to inform Parties and observer States to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement that the 7th meeting of the Katowice Committee of Experts on the Impacts of the Implementation of Response Measures (KCI) is planned to take place in Sharm El-Sheikh, in Egypt from 2 to 3 November 2022.
